WHEREAS, the Texas Forest Service has determined that drought conditions exist in Sherman County: and WHEREAS, on the 8th day of 2006, May, the Court Commissioners' of Sherman County has determined that the normal danger of fire in the unincorporated areas of Sherman County is greatly enhanced by the extremely dry conditions now existing:

NOW, THEREFORE, Court of Commissioners' Sherman County adopts this Order prohibiting the sale or use of restricted fireworks in the unincorporated areas of Sherman County.

A. No person may sell, detonate, ignite, or in any way use fireworks classified under 49 C.F.R. part. 173.100(r) (2) (10-1-86 editions), "skyrockets with sticks: and: missiles with fins" in any portion of the unincorporated area of Sherman County.

B. This Order does not prohibit:

1. Common fireworks, small in size classified as Class C


