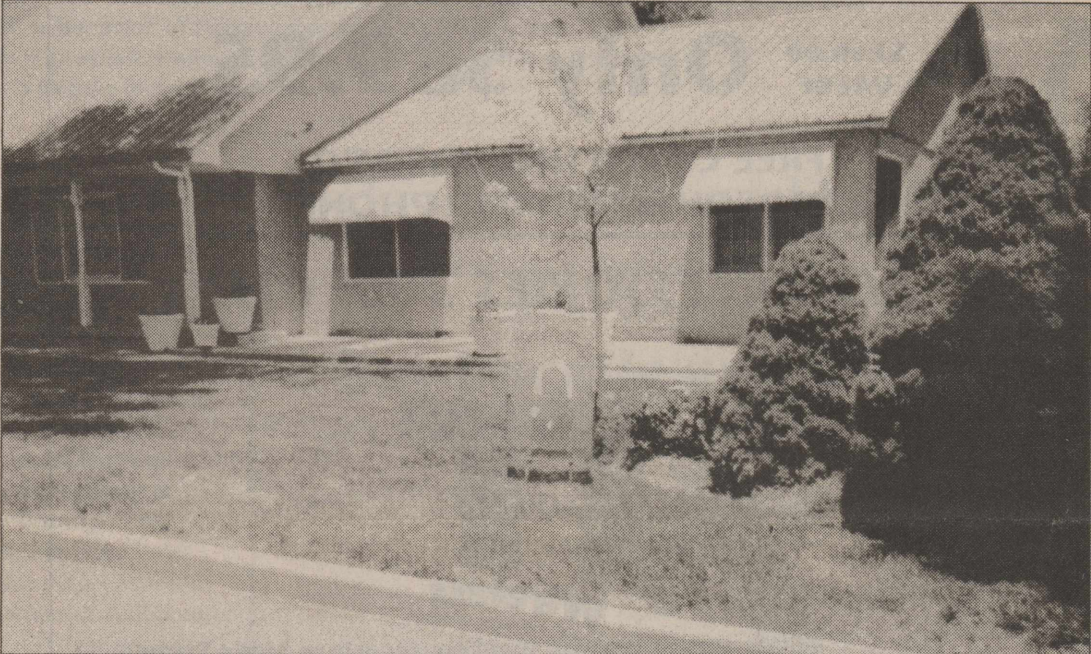

Stratford Independent School District Board of Trustees Regular Session

June 8, 2006

The Stratford ISD Board of Trustees met in regular session on Thursday June 8, 2006 in the High School library.

President Joe Reinart established a quorum was present and called the meeting to order at 7:02 PM.

Board members present: Joe Reinart, Barney Will born DeWain Trayler, Brent Spurlock, Patti Vincent, Steve Hays Tim Gilliland, Superintendent.

Board members absent: Gared McBryde

Guests present were Dinah Horsford, Lynette Kautz, and Greg Wright Mr. Gilliland led the invocation.

Mr. Gilliland introduced the guests and went over the monthly recognition. It was as follows:

1. Case Crabtree, Kristen Crabtree and Whitney Garza participated in the State Track Meet in Austin in May. Case won the gold medal in the 800M, Kristen was 5th in the 800M and Whitney was 4th in the High Jump. Congratulations to these athletes.

2. Rustin Russell, Nathan White, Kaleb Horsford and Chandra Hawkins will compete at the State 4-H 3P Small Bore Rifle contest in Rosenberg. They placed first at the district meet in May advancing them to the state meet. Good luck to these students.

3. Congratulations to the graduating senior class. The class received approximately \$260,000 of scholarships to further their education. Congratulations and good luck.

Lynette Kautz administered the oath of office to new board members Patti Vincent, Greg Wright and Brent Spurlock.

The board held officer elections for the 06-07 school year. Steve Hays made the motion and DeWain Trayler seconded to elect Joe Reinart as president. Motion carried 6-0-1, Joe Reinart abstained. DeWain Trayler made the motion and Patti Vincent seconded to elect Steve Hays as Vice President. Motion carried 6-0-1, Steve Hays abstained. Barney Will born made the motion and Greg Wright seconded to elect DeWain Trayler as secretary. Motion carried 6-0-1, DeWain Trayler abstained.

Mr. Gilliland gave the superintendent's report. The cost per mile for transportation for the month was 340. He then gave the budget summary. Monthly expenditures are at 55.65% and revenue collected at 98.8%. Tax collections are at 98.5%. There are currently 250 students enrolled at the Mary Alien, 165 at the middle school and 189 at the

The Texas Department of Transportation held the first annual Texas Transportation Forum in Austin, June 8 A 9.

The theme of the forum was "Celebrating the Interstate's First 50 Years and Meeting the Challenges of the Future".

Attending the forum from Stratford: Lori Vincent/ High Ground; Wes Spurlock/Corn Producers; Gaynelle Riffe/Ports to Plains Corridor.

The forum was sponsored by The Associated General Contractors of Texas, Texas Transportation Institute and Texas Good Roads.

Keynote Speakers for the Forum were; Norman Y. Mineta, Secretary, US Department of Transportation; Texas Governor Rick Perry; Joseph M Giglio, Hudson Institute, teaches strategic management at the Graduate School of Business at Northeastern University, Boston; Roger Williams, Texas Secretary of State.

The Forum addressed the topics of: transportation financing, public, private and tolling; economic development; Texas Corridors; Regional Mobility Authorities; Aviation, Rail and Public Transportation.

City to Start Tagging Abandoned and Junked Vehicles

The City of Stratford will begin tagging abandoned and junked vehicles for impoundment as defined by the Texas State Statute. The definition of a "junked vehicle" is one that has unexpired license plate, an invalid inspection certificate, wrecked, dismantled or partially dismantled, or inoperable. The entire statute can be obtained at City Hall for your convenience.

After the vehicle has been tagged, the owner will have 72 hours (if on the public right of way) or 10 days (if on private property) to remove the vehicle. The owner of the vehicle can request a public hearing be held to the City Council. Let's all help to clean up Stratford and make it a cleaner and safer place to live. 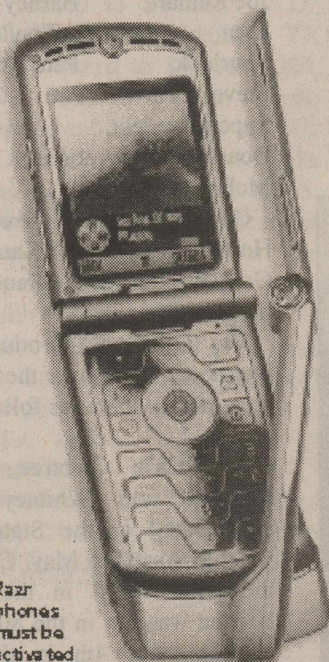

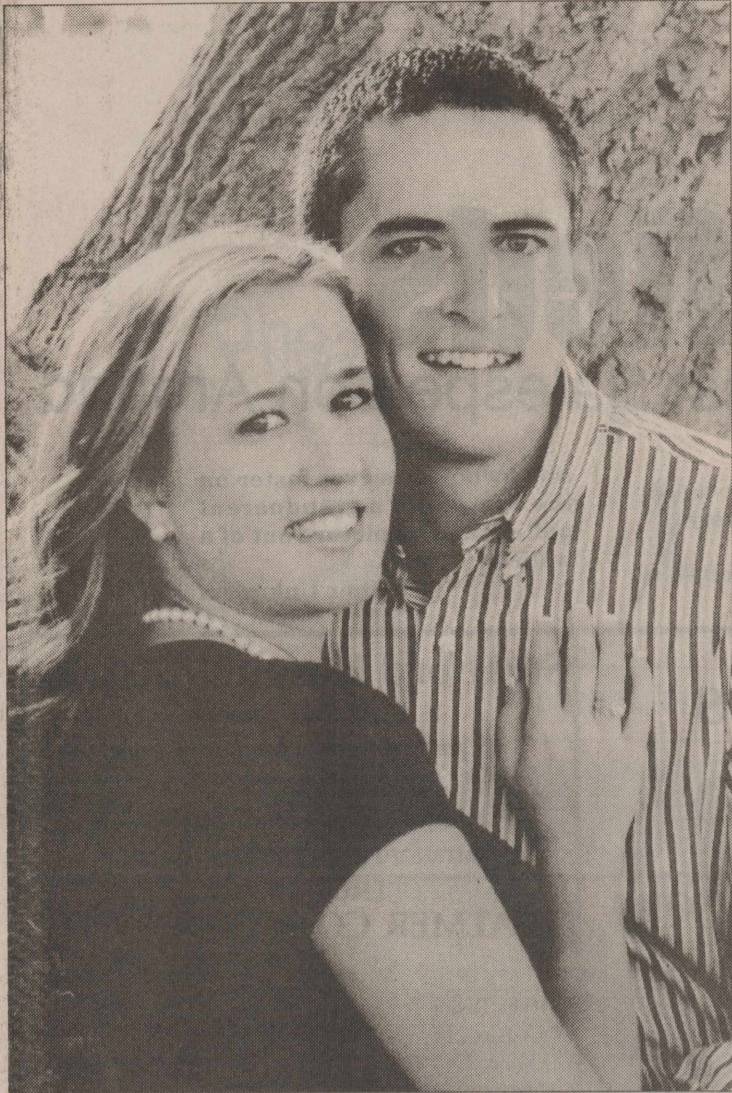

FATHERS AND FAMILIES

What is Father's Day? It is a day in which you can honor your dad or the dad in your household in special ways. Most dads receive a tie or another gift as a way of saying, "Thanks for just being you." But why should Father's Day be only one day a year? Shouldn't families always be about the business of honoring the moms and dads in their midst? At least God would have it so. He gives familiar instruction in the Bible in the form of what we traditionally call the Fifth Commandment. "Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be prolonged in the land which the Lord your God gives you" (Exodus 20:12). The New Testament of the Bible picks up this same theme. "Honor your father and mother (which is the first commandment with a promise)" (Ephesians 6:2). What is the promise? The old Westminster Shorter Catechism says this "is a promise of long life and prosperity (as far as it shall serve for God's glory and their own good) to all such as keep this commandment." On the negative side, the breakdown of families and large teenage suicide rates argue in favor of keeping the Fifth Commandment. On the positive side, Father's Day is an annual reminder of the Fifth Commandment and the promise God attaches to it.

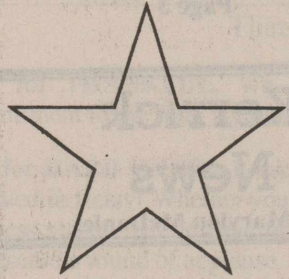
