

CARE Line

The CARE Line is prepared by Col. John R. Hullender, 64th Flying Training Wing commander, on a weekly basis. All information provided to the CARE Line will be held in strict confidence. Callers are urged to give their name and duty telephone number so that a personal reply may be made; however, neither are mandatory. Callers should use the CARE Line only after all possible means to air their views or complaints through the chain of command have been exhausted. The CARE Line number is 885- (Ext.) 3273.

A resident of Dorm 1140 called recently to say we need more pay phones for use by barracks personnel. There is only one phone in Dorm 1140, and a total of 27 pay phones on base.

All these telephones are owned by GTE. Like most businesses, GTE operates for a profit. When the phones are not profitable, GTE will not install more. Experience has shown that most malfunctioning telephone equipment, in most cases, is caused by people placing everything from slugs to bottlecaps in the pay phones' coin slots. That is why only one telephone is placed in each dorm.

GTE repairmen check the pay phones twice a week. If you find a pay phone that is inoperative, speed up the repair process by calling the Reese telephone operator and reporting the malfunction.

Another dorm resident complained because there was no hot water on the second and third floors of Dorm 320.

A call was made to the civil engineering service call desk at about the same time I was called. CE had the problem corrected that same day and Central Dormitory Management personnel checked with the caller to make sure that he was satisfied.

Any dormitory resident with a dormitory problem should contact the Central Dormitory Management office at Ext. 3236 for help in solving their problem.

A golf course patron called the golf club house 45 minutes after closing. A course employee answered the phone, explained that the facility was closed, and asked the caller to call again the following day.

All MWR employees are instructed not to argue with upset customers but to refer them to their superior. This was not possible at the late hour and the caller was upset enough to call me.





The course operates from 8 a.m. to sunset, seven days a week. Jack Hood, MWR chief, will be happy to discuss the golf course on any other MWR service's operating hours with interested callers. Hood may be reached at Ext. 3412.

A caller asked why everything on base has to be Reese brown except the patio fences behind the NCO and officers' clubs?

We are painting everything the Reese colors to give the base a clean, distinct, and uniform appearance. The brown colors are naturally practical for this area. The patio fences are not painted because their natural wood blends so well with the Reese colors.

I am proud of this base and the hard work Reese people have contributed to keep it the "Show Place" of ATC. The Reese colors program will help us enhance the base appearance and retain those honors.

A parent called asking why he had to pay at the nursery preschool during the spring break. He also expressed concern about problems with his child getting the proper medication during her stay at the nursery.

First, the child care program operates on a fixed income. All parents were notified during registration and at parent-teacher meetings that full tuition was required for each month regardless of holidays or child absences; except for the Christmas break.

With regard to administering medication, the dependent child did receive her medication but the fact was not documented. The lady on duty was not yet trained in administering medication as we require them to do before they dispense medication. A care specialist from another area gave the child her prescription. Each care person thought the other had documented the fact. We apologize for this lack of coordination between employees.

Two callers questioned the treatment they received from personnel in accounting and finance.

A military member called the Accounting and Finance Office and requested information about his pay. He was informed that because of the Privacy Act, he could not be furnished the data over the telephone. A caller then requested a hypothetical example. The pay clerk responding to this call over-reacted and presented an unprofessional attitude.

The pay clerk has been counseled on his responsibilities to assure that quality pay service is provided or that appropriate actions are taken when he cannot resolve a problem. All personnel should be aware that specific pay information cannot be discussed over the telephone and that arrangements may be made to obtain the information they need at a time convenient to them.

Another caller reported dissatisfaction with the service he received from the Military Pay Section of Accounting and Finance. He did not understand the breakdown of withholding from his pay and felt the NCO assisting him with discourteous.

Again, the individual has been counseled on the necessity of always displaying courtesy and consideration in this customer service type organization, even on busy paydays.

Many complimentary letters and comments are received about the high quality of service our people receive on a daily basis. It is unfortunate, but these occasional lapses in professionalism do occur. Every effort is being made to correct deficiencies and any person experiencing difficulty should contact the accounting and finance officer immediately.

Finally, I want to close on an upbeat note.

We have just completed the most successful, by far, Air Force Assistance Fund drive in Reese's history; \$34,217 has been raised for the charities supported by this fund. This figure exceeds our goal by over 183 percent. I want to express my personal appreciation to each of our people who contributed and worked toward helping those who need our assistance. The whole wing has truly exemplified the slogan of this year's campaign, "Sharing is what really counts." Thank you again.





Enjoy R.V.s the safe way

Being familiar with your R.V. and surroundings will help immensely in the quest for a safe outing, but common sense and courtesy can further your success, too.

When you arrive at a campground the first thing to do is to choose a good level area or at least an area that would allow you to level your R.V. with a board or two. This will allow your refrigerator to function properly if your R.V. is self contained, or electricity is available.

"Chock" your wheels; R.V.'s have been known to roll down hills into traffic, ditches, lakes or gullies. This would certainly ruin what would have been a good outing.

Of course you've already read your owner's manual concerning pilot lights and gas shutoff valve locations. Make sure the LP-gas

regulators are properly maintained and protected. LP-gas needs vents to outside air for combustion and to get rid of exhaust gases. Do not block these vents.

Because of the electrical and LP-gas systems, and the cluttered, and enclosed nature of most R.V. interiors, fire is a constant threat to the R.V. occupants. By following good housekeeping practices, watching smoking habits, and keeping fire sources away from upholstery and drapes you can prevent a fire. A good RVer will have a fire extinguisher in the unit, too. Smoke detectors are a must. It's called survival.

Keep your camper locked and curtains drawn when away. Always respect the property and privacy of others, and you'll be welcome back to your favorite camping site. The great outdoors is waiting for you to en-

The purpose behind the camporee and its skill events is to promote teamwork.


