Captain Brodale Reese junior officer of the year

Reese's 3rd Annual Junior Officers' Awards Banquet's highlight was the presentation of the 1983 Support Junior Officer of the Year Award.

Capt. Gayle Brodale received the award. Assigned to the Consolidated Base Personnel Office, Captain Brodale's accomplishments include her duties as chief of CBPO in the four-month absence of the normal chief.

Lt. Col. Dan Gomez, Chief of the Personnel Division, said, "Captain Brodale performed in a superior manner while holding down her own duties as well as the duties of

the Chief of CBPO." Colonel Gomez added, the position Captain Brodale had filled is normally maintained by a major or above.

Because of the primary and additional duties she performed, she was selected by the wing commander to attend the PACE Setter Program. The PACE Setter Program is held at Air Training Command headquarters to recognize outstanding junior officers.

Captain Brodale is also actively involved with both on- and off-base activities.

Other nominees for Junior Officer of the Year included Capt. Rodney Mayton from Maintenance, Capt. Cordell Kylvlo from Operations, 1st Lt.

Joan Larsgaard from the Reese Hospital and 2nd Lt. Glenn Lang from Resource Management.

During the awards ceremony three pilots were recognized as Instructor Pilots of the Year for their respective squadrons: 1st Lt. Jeffrey Lupinski represented the 35th Flying Training Squadron, and Capt. Michael Blemker represented the 64th Student Squadron.

Captain Dave Withey, who was originally selected while still a First Lieutenant to represent the 54th Flying Training Squadron, not only was selected as Reese's top IP, but has most recently been chosen as the top IP in all of Air Training Command.

CBPO opens office

Maj. Gen. Robert D. Springer, Air Force Manpower and Personnel Center commander, Randolph AFB, Texas, officially opened the new Reese Consolidated Base Personnel Office April 13.

Brig. Gen. Richard A. Ingram, Air Staff and Command College commandant, Lt. col. Daniel Gomez, Reese Director of Personnel, and CBPO officer Capt. Gayle Brodale lent their talents to the grand opening ceremony as well.

Family services volunteers fixed and served refreshments for the Reese crowd of nearly 200 after General Springer had cut the red, white and blue ribbon.

Reese's newest personnel facility hit the drawing board in 1978 when the initial designs were drawn up, but the design was not finalized and approved until 1982.

The \$2.2 million dollar facility serves as home base for the same facilities that were maintained in the old CBPO, Building T-1. The complex, however, has expanded to include the Professional Military Education Center formerly in Building 132; the Reese education staff, formerly in Building 91; the Suggestion Office, also formerly of 91; Civilian Personnel Offices, once in Building 75; and the Traffic Management Offices, formerly in Building 26.

The 30,500 square foot building is equipped with the newest energy efficient, variable volume double-ducted heating and air conditioning system.

The building is divided into two levels. To get into an office on business, customers must go through the front entrance, or be sent back there when they reach their destination.

Only after referring the customer to the appropriate office, can they expect to get service. Customers have to follow the system so that the number of visits made to any given facility can be recorded.

The check-in at the front desk; however, applies only to CBPO related functions. The education center, PME center, civilian personnel, TMO and the suggestion area customers may be directed on through.

A commissary customer complained because the commissary always seems to be putting up sale signs on merchandise, such as Kraft mayonnaise and macaroni and cheese, that goes for months without any change in the price. The caller felt this was misleading to commissary patrons.

The commissary strives to bring its customers the best products at the lowest possible prices. Thanks to voluntary price reductions received from the vendor who services Reese, both the mayonnaise, and macaroni and cheese have been on sale since December and January respectively. It is also not unusual for the manufacturer to place items on sale for extended periods of time. Please contact the commissary manager at Ext. 3425 any time you have a question about prices.

A hospital emergency room employee called to complain about a local pizza restaurant delivering to everybody on base except the hospital. This complaint was

discussed in my March 9th column. In the past, the restaurant delivered orders, but no one was available to receive and pay for them. The restaurant manager runs his business to make money and cannot afford to deliver pizzas if they will not be paid for.

If an acceptable arrangement with this establishment cannot be made, hospital personnel will have to make alternate arrangements.

I suggest calling our own MWR "Big Bird" at 885-4564 for delivery service on Monday through Saturday nights.

A military single parent called twice recently about opening the child care center during base recalls and mobility exercises. He was concerned because his daughter had nobody to take care of her between the time he was recalled and the time the child care center opened.

The Air Force recognized this problem years ago and implemented the Dependent Care program. Procedures are set up for

each military-married-to-military with dependents and single member parents to be counseled at least annually on these responsibilities. Additionally, the commander must insure each individual fills out an AF Form 357 which details plans for dependent care during a contingency situation.

Many military folks with dependents expect the child care center to be open when a recall kicks off or an exercise begins. At Reese, the child care center has opened for recalls and exercises and had very little participation. At times, employees of the child care center have volunteered service in their homes for military parents. Again, no participation. Should the center open for every recall? I think not.

Each individual with dependents must insure plans have been made for their care. If the child care center cannot open, alternate plans must be made. Consider yourself in this situation: You are recalled to the base, you drop your child off at a friend, babysitter, or child care center and say, "It's only a recall. I'll pick him/her up in a few hours." When you get to your duty section you find out your unit will be deployed overseas. It's a real world situation and you grab your mobility bags and equipment and get ready to go. Dependent child care is primarily the responsibility of the parent.

The Reese hospital uses a central appointment system for the following clinics: Family Practice Clinic; Surgery Clinic; Internal Medicine Clinic (by referral only); Pediatric Clinic; and Orthopedic Clinic (by referral only).

Normally, your first association with the hospital will be with the Central Appointment System. Knowledge of how this system works will help in obtaining quality medical care from the hospital.

This system is established to fully use our providers' time and afford you minimum waiting time. Appointments can be made between 7:30 a.m. and 4:45 p.m., Monday through Friday by calling 885-3245. All appointments are made by phone. Normally you can be seen for an illness within 24 hours or the next duty day.

You should make very effort to keep your appointment. If for unforeseen circumstances you must cancel your appointment, please

do so as soon as possible to permit us to schedule another patient in your place. We have a 24 hour cancellation recorder available seven days a week. You may cancel your appointment by calling 885-3151.

Our hours of operation are 8 a.m. to 4:45 p.m., Monday through Friday. Since specialty clinics' operating hours are subject to change, please call 885-3285 for current operating hours of the clinic in question.

True not everyone living in a barracks has access to a motor vehicle, but I can tell you from experience walking hasn't hurt anyone I know.

I've lived the barracks life long enough to know the partying and drinking get old quick—that doesn't count their effect on the pocketbook.

Things to do in the Lubbock area and on base are too numerous to completely name, but the most obvious on the lists are:

On the town: Take in a movie (the recreation center has discount passes to some walk-in

theaters here); visit the Texas Tech University Heritage Center (it's free) at 4th Street and Indiana Ave.; the Tech museum is also at 4th and Indiana (again free); dining establishments are more than available in Lubbock; the Reese shuttle takes base people to and from the South Plains Mall each Saturday (even people from Cannon AFB, N.M., drive over to the mall); and, all types of sports are available, from shooting to soccer to bowling;

At Reese: Watch the Roundup's Family news section, each week it can be a guide to coming events on base; the theater has current box office movies playing weekly; the swimming pools will soon open, and the gym is always hosting "just for fun" tournaments like the recent two-person volleyball competition; if ten-

nis is your game, Reese is equipped with several excellently conditioned courts; the hobby shops are available for everything from auto maintenance to photo developing and clay pottery molding; and the Youth Center is there to offer programs to the younger dependents.

But, whether you sentence yourself to life in a barracks room or not, the decision is still on your shoulders. One last detail you should know however, is that each of the base facilities are operated on a usage basis—no use, after awhile, no more hours, or shortened hours.

It's your assignment—what will you make of it?

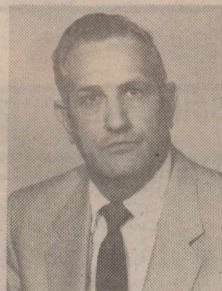
Winners of this year's competition will be ineligible to compete for the same honors next year.

Scythes and wooden Samurai swords.

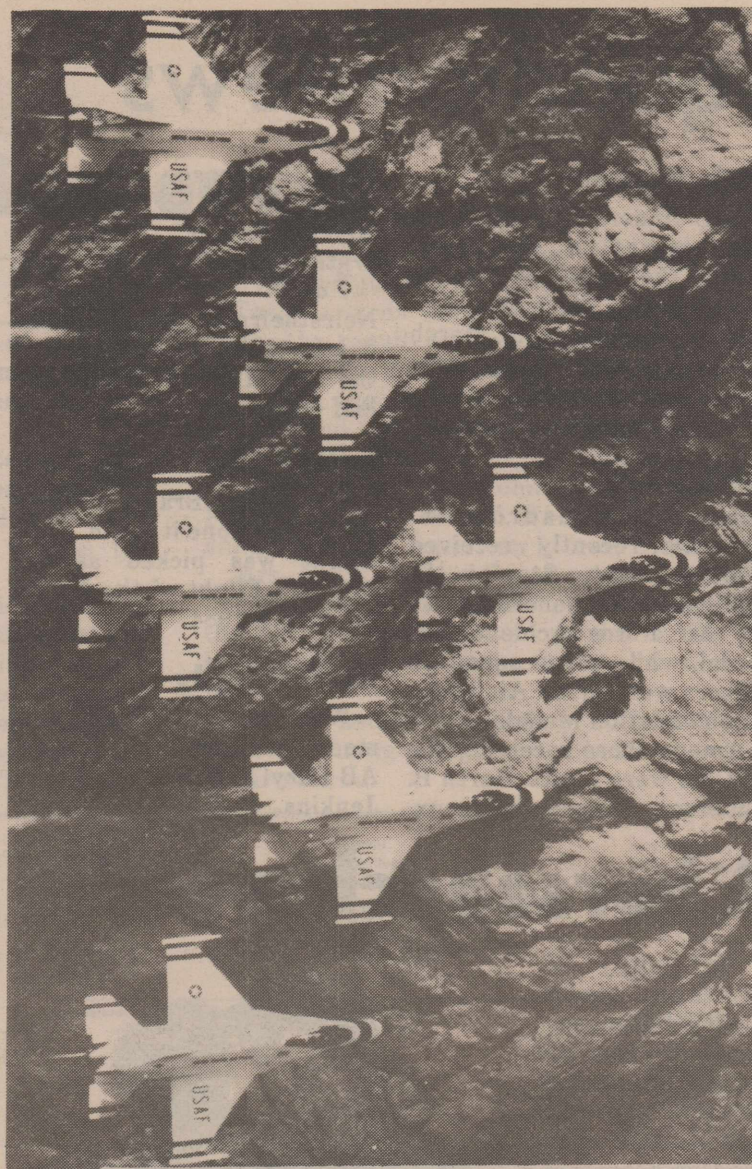
Tony Nassef demonstrated how martial arts students are capable of breaking boards with their feet by doing so himself.

PAWs - there to educate

People for animal welfare are working to educate the public and pet owners to three key problems in the Lubbock-Reese area—spaying, neutering and tagging of pets.

When they are not promoting responsible pet ownership, volunteers work at the Lubbock Animal Control Center trying to get pets back to their owners.

When a pet arrives at the center, if it has identification tags or city rabies tags, it may remain for up to 10 days. Those without tags get a

shortened stay of three days before they are killed.

An all-volunteer effort to locate the pet's owner is conducted through a couple of PAW's means. Volunteers search through lost cards, cards that pet owners have filled out describing their pets, and try to find the owner.

The volunteers will also cross-reference the found cards, those turned in by citizens who've found stray pets, but have taken the pet's care on themselves.

In the best situations, pet owners have tagged their animals using the city tags or engraved metal tags and the owner can be contacted quickly.

At the center, animals are protected from the elements and fed. There is even an area set aside for the sick animals

to keep them apart from the healthy pets. The center is funded by taxpayers, according to Nita Mason, PAWs representative, and is open to anyone to stop by and look over the pets.

Strays have come to be visualized as the ugly, outcast pets, but "we have several beautiful animals at the center now," Ms. Mason added.

A non-profit organizations, the PAWs relies on citizen and group contributions. The money contributed to PAWs goes into care for the animals and shelter improvements.

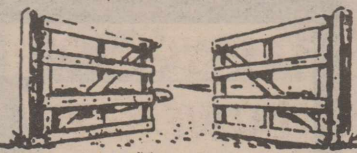

running further away from the hospital and I began to wonder how long a 10K race was, but then I saw the finish line and breathed a sigh of relief," he said. Complete statistics and divisional winners will be announced next week.

Reese stands seventh in ATC

Reese is seventh in Air Training Command in the race for ATC Commander's Trophy points at 450. That is a situation that base sports fans and athletes could change before the year's end.

Reese just finished its part in the ATC bowling tournament at Lowry AFB, Colo., but it'll take more than good finishes on the lanes or soccer field May 22-24 at Sheppard AFB, Texas, for the command soccer tournament to start Reese upward.

Reese athletes planning to compete have to be in shape mentally and physically, because all ATC tournaments in 1984 are scheduled at other bases. The only exception is the command flag football championships set for early November. Fans can help by

supporting base athletes before they participate in events, and attending events when possible.

The commander's trophy is presented annually to the ATC base which gathers the most points in interbase sports and recreation competition in a calendar year.

The ATC sports points are given to the bases which finish sporting or recreational events in first, second or third place. Additional points are also awarded to each base that fields a participant or team in any event.

ATC officials point out that the results from the ATC Talent Contest have not been figured into these final scores thus far. The art contest at Lackland AFB, Texas, May 16 is the next event to be scored

for commander's points.

A third of the year complete, Lowry leads the ATC race with 650 points and first. Williams AFB, Ariz., is second in the tally with 630 points while Randolph AFB, Texas, follows in third with 595 points.

The remainder of ATC shapes up with:

- Lackland and Laughlin AFB, Texas, tied at 565 points for fourth place;
- In sixth, Mather AFB, Calif., has 465 points;
- In seventh, Reese with 450

points;

- In eighth, Vance AFB, Okla., with 440 points;
- In ninth, Columbus AFB, Miss., with 435 points;
- In 10th, Keesler AFB, Miss., with 425 points;

- In 11th, Sheppard with 405 points;
- In 12th, Goodfellow AFB, Texas, with 365 points; and,
- Chanute AFB, Ill., tags along with only 180 points for 1984.

The two teams met twice this season, each confronta-

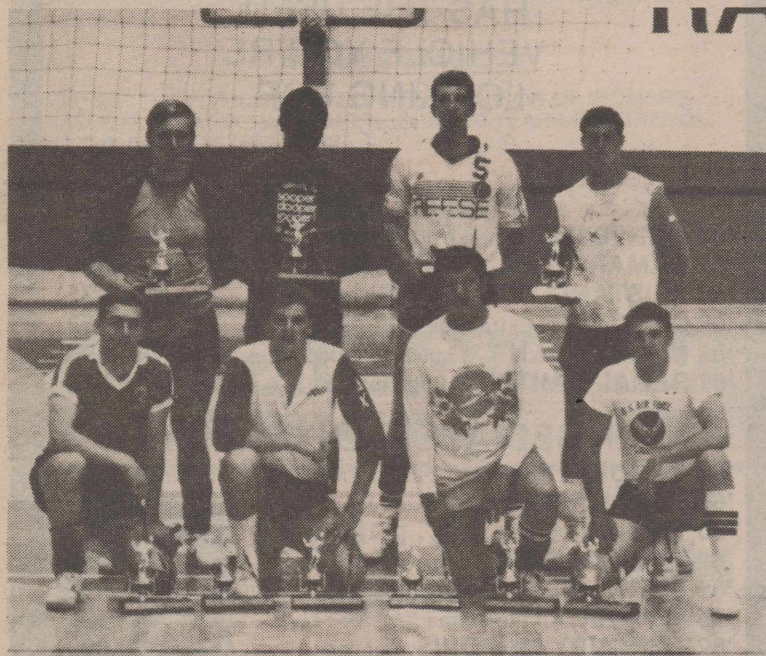
tion a flight to the finish. The finals proved just as exciting and challenging as the previous matches. The A team pulled out the first game in over-time, 17-15.
