Civilian appraisals change July 1

1bout 230,000 Air Force civilian employees will be rated under a new appraisal system beginning July 1, according to J. Craig Cumby, director of Air Force civilian personnel.

The civilian performance and promotion appraisal form will replace three appraisal forms that are currently used to evaluate all civilian employees except senior executives and non-U.S. citizens overseas, officials said.

The CPPA is part of a larger performance management program started by the directorate of cilian personnel to tie many personnel matters together. Appraisals, merit pay, awards, retention decisions and other personnel matters will be taken from the five separate regulations they are now in and put into Air Force Regulation 40-452.

"The appraisal system is the bedrock of the regulation," said Neil F. Galloway, chief of the Air Force employee relations division. "Appraisals drive the other elements, like awards, step increases and promotions."

The CPPA will be used to evaluate employees in the general schedule, general manager, federal wage schedule and scientific-technical categories.

The change in the appraisal system will mean a change in rating cycles, rating procedures and training programs.

Air Force Form 860 will be used for the annual evaluations instead of GMAS, the general manager appraisal system; CPAS, the civilian potential appraisal system; and JPAS, the job performance appraisal system. The form will include nine "easily understandable and ratable behavior factors and will continue requiring written performance elements and standards," said Galloway.

Along with the change, supervisors will no longer grade job performance and work behavior at different times during the year. All appraisals will be conducted at the same time, said Galloway. Another key change, he added, is that GS and FWS employees no longer will be rated on the anniversary of within-grade salary increases.

The new rating cycle for GS, ST and GM employees will be July 1 to June 30. The cycle for FWS civilians will be Feb. 1 to Jan. 31.

The transition from the present system to the new one "is fairly complicated and will be explained in detail when supervisors are trained," said Galloway. This affects about 12,000 civilian and military supervisors.

The Employee Relations Division will begin a major training program in June. Reprsentatives of major commands and separate operating agencies will meet this month at Lowry AFB, Colo., for the initial phase. They will then train others and "eventually it will filter down to everyone," Galloway said. Civilian personnel officials expect to complete training in July. (AFNS)

A concerned Reese Village resident called about loose pets and the mess they can make wherever they "do their business." I checked with the security police and they're catching an average six to 10 uncontrolled animals a week. As aggressively as the SPs pursue loose animals, 20 percent of the strays get away before the SPs can respond.

Concerned residents can help the SPs by calling them as soon as such an action happens and when possible providing the pet owners' name.

The caller also said Village drivers seem to have trouble stopping at the four-way stop at Harmon and George Streets. This is the first I've heard of the problem, but I'll remind Village drivers that security police patrols monitor housing drivers, like those on-base.

If they catch someone violating the traffic laws in the Village, the violator will be cited. By the way, the security police have been instructed to watch the intersection a little closer too.

Parental control was the subject of one upset caller. He was dismayed by the obvious lack of parent concern for the behavior of their chidren. I don't blame him. I wouldn't appreciate a strange child climbing on my home's front lattice either.

The security police say they're not aware of increased vandalism, but records do indicate that with school out the number of vandalism cases does tend to increase.

The SPs are already coordinating increased foot and car patrols for the housing area.

Village residents can help themselves by calling the security police, Ext. 3332, immediately when they spot a vandal in act. The same holds true for residents that spot people taking things from patios. Only when the guilty culprit is identified, can the appropriate action be taken.

ALL-PRO's tardiness in repairing a leaky faucet upset a Reese Village mother. The seepage had caused a stagnant water smell and created a breeding ground for mosquitoes. The woman's husband had called in the problem in March, and she, herself, only weeks ago, but still no one had come to help.

When I had housing check into the claim, ALL-PRO records showed only the second call on their records. ALL-PRO officials reported that the work order was one of many waiting to be completed when the company changed plumbing personnel. It was that change and the more than 100 air conditioning unit calls that caused a backlog in the service calls.

To compensate, ALL-PRO is hiring an additional air conditioning repairman and continuing to get the servcie calls caught up as fast as possible.

To help everyone know what's expected of them during the MCI, the following checklist has been extracted from the April 27 issue of the "Talespinner" from Lackland AFB, Texas.

The checklist can help ensure each person is aware of their responsibilities and is prepared at all times. Clip it out and keep it posted as a ready reference.

 - Monitor OPSEC and COMSEC

Major accident response exercise

- ·Assist if you're at the scene: use common sense •Report the situation to security police, Ext
- •Clear the area

- ·Be ready
- •Report to duty •Execute plans

Resources protection (bomb threats)

- •Do not hang up the phone

- •Isolate area (evacuate, if it can be done safely) •Maintain isolation until security police take
- •Keep out of area and keep others out

Resources protection (anti-robbery) (cashier or funds handler's actions)

- · Avoid actions that would endanger life
- Activate a duress alarm
- •Call security police, Ext. 3400
- •Observe physical characteristics of the robber
- •Preserve the evidence
- •Observe the direction of escape
- ·Observe the method of escape

Resources protection (unauthorized entry)

- •Challenge any unfamiliar person
- Ask for identification
- •Detain unauthorized personnel
- •Notify security police, Ext. 3400

Communication Keeps the mission flying

Nestled some seven stories high, air traffic controllers with the 1958th Communications Squadron intricately govern the operations of 64th Flying Training Wing jet trainers.

Last year 1958th controllers directed the maneuvers of 60,000 Reese sorties. The total for 1984 is expected to climb still higher, according to Chief Tower Controller SMSgt. Cliff Burns.

The 1958th supports the wing mission in two obvious ways: air traffic control, and communications around Reese.

Their job as air traffic controllers requires keen dedication to duty and a watchful eye. Reese air traffic controllers must oversee numerous aircraft traffic movements on the ground and in the air at the same time.

Should they spot an aircraft in trouble, they would radio the pilot ordering the mission aborted to avoid any danger to the aircrew and the aircraft. Or if the jet is already in the air, controllers forewarn pilots of landing gear problems or engine fires.

Air traffic controllers admit their job depends heavily on team support from the instructor pilots in the runway supervisory units to the radar maintenance technicians that keep their equipment running at peak efficiency.

Communications experts do more than keep airplanes on the runway; however, they must also insure clear communications.


Operations takes care of the commercial communications servcies with General Telephone. They make sure Reese gets quick, efficient installation of leased communications equipment, and when necessary, repairs.

The section manages the auxilliary MARS station, the telephone work orders, the cryptographic account, and the administrative services, too.

Maintenance is responsible for overseeing the communications electronics support and the five 1958th work centers within its realm: Navigational Aids Maintenance, Radio Maintenance, Radar Maintenance,

Weather Maintenance, and teletype and digital subscriber terminal equipment maintenance.

Plans and programs is in charge of the Communications Authorization Program and Manpower Management. Plans and programs staffers look to the future seeking new, improved communications systems to support the 64th Flying Training Wing.

The staff also manages the money for local communications needs.

"It's not a single section that keeps Reese communicating, but rather a network of dedicated men and women known to themselves and Reese as the 1958th Communication Squadron team," said Capt. Jon Gardner, communications commander.
