The sign tells those coming on-base who the guard is and his or her hometown. I agree, it is a good idea.

Thanks for both the calls.

Commissary policy came under fire recently as a patron phoned in to find out why children are allowed to run rampantly through the store upsetting customers.

It is commissary policy that children in the store and under five years of age must ride in the shopping cart. Other children must remain under parental supervision. There is a sign in the customer service area that makes a clear statement of this policy.

The floor managers, in the red blazers, have been told to keep a closer watch for future problems, but should they not see a problem situation, then the

patrons must tell them about it immediately so corrections can be made.

Another call about the commissary dealt with rudeness among patrons. Exactly what is the policy for uniformed personnel moving to the head of checkout lines, asked the caller?

Commissary policy reads that uniformed personnel in line betwen 11:30 a.m. and 1 p.m. have priority in the express line, but that is it.

The policy applies only to the express line and only during the stated hours. If anyone experiences another such problem, contact one of the floor managers immediately.

Another caller wondered why she had to wait and call legal the next day to set up an appointment for legal assistance, rather than making the appointment right then.

The judge advocate's staff is limited to three attorneys and therefore, their legal duties in court and such must take priority. Recognizing the potential problem of the small staff, the Legal Office schedules appointments on Thursdays for the coming week.

However, the scheduling routine does not apply to student pilots and emergency cases; they are seen immediately. Their system works, maybe not as fast as we would all like, but it works.

Thanks for the call, I believe it may clear up many questions about the Legal Office scheduling system.

Reserved parking around Base Operations got the heat from another caller. The parking spaces he called in about were re-evaluated toward the end of May and those that were unjustifiably reserved were changed.

Barbara Hanson did the evaluations, but suggests that if anyone notices cars parked illegally, call the security police and report them. Or, if a person is not sure about the validity of a reserved parking space, contact Ms. Hanson and discuss the matter. Ms. Hanson is at Ext. 3586.

Earlier this month I got a call about the Thrift Shop, and the caller wanted to know why, when the shop is open, uniformed personnel have to wait in long lines during duty hours and if special lines, or something of that nature, could be set up.

The Thrift Shop is operated solely by volunteers, under the supervision of the officers' wives' club, and is there just to provide a service for all base personnel military and civilian.

The shop is open Tuesdays and Fridays from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. To avoid the possibility of waiting in a long line to make a consignment contract, individuals with limited time are invited to call ahead to determine how busy the consignment room is. The extension number is

Currently the staffing is low, because of vacations, personnel moving, and family requirements, so service may not be what it is normally.

Anyone interested in volunteering their time and effort to the Thrift Shop should stop by during operating hours at Building 136 and sign up.

Inspector views coming inspections

More and more often I am being asked how a unit or squadron can get ready for the upcoming Mission Capability Inspection and the Management Effectiveness Inspection. It isn't that the supervisors or functional managers are unprepared, but rather they desire to excel. Many of the supervisors seek higher ratings. They are not satisfied with less than a first-rate performance when the Air Training Command Inspector General team inspects their area of responsibility. I cannot give a hard definitive answer that will guarantee an "excellent" or an "outstanding" rating from the IG. From experience I can tell you the unit commanders who succeed always say it is the super people in the unit that made it happen.

People make the difference. Nothing happens unless people make it happen. Job knowledge, good leadership, strong military bearing, and physical and personal appearance play major roles. To achieve high marks in those areas a squadron must have high morale and a good attitude. That brings us back to people. Communicating the mission and dealing with people is the foundation upon which we can build a successful inspection.

There are some basic instructions we can all follow to help prepare for the IG evaluations, and work on those important people

First, always give your people the credit that is rightfully theirs. A special pride is created when you tell people they've done a

good job. At the same time the attitude to succeed is being bolstered by your words of praise.

Second, always do your homework. Know the weak areas from past inspections of your unit and other inspections by the IG during this inspection cycle. Concentrate on critical areas first, then polish the programs you want to show off to the inspectors. Don't

make them ask what extra programs you have or how you plan to do the job a little better than anyone else—tell them. Don't point out your weak areas, and don't offer unrequested information. When the inspectors do ask, show them everything they want to see. Use your self-inspections checklist. Be aggressive and remember repeat write-ups are killers.

Third, be honest. Never tamper with the truth. Don't hedge or try to lie your way out of a bad situation. Talk about specific actions, performance, and results on duty. Say what you mean and mean what you say. People don't like double talk. A good leader gives his people straight facts and that will carry over to the evaluation.

Fourth, be courteous. Genuine consideration for other people makes a smooth functioning organization possible. People get disenchanted with their jobs unless someone cares about what bothers them and cares to improve the situations that cause problems. The inspectors will pick up on the attitude in the unit and the wing. I am impressed with the wav Reese leaders listen and care. I suspect this is our key to continued success.

Fifth, be the leader. Effective managers get the best results because they know how to get people to work with them. The leader sets the example the troops follow. The leader helps them do their best, achieve their best, and shows them how to be more productive. The IG will see the effectiveness of the unit, but more importantly the unit and the wing will be stronger because our people are doing their best work.



Top airmen doing a demanding task

Personal financial counsel made available to everyone

Personal finances can help maintain a career, or destroy it. It's the individual that makes the difference.

The Reese Personal Financial Management Program is there to help individuals in financial hot water, and those heading for bad times. It's for those wanting to make their pay checks go a little farther, too.

The voluntary money management program is designed to help people get on their financial feet and stay there. It is in no way a get rich quick program.

The program gets those involved information, education and counseling in money management, says Counselor Sgt. Wanda Jackson. "It can also help people find solutions to money problems they may have now."

Program attendees get general money managing information through pamphlets on subjects ranging from checkbook maintenance to budgeting and credit buying. In all, ways to make an individual's money go further.

All airman basics through sergeants get the personal financial management education at their first permanent duty assignment. They find out what the program is and can offer if they need it.

Each new arrival gets the program education during the accounting and finance inprocessing period. By educating the supervisors, finance staffers are ensured that supervisors know of the program, what it's about, and how they can help those working for them

Confidential counseling (one-on-one) is the largest part of the program. The couselors can help a person with a big problem just as easy as an individual with a small one.

Reese's financial counselors help identify financial problems, develop budgets to fit the requestor's needs, and work out a financial plan to help a person to financial freedom. "Best of all, the counselor can help a person get over their financial worries," said Sergeant Jackson.

"It is totally confidential, and it is free. The Personal Financial Management Program can help," she stressed.

Supervisors and managers should encourage those having financial problems to call the program manager at Ext. 3432.

"Taking advantage of this free program now will serve a person better than when his or her career is already scarred."

Has Bruce Springsteen let success go to his head? Did the seriousness of his last record, "Nebraska," weaken his commitment to rock 'n' roll? Does he still possess the fire and drive that made him "a legend in his own time?" These questions are all answered (yes, yes, and no, respectively) by the new Bruce Springsteen album, "Born In The USA."

Springsteen is currently in the middle of an important transition phase of his musical career. His last two records, "Nebraska" and "The River," are not quite as successful as expected. "Nebraska" in particular was an austere solo effort that alienated even his hard core fans. "Born In The USA" reunites Springsteen with his E Street Band. It is a more clearly focused record than "Nebraska," and it is tighter and better integrated than "The River." Nonetheless, there is an indefinable weakness to the album, an absence of true emotion or enthusiasm that draws attention to unoriginal songwriting and uninspired performances.

If "Born In The USA" had been made by some of Springsteen's contemporaries and imitators such as Bob Seger or John Cougar, it would not be subject to as much criticism. But the painful truth is that this album doesn't even compare to recent efforts by those imitators. One song ("Darlington

Part of this malaise may be the E Street Band. Several members, including Steve Van Zandt and Clarence Clemons, have launched solo careers of their own. Although their performances on "Born In The USA" are polished on a technical level, their. hearts seem to lie elsewhere. 

Military, DOD civilians face political limits

Government employees, including military members, who contribute to the Reagan-Bush campaign committee may be violating federal law.

That decision comes from President Reagan's legal counsel and Air Force Judge Advocate officials.

States code makes it a felony for an employee of the United States government to make any contribution to a person who is the employer, or employing authority, of the person making the contribu-

A contribution to the committee would be considered a contribution to the president himself, judge advocate officials say. They note this interpretation applies only to federal employees, and not to their family members.

Contributions made to the presidential election campaign fund, by checking the box on the federal income tax form, are not affected by the provision. Money from that fund is distributed to all qualified presidential candidates, not just the incumbent president, officials said.

Pentagon leaders have 'taken great care to keep the DOD-sponsored voting program non-partisan, according to officials.

Pentagon officials have asked commanders to encourage their people to vote and to provide information on how to register and obtain ballots. But it is the responsibility of the voter to gather information about the candidates and issues, they say.

Federal Employees, both military and civilian, can:

•Register, vote and assist in voter registration drives.

 Express personal opinions on candidates or issues as an individual citizen, but not as an Air Force representative.

·Donate money to a political party or organization or attend a political fund raising function.

•Attend partisan or nonpartisan political gatherings as a spectator in civilian clothing.

•Join a political party or club.

·Campaign for or against referendum questions, municipal ordinances and other non-partisan causes.

•And, sign nominating peti-
