

# Uniform price hikes due Nov. 3

The Army and Air Force Exchange Service will raise the price of six uniform items Nov. 3.

Prices on four women's uniform items are going up, as well as the prices on the men's blue mess dress jackets—enlisted and officer, according to Dallas AAFES officials.

For the women the blue polyester pantsuit will cost \$10 more, up from \$87.50. The women's blue polyester skirt uniform will, with the price increase, cost \$107.

The women's blue mess dress jacket will cost \$4 more and the semi-formal blouse will cost women another \$1 after the uniform prices go up.

The enlisted men's mess dress jacket will cost \$83 and the officers will have to begin paying \$87.50 for the formal uniform item.

Simple economics played a role in the price in-

creases for women, one official said, "We sell 500 women's uniforms and 40,000 men's uniforms."

AAFES-procured uniforms have not been hit with a price increase in more than two years. "We've been receiving uniforms at the new cost since June, but have delayed raising the in-store costs as long as possible," the AAFES representative added.

The new prices resulted from uniform contracts awarded in March 1984.

Defense Personnel Support Center issue items are available in the Military Clothing Sales Store and are sold at cost. The AAFES uniforms are upgraded versions of DPSC issue items.

Locally, a new item for men has arrived—the polyester-wool short sleeve shirt. William Watson, the Reese MCSS manager, said the shirts are in and will cost buyers \$18 each.

As for the women's new blouse, the Reese store manager indicated that possibly in early November he can begin ordering the blouses. Everyone will have to wait until AAFES quality controllers give their blessing to the blouses already produced at that time, Watson stressed.

What happened a month ago with the women's new blouse happened because customers didn't understand that the limited number of the blouses Reese received were a sample. AAFES forwards a quality sample supply to base stores in order to get a feeling for how defense personnel will like the new uniforms, the Reese manager continued.

Watson indicated that his staff would be happy to discuss uniform changes and supplies with customers. AAFES never changes prices on items exposed to customers, unless they are going down, he said.

## Civil engineers rank first in ATC

Reese civil engineers are riding high these days and there is good reason—the "Best Civil Engineering Squadron in Air Training Command" for fiscal 1984 honor belongs to them.

The ATC award recognizes the civil engineering unit that does the best job, said ATC Civil Engineering Readiness and Training Manager MSgt. James Payton.

"It's difficult to put a finger on what made the difference" for Reese, because each section director awarded points based upon what was important to them in their areas, he said.

Reese Deputy Civil Engineer Frank Falbo attributed the civil engineering success to a better base appearance than other ATC units and the 64th CES responsiveness.

Other contributing factors, according to Deputy Civil Engineer Falbo, include the superior ratings CE achieved on inspections this year, in-house programs, and Prime BEEF. During the trip to Eglin AFB, Fla., the Reese base emergency engineering force was noted as the best seen, he said.

The contributing achievements of the 64th Civil Engineering Squadron continue, but "we will not stop there," the Reese deputy civil engineer added. "We're a service organization and we know it. We want to know how we can help," because CE is still a "can do—will do" unit.

In the certificate to accompany the award, ATC Com-

mander Gen. Andrew P. Iosue and Deputy Chief for ATC Engineering and Service Col. Herbert D. Paul noted "high morale, professionalism and commitment to optimum resource use" as helping the Reese squadron to the "most successful mission and facility support program in base history."

Sergeant Payton, a non-voting member of the selection board, said that Reese's civil engineers were in stiff competition with two other ATC units in particular for the award. The numbers were so close that a second vote between the three was required.

The board of section directors judged each ATC civil engineering unit in resources management, resources conservation, quality of life improvements, and community and customer relations.

The 64th Civil Engineering Squadron succeeds the Shepard AFB, Texas, CE unit as tops in the command. The Reese victory automatically puts the 64th CES in the command nominee position for the Air Force "Curtin Award." The winner to be announced in February.

The "Curtin Award," named after Maj. Gen. Robert H. Curtin, recognizes civil engineering excellence throughout the Air Force.

The civil engineering honor was dedicated in honor of General Curtin for his more than 40 years of Air Force service. General Curtin served as the head engineer in the Architecture and Engineering Branch, Air Force Engineering Division from July 1963 to May 1968.

I am proud to congratulate Lt. Col. Joe LaFoy and his civil engineering crew for their outstanding service to the wing. Air Training Command apparently recognizes the high standards and quality support the 64th Civil Engineering Squadron provides, because last week the command announced that Colonel LaFoy and team are the "Best Civil Engineering Squadron in ATC" for fiscal 1984.

Col. Herbert D. Paul made the official presentation. Colonel Paul is the deputy chief of staff for ATC Engineering and Services at Randolph AFB, Texas.

Again, Colonel LaFoy and crew, congratulations on a job well done.

An airman called to express concern about the temperature in his building being under 60 F during a weekend. The caller also addressed a point brought to his attention that the heat would not be turned on until Oct. 31.

It is difficult to address the airman's specific problems without some details—for example, which building was involved. But my policy on the subject does not include strict "no heat - no cool" periods at Reese. I think the reasonable comfort of our people is important, and I work closely with Energy Conservation Manager Sam Lanham and civil engineering leaders to ensure wing energy policies don't create unbearable situations.

There was a sudden snap of bad weather

and the civil engineers were told to turn the heat on in selected areas. However, the heating in most offices remained off because weather forecasts indicated the cold spell would be short. The seasonal temperatures did return almost immediately.

The wing does not have the manpower to switch every building from heating to cooling and back for short bursts of inseasonal weather; therefore, it is easier to combat short cold periods in offices and work centers with an extra sweater or jacket.

The heating in office areas will be turned on to stay when lower seasonal temperatures so dictate. I urge anyone wanting to know more to contact Lanham at Ext. 3310.

A caller wanted to verify that the golf course gate is designed to ease the traffic flow on and off base during peak traffic periods. That is true.

His complaint stemmed from the security police decision that day to close the gate only 20 minutes after opening it. The hours for the gate are 6:45-7:30 a.m. and 4:15-4:45 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Previous surveys completed by the security police have indicated that opening the gate for 20 minutes will usually accommodate the traffic, but since this is not a new question 64th Security Police Squadron Commander Capt. Jerry Sehon is having his troops redo the survey.

It is important to remember that the

security police are responsible for more than monitoring traffic flow, and when an emergency arises they must respond—even if they have to close a gate temporarily.

Anyone having further questions about the policy for opening and closing the golf course gate should call the Law Enforcement Desk at Ext. 3612.

Flooding due to removed or broken water sprinkler heads caught the attention of an officer. He said it is a waste of water, and that building custodians should look around their areas to get these problems remedied.

I agree, and it is the responsibility of those building custodians and managers to report sprinkler breaks and other problems to the 64th Civil Engineering Squadron Plumbing Shop as soon as possible.

The plumbing unit maintains a sprinkler system repair log which is monitored by the CE Service Call Desk. Through this system, CES troops are able to maintain control and provide a quick response.

Thanks for the call and interest. Your concern helps keep Reese looking it's best.

Energy Conservation Manager Sam Lanham phoned me to pass along a complimentary word about the 64th Air Base Group Squadron Section Commander Capt. Richard Savko.

Lanham blew a tire while driving on Loop 289 just as rain began to fall, Oct. 3. Captain Savko saw him and pulled over to offer a helping hand.

The caller indicated he knew Captain Savko, but felt that even if it had been someone else stranded the officer would still have stopped. I agree, he is a fine young officer who typifies the community-minded spirit of many of our Reese people. Well done!

# IG system strengthens AF

The strength of the Air Force is in its people. To build on that strength we provide opportunities for them to grow professionally. To insure each Air Force member gets the best possible chance to pursue his or her career goals, the Air Force has a quick and fair system for answering questions—the Inspector General Complaint System.

The IG Complaint System is there for Air Force personnel to use—if necessary—to get action on a complaint or inquiry. A recent Air Force-wide IG survey revealed several interesting facts about the complaint system.

Among those findings, most Air Force personnel are aware of the IG Complaint System and its purpose, but they do not know much more about the system. Junior officers and first-term airmen seem to be the least familiar with the system.

How can those officers and enlisted members find out more about the system? Of course, squadron commanders and first sergeants can answer questions as to how the Air Force handles such requests, but there are

other informative sources.

The TIG Brief, which covers numerous topics, is published monthly. Information on the wing IG system is available on unit bulletin boards and in the **Roundup**, in the first issue of each month.

The survey also revealed that only a small percentage of members felt their friends would turn against them for going to the IG, but half felt their supervisors probably would oppose them.

All members of the 64th Flying Training Wing, military and

civilian, have the right to present complaints, ask questions and get answers without fear of retaliatory action. Anyone who feels such action has been taken against them should report it immediately to me, the wing inspector or the command inspector general.

As a wing inspector, I attempt

to resolve questions at the lowest practical level. However, a complaint is not required to follow the chain of command with a complaint before taking the problem to a higher level.

Yet experience shows the chain of command works most of the time. It serves as a check and balance to prevent similar problems from occurring again.

If all problems were resolved by the IG, the wing inspector would be well exercised and individual units would not be aware of small irritants or critical problems.

Good supervisors get involved in the lives of their subordinates.

They know their family situations. They also listen to their subordinates when a problem arises—that is the secret to a successful chain of command—good supervisors who get involved.

The wing inspector is available anytime. In fact, Ext. 3409 is monitored around the clock—by

real people, not machines. You can leave a message, or get my home telephone number and call me at home.

The 64th FTW recognizes that a complaint system must exist to give fair and prompt consideration to members' complaints and rectify situations when necessary. The complainants must feel that they can enter the system at any level without fear of reprisal or stigma.

All personnel must know that the complaint system is there to help them. No form of reprisal, however subtle, is to be taken against any individual who uses the IG system.

# White-collar get pay boost

White-collar federal employees under the special salary rates program received a pay boost Oct. 1.

About 25,000 employees under the program received increases of up to 13.7 percent.

Positions in the program include engineers, clinical

researchers, physical science technicians, vocational nurses and dental assistants, said Assistant Director for Pay Programs Reginald M. Jones Jr.

The special salaries are the result of local staffing and retention problems resulting from high pay in the private sector, Jones said.

Some special rate employees, such as engineers, have already reached the statutory pay ceiling. When the general schedule increase goes into effect in January, the rates for these employees will also be increased, the assistant director concluded. —(AFNS)

Waddoups, a General Dynamics man of more than

17 years, will talk about advanced fighter technology integration—the AFTI F-16, a futuristic fighter. The AFTI F-16 will be able to point itself sideways and shoot without changing its flight path, turn without banking, and climb without pitching its nose up.

The Westminster College general engineering graduate has been with the AFTI F-16 since its conception.

The research and development F-16 recently began flying with new avionics and other systems that are to be assessed in Phase II of the project's flight test program, according to a recent General Dynamics Division Log Bulletin.

The modifications were completed with the installation of two "dummy" forward looking infrared radar sensor-tracker pods on the F-16's wing stakes. After a series of

functional verification flights were made before its return to Edwards AFB, Calif., where more than 100 test flights were flown during Phase I, 1982-83.

All AFTI F-16 test flights will begin from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration Dryden Flight Research Facility at Edwards. At least 35 missions are scheduled to be flown over the Nellis AFB, Nev., bombing ranges, the GD Bulletin indicated.

"I believe this will be the best presentation made before the Lubbock chapter for Air Force Association members and nonmembers alike," Chapter 273 President Turner said.

The Oct. 27 quarterly meeting is also being hosted by the Retired Officers' Association. It will be their monthly meeting.

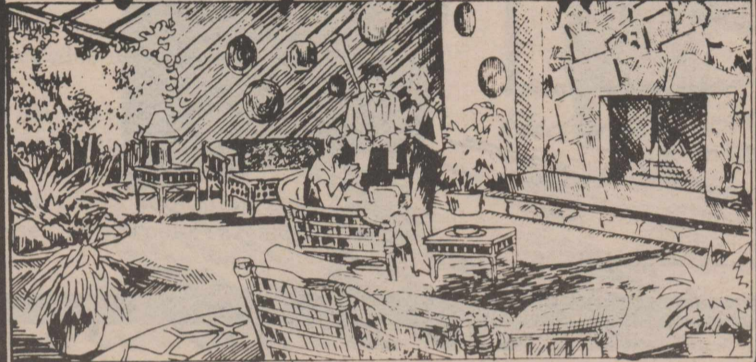

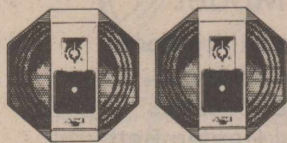

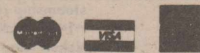

The essay picked as the best in Texas gets the writer \$1,250 and an invitation to the 1985 spring executive board meeting. The site yet to be determined.

Second place gets \$750, third will take \$500 and

fourth and fifth places will get \$250 each.

Seniors from private and public schools are eligible for the monetary awards. To get an entry form, students should contact their high school counselors or write to Captain Phillips.

## Pilots, navigators considered for contact lenses in-flight wear

Pilots may someday be able to get rid of their spectacles while flying, thanks to research going on at the School of Aerospace Medicine at Brooks AFB, Texas.

Currently, pilots and navigators are not allowed to wear contact lenses unless they have a medical waiver. Certain types of soft contact lenses could change that according to research optometrist Dr. (Capt.) William Flynn.

Volunteers aboard C-130 flights wear the lenses on cross-country flights lasting more than four hours, said Dr. Flynn. Every half-hour the person's vision is checked to determine

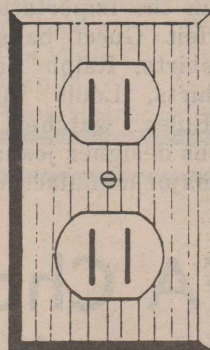
how sharp it is.

The volunteers have undergone testing in a high altitude chamber and centrifuge. They've also undergone rapid decompression tests.

Test results look promising, the doctor said. Navigators will soon be used in a broader 12-month study of the lenses. A ruling on the lenses is expected in mid-1986.

About 20 percent of Air Force pilots and 50 percent of the navigators must now wear glasses, the Brooks researcher said. —(AFNS) Brooks AFB, Texas.

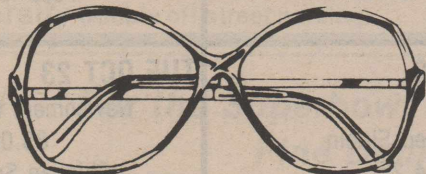

# Customs cracking down on counterfeit imports

In recent months the U.S. Customs Service has encountered a steadily rising problem with the importation of legitimate and counterfeit trademarked articles such as designer clothes, watches and computers.

West coast customs stations in particular have reported a tremendous increase in the importation of counterfeit Gucci bags, La Coste shirts, Ralph Lauren polo shirts, Louis Vuitton bags, Rolex watches, and numerous designer jeans.

The major manufactures of

trademarked items have registered their trademarks with the U.S. Customs Service. Such registration prevents anyone, other than the owner of the trademark, from importing articles bearing the trademark without the owner's express consent.

The Customs Service is required by law to seize and hold imported articles bearing registered trademarks, whether those trademarks are legitimate or counterfeit. La Coste, Britannia, Ralph Lauren, Fila, Calvin Klein, Members Only, Izod, Jordache, Gucci, and Louis Vuitton have registered their trademarks with U.S. Customs

and do not permit importation for personal use.

Customs regulations do, however, permit an administrative exemption for importation of one registered trademarked item per traveler or purchaser. Also, with watches, legitimately trademarked items can be imported in reasonable amounts for personal use, but counterfeit trademarks cannot be imported. Beyond this, the Customs Service is allowing little leeway.

Effective immediately, customs has initiated a campaign to prevent illegal importation of registered trademarked or counterfeit items.

## Plan ahead and cut admin FW&A

The reproduction facility here is operated by contract services. Services that, by contract, allow for only a certain amount of priority work to be done. Unscheduled priority jobs force the cost of reproduction up.

To ensure reproduction services continue undisturbed Base Administration and the Contracts Division have to file the necessary paperwork to get additional funding approved. That is getting money not originally set aside for that purpose to be used, and that's waste.

Workers can eliminate some of the waste by planning ahead and getting materials to be reproduced to the Reproduction Office far enough in advance that reproduction's turn-around time will not hinder distribution of the material.

A majority of the items reproduced at Reese have between one to four originals. The usual turn-around time jobs like these is two days after it is turned-in. That turn-around time does not include the day a document arrives at the Reproduction Office or weekends. That time is also without stapling or collating.



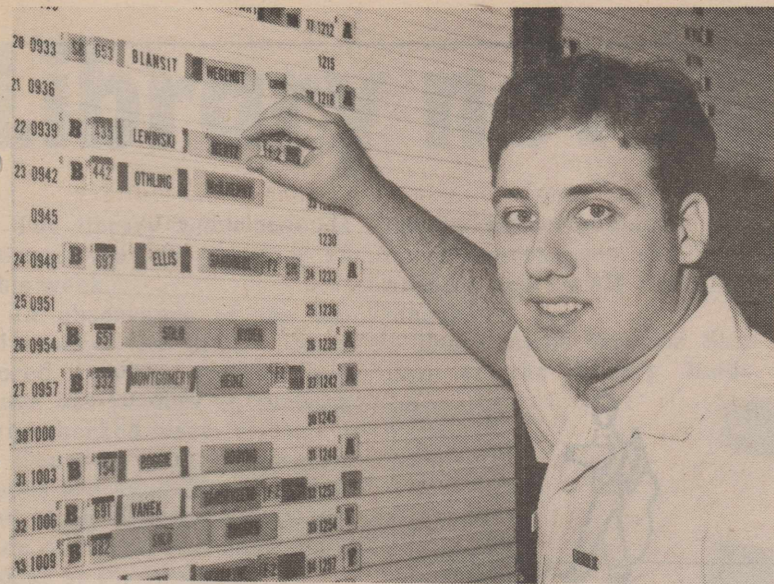

# Music review Branigan's 'Self Control'

Laura Branigan has come a long way since her first single, "Gloria," and guest appearances on "Chips." She has moved from the artificial glitter of "Solid Gold" to the show-biz bigtime of MTV. Still, the new Branigan album, "Self Control," raises a few questions about her artistic progress and potential.

L.B. is the kind of singer who performs material by others. For example, rumor has it that she was the runner-up for singing the theme from the movie "Octopussy," eventually sung by Rita Coolidge. On "Self Control," Branigan and her producer, Robbie Buchanan, live and die by their song selections.

The two singles—the title tune and "The Lucky One"—start the album off on the positive side. "Lucky One" is a synthesizer and rhythm show, while "Self Control" slyly creates a mood of sultry

sophistication. Both songs benefit from Buchanan's imaginative production and keyboard skills.

Many of "Self Control's" other songs suffer from a basic weakness—they are not well suited for Ms. Branigan's voice. "Will You Still Love Me Tomorrow," the Goffin-King classic, is a particularly bad choice. Buchanan tries to turn it into a grand ballad, but the listener's attention is focused on Branigan's vocal limitations. With a shortness of breath at the beginning of certain phrases, one has to wonder when Branigan will get voice lessons to tighten up her sound.

Although some of the material on "Self Control" is weak, the album as a whole is much more professional than Laura Branigan's previous LPs. When everything works as on "The Lucky One," the music fits easily into the chart-breaking mold established by pop superstars like Donna Summer.

Reese is the host site for the 1984 Air Training Command Central District and ATC Flag Football Championships.

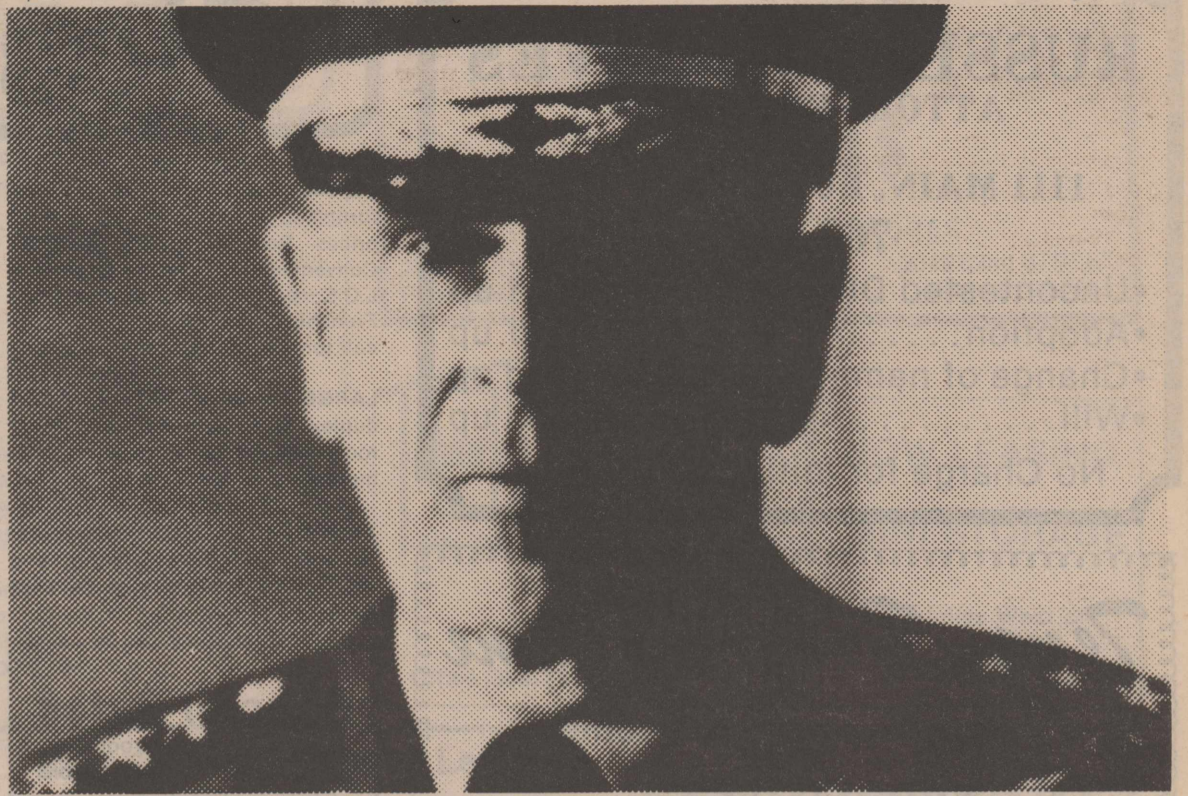

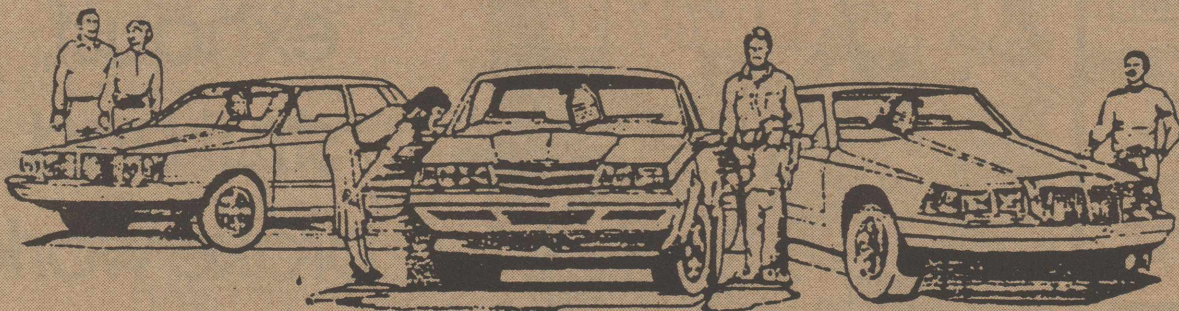

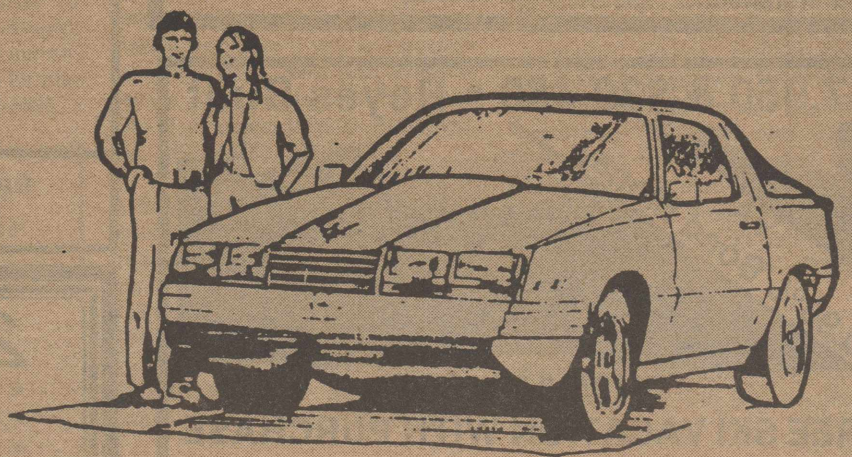
