Paul Waggoner's show-place arena for four nights, June 21-24, in Vernon, Texas.

Plans were approved at the annual director's meeting on Monday in Vernon, where they were guests of Mr. Waggoner at a chuck wagon feed. Also at the meeting, Raymond Liles of Weinert was elected a director on the Santa Rosa Roundup board.

At this year's show the top professional rodeo performers of the nation and a brilliant assortment of specialty acts will be featured. The world champion cowboys, regular contestants at the Santa Rosa Roundup, will be competing for \$8,000 plus entry fees in prize money.

As in years past, the Roundup is being produced by the Beutler Brothers, Lynn and Jake, of Elk City, Oklahoma, who are the nation's foremost rodeo producers. John Biggs is general manager of the show.

Haskell Teacher To Attend U of T Science Session
Billy R. Blakley, teacher of mathematics in Haskell High School, is among 85 teachers from ten states, the Canal Zone and the Philippines who will take part in the University of Texas' sixth Summer Institute for secondary school teachers of science and mathematics.

The institute will coincide with the 1961 nine-week Summer Session from June 12 to Aug. 17. It is supported by a \$114,000 National Science Foundation grant.

Special basic courses in biology, physics, chemistry, mathematics and general science will be offered to teachers desiring advanced or up-to-date training. Each participant will receive \$675, plus allowances and travel expenses.

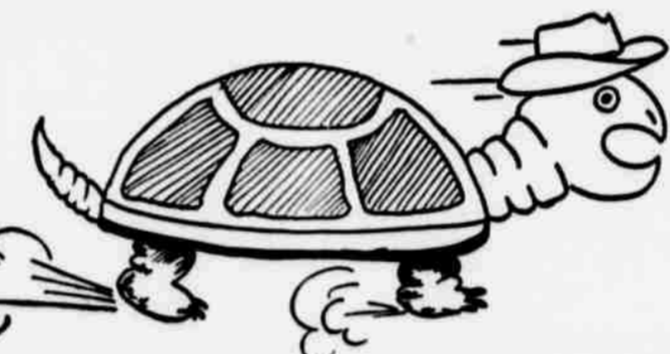
