raise that employees received in the 1990 budget. which passed calls for a $\$ 435,000$
reduction in the county budget.
Some $\$ 113,000$ will be cut with the raise deletion.

## Water crunch is facing

 many Texas rice farmers crunch is lurking ahead for many
farmers in the Texas rice belt as they compete with the growing demands of cities and industry
that generally can afford to pay that generaly can aford to pay
more for the resource.
The state's rice crop is grown on about 330,000 acres in a strip
from Jefferson County to Victoria Counts, with Houston near
the center. Water problems could force farmers to stop raising rice
on 37,000 acres of land in the next year or so, said Garry McCauley,
water management specialist at water management specialist at
the Texas A\&M agriculture
center near Beaumont. center near Beaumont.
"It is a natural resour "It is a natural resource situa-
tion, driven by economics," said tion, driven by economics," said
James Stansel, director of the
A\&M center. "If you have a
limited resource, the cost will go
up. Texas is no longer self-
sufficient in water. There is a sufficient in water. There is a
population influx into the upper Gulf Coast, which is the rice-
growing region. Put the two fac-
tors together and you have in growing region. Put the two fac-
tors together and you have in-
creased competition." At stake is a rice industry
worth around $\$ 209$ million a year worth around $\$ 209$ million a year
at the farm gate. Drying, milling at the farm gate. Drying, milling
and marketing, almost all of

similar amount. Total benefits to the state's economy
