such political advertisiug money or other thing of value in excess of the sum or sums due tor such service at the regular advertising rates of such newspaper pamphlet or printed journal, or any person who shall pay or of fer to pay the editor, publisher, nanager or agent of any newspaper, pamphlet or printed jour al for such service any money other thing of value in excess of the sum or sums due at regular advertising rates, or any person who shall pay or offer to pay any editor, publisher, manager or agent of a newspaper, pamphlet or printed journal any mublication of political advertis ing, excent as advestising matter, shall be punished by a fine of not less than $\$ 500$ nor more than $\$ 1,000$ and sentenced to imprisorment in the county jail or to work on the county road not thirty days, provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as applying to announcements of candidate for office.
