

Government to "cease and

desist" from the way in which

they may vote in 1976 elections. The new law contains some good provisions, but the main

effect has been that the Federal

Government has said that portions of the new law deter voting rights and was slapped down in the courts.

As it now stands, all those who wish to become bonafide registered voters and eligible to cast ballots during the 1976 elections are asked to go by the Tax Assessor's Office in the Court House and fill out a registration form.


