Mechanic arrested for theft
$\underset{\text { vestigation into missing Houston }}{\text { HOUSTO }}$ vestigation ime missing Houston led to the arrest of a department mechanic who is accused of stealing thousands of dollars worth of repair business.
Arson investigator Bruce Koger said Wednesday that Michael J. Baker, 40 , was ar
rested and charged Monday with unauthorized use of a motor vehicle in connection with his use of a truck that might be connected to theft of city property.
Baker was later released after posting $\$ 2,000$ bond. The investigation was launched in early March when Fire Department officials received a
tip that Baker was taking auto parts from the department's maintenance facility, Koger said. "We served a search warrant at his home and found about
$\$ 20,000$ worth of items," Koger $\$ 20,000$
said.
Many of the items are smal auto parts and are difficult to race, Koger said, adding that in-
vestigators recovered batteries with "City of Houston"
labels on them. labels on them.
"We're confident that almost
all of it is city property " all of
said.

Investigators are still in the process of tracing recovered
equipment and do not yet know exactly how much has been taken, Koger said. He said Baker has a part-time
business that provides repairs business that provides repairs
for private ambulance services.
