## BAIRD-CLYDE TO RECEIVE MAIL ONLY ONCE A-DAY

BAIRD — Effective July 28, 1969, the mid-day delivery of mail from Abilene, via Clyde, to Baird was discontinued. This was brought about by the primary source of mail supply being discontinued out of Fort Worth each day, into Abilene. With the discontinuance of this service, both Baird and Clyde will have only one dispatch of mail out of town, and will receive mail only once each day.

Baird will continue to receive mail at 0600 each day. The dispatch, however, has been moved up 30 minutes. The mail will leave from the Post Office at 5:30 P. M., instead of the old time of 6:00 P. M. All mailers should make note of this change and be sure you have your mail in the Post Office in time for

the new evening dispatch. Otherwise your mail will be exactly 24 hours late.

As a further result of the discontinuance of the mid-day receipt of mail from Abilene, the 2nd business delivery to the business section of town will be discontinued as of August 23, 1969. There is no purpose of making the trip when you have no mail to carry. So with the effective date, only one business delivery will be made to the city, the same as the residential sections now receive.

## 585 EVENTS SCHEDULED DURING FOUR DAY JUNIOR RODEO

BAIRD — A total of 276 boys and girls will be competing in 585 individual events during the four-day Baird Junior Rodeo, which opened Wednesday night at the Sheriffs Posse Arena here. The roping event drew 189 entries, and 40 contestants each are scheduled for bull riding and bronc riding events.

FEED GRAIN AND DIVERTED ACREAGE — Loss of all payments and price support.

COTTON — Loss of all payments, price support and history.

PEANUTS — Loss of price support, history and owe penalty on all production.

## Robertson's Hams To Open Outlet Store In Baird

### NINE AMENDMENTS TO BE CONSIDERED BY VOTERS TUES.

BAIRD — Texans will vote on nine proposed amendments to the state constitution in a special election Tuesday, Aug. 5.

Polls will open at 8 a. m. and close at 7 p. m. in the seven Callahan County voting places. Voters may cast their votes at the following places:

Baird - American Legion  
Clyde - Community Center  
Cross Plains - City Hall  
Putnam - Wagley Garage  
Eula - High School  
Denton Valley - Methodist Church  
Opalin - Community Center.

Briefly the proposals to be considered are:

No. 1. A clean-up amendment

to delete obsolete provisions from the constitution.

No. 2. To grant powers and flexibility of operation to the Texas Water Development Board necessary to develop sufficient water resources for present and future economic development of the state. This amendment would authorize an increase of \$3.5 billion in Water Development Bonds, eliminate present 4 per cent interest rate ceiling on said bonds and extend maturity schedule from 40 to 50 years.

No. 3. Authorizing the Legislature to set the salary of the Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House of Representatives at not more than one-half the salary of the Governor (\$20,000) and to set the salary of other members of the Legislature (now \$4,800) at not more than the salary of a district judge (\$18,000).

No. 4. Exemption non-profit water supply corporations from taxation.

No. 5. Raising the ceiling on assistance to four classes of needy from \$60 to \$80 million from state funds.

No. 6. Authorizing removal of constitutional interest rate limitations on certain bonds subject to limitations imposed by the Legislature.

No. 7. To provide assistance payments to survivors of volunteer firemen, police and certain other governmental officers, employees and agents killed on active duty.

No. 8. Authorizing Legislature to provide for additional loans to students at institutions of higher education under Texas Opportunity Plan.

No. 9. Provide for annual sessions of the Legislature.

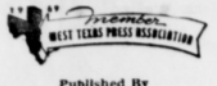

Being certified by the Commissioner of Agriculture of the State of Texas for this purpose, the Southwestern Peanut Growers' Association of Gorman, Texas proposes a referendum election of September 24, 1969, under provisions of House Bill 764, 61st Legislature on the proposition of whether or not peanut producers in the State of Texas shall assess themselves a maximum amount of \$1.00 per net ton (farmers stock basis) to be collected at the point of first processing or sale and to elect members for a 9-man commodity producers board to administer proceeds of such assessment to be used for research, disease and insect control, education, and promotion designed to encourage the production, marketing, and use of peanuts.

The referendum and election will be held by mail ballot which will be provided to all eligible voters not later than 15 days prior to the election. Ballots must be mailed to the polling place at Gorman, Texas before midnight on the date of the election.

Any person within this state engaged in the business of producing, or causing to be produced peanuts for commercial purposes is eligible to vote, including owners of farms and their tenants and sharecroppers, if such person would be required to pay the assessment proposed.

Any person qualified to vote at the referendum may place his name in nomination for membership on the proposed commodity producers board by application to the above organization signed by himself and at least ten other persons eligible to vote in the referendum. Such applications must be filed at least 30 days prior to the election date.

Any person qualified to vote who does not receive a ballot prior to September 9, 1969, may obtain one at his local County Agent's office.
