Reunion Weekend Fun Run to benefit Dick & Kay Bachman -Registration now Open!

The 2013 Reunion Weekend Fun Run/Walk and Youth Bike-A-Thon will be held Saturday, July 27. This year all proceeds from the race will go to support Dick and Kay Bachman in their fight against cancer.

Dick and Kay married in 1980 and between them have four children, nine grandchildren and 14 great-grandchildren.

In 1998 Dick was treated for prostate cancer, and had been cancer free until May when they got the devastating news that his cancer had returned but in his blood stream. It will eventually reach his bones, and treatment for this condition is incredibly expensive at approximately \$10,000 each month.

His diagnosis came in the midst of Kay's own cancer treatments.

In January Kay was diagnosed with breast cancer, and soon after her doctors also discovered an unrelated cancer in her right lung. On April 15 Kay had one-third of the lung removed.

After the lung cancer was addressed treatment for the breast cancer began. She has undergone chemotherapy treatments, which will continue into September. She will then have surgery followed by six weeks of radiation, five-days per week.

Such overwhelming news would be enough to bring any family to their knees, but it seems that the Bachman's have long-since been there in prayer. With a smooth shaven head and a smile on her face Kay says, "But God is good and everything will be okay."

Farm Service Agency NAP Coverage Available for 2014 Annual Forage Crops

(Stratford, TX), June 21, 2013 —Sherman County USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Rebecca Lowe, announced that Texas FSA will offer Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) coverage for 2014 crops that are planted annually and used for livestock feed or fodder.

The Risk Management Agency (FSA) recently announced a pilot program that offers a CAT level Rainfall Index-Annual Forage Insurance Plan to producers in Texas, Kansas, Nebraska, North Dakota, Oklahoma and South Dakota.

Because there is limited time for producers in these states to transition from NAP to the new RMA pilot program, an exception was made that will allow the states to continue offering NAP coverage for 2014. However, NAP coverage will not be available for 2015 annual forage crops.

Eligible producers can apply for 2014 NAP coverage at the Sherman County FSA Office using form CCC-471, Application for Coverage. Producers must file the application and service fee by the September 1, 2013 deadline. The service fee is the lesser of \$250 per crop or \$750 per producer per administrative county, not to exceed a total of \$1,875 for a producer with farming interests in multiple counties.

Producers who meet the definition of a limited resource, socially disadvantaged or beginning farmer or rancher can request a waiver of the service fee.

NAP provides financial assistance to producers of noninsurable crops when low yields, loss of inventory or prevented planting occur due to normal disasters.

"The easiest way for producers to protect their investment is to purchase an insurance policy," said Hemphill. "The past few years have proved that natural disasters are unavoidable, and producers can recover if they take the necessary precautions to mitigate risks."

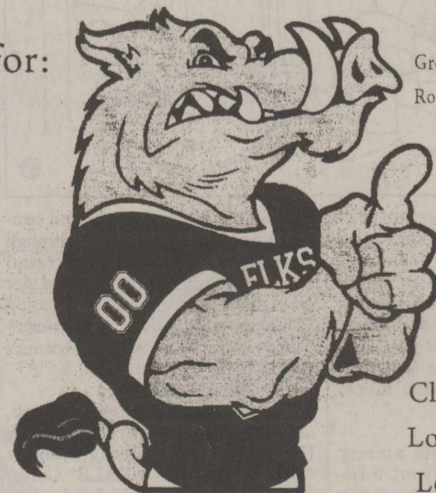

DONNA LEE KENDRICK
June 24, 1925-June 17, 2013

Donna Lee Kendrick, 87 formerly of Stratford, passed away peacefully on Monday, June 17, 2013 at the Sunshine House, Calimesa, CA, where she had lived for over 6 1/2 years.

Born June 24, 1925, in Jewell County, KS, she was the ninth of twelve children born to Will and Nellie Fogo. She grew up on the farm helping with chores, graduating in 1943 from Burr Oak High School, Burr Oak, KS. From an early age she wanted to be a nurse until she witnessed an actual operation, and then decided teaching would be more to her liking. After graduating from high school, she spent the next two years teaching in a 1-room schoolhouse. She then enrolled in Wichita State College, Wichita, KS. In Wichita she met a handsome soldier who had just returned from serving over three years in the Southwest Pacific during World War II. After several months of courtship, she married Curtis H. Kendrick on August 24, 1946, and they remained so for 53 years until his passing in 2000. She and Curtis moved to the Texas Panhandle (Borger, Texhoma and Stratford) where they raised their four children; he a share crop farmer and she, a homemaker and schoolteacher. She lived in the same home in Stratford for more than 40 years, moving to Calimesa in 2006 to be near her son David.

Always interested in teaching, Donna returned to college to pursue her teaching degree. She graduated from Panhandle State College, Goodwell, OK in 1966 and later earned her master's degree from West Texas State University, Canyon, TX in 1974. She taught 5th grade in Stratford for 22 years until her retirement. She loved teaching and interacting with children of all ages.

She was passionate about her family and looked forward to spending any amount of time with them. She never wanted gifts, but only the gift of time with family. She was a loving wife, mother, and grandmother who put her family above herself. Anytime she was asked for advice she would say "Love you family."

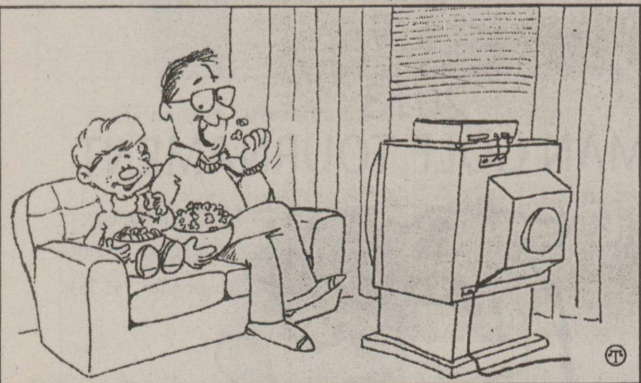
She enjoyed playing all kinds of games especially with her grandchildren who called her Mama Donna. She was an avid bridge player and Connect-4 champion. She did not like to lose. She enjoyed collecting blue glass, power walking, and spoiling her dog, Ginger Snap. She was active in her church and served the Lord with her gentle and loving spirit.

She is survived by her four children: David Kendrick and wife Sherry of Yucaipa, CA; Steven Kendrick and wife Sherry of Mechanicsburg, PA; Dana Maddox and husband Russell of North Richland Hills, TX; and Rodney Kendrick of Bellevue, WA. Preston Burr, 17 year old son of Ed and Christy Burr, has earned a position on the Texas National High School rodeo team. He will represent Team Texas in bareback riding. Preston will travel to Rock Springs, WY. July 14-20 to compete in the 65th annual National High School Finals Rodeo (NHSFR).

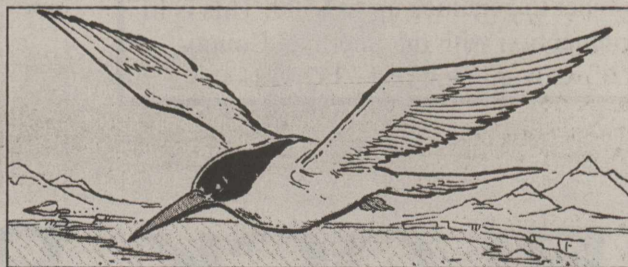
Featuring more than 1500 contestants from 41 states, five Canadian Provinces and Australia, the NHSFR is the world's largest rodeo. In addition to competing for more than \$200,000 in prizes, NHSFR contestants will also be competing for more than \$350,000 in college scholarships and the chance to be named an NHSFR National Champion. To earn this title, contestants must finish in the top 20 - based on their combined times/scores in the first two rounds - to advance to Saturday evening's final round. National champions will be determined based on their three-round combined times/scores. Team Texas has won the National Team Championship for the last three years.

Preston qualified for NHSFR by finishing 4th in Texas in bareback riding. His road to Wyoming will begin early on July 6th as he will represent the Bloomer Trailer High School Rodeo Team as 1 of their 3 bareback riders at the I.F.Y.R. (International Finals Youth Rodeo). The I.F.Y.R. will be held in Shawnee, OK. July 6th-13th. Good luck to Preston and Team Texas!

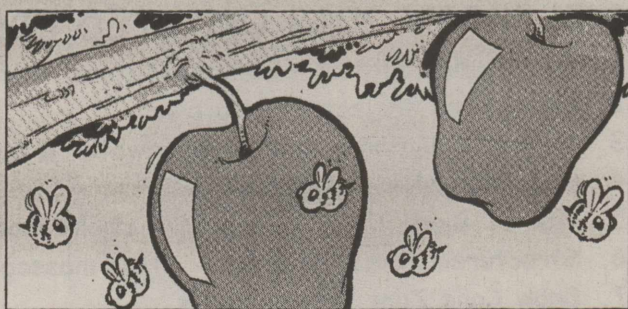

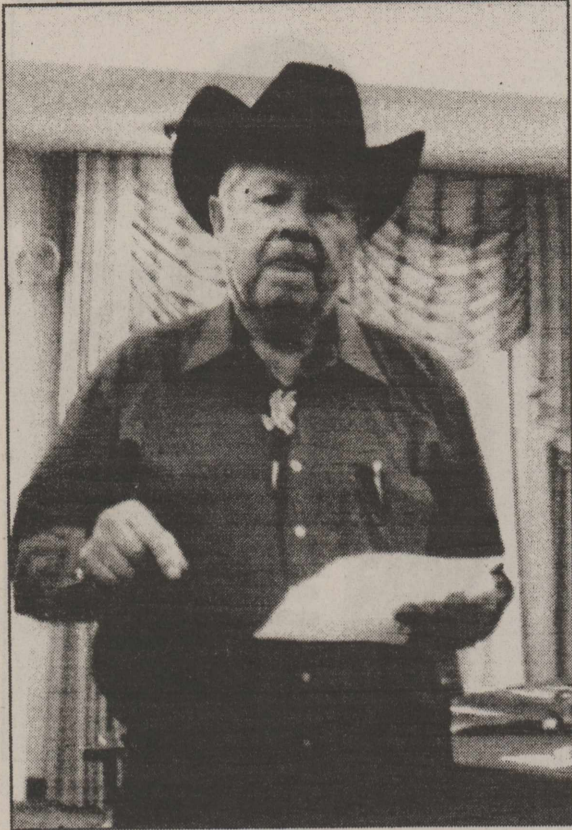
