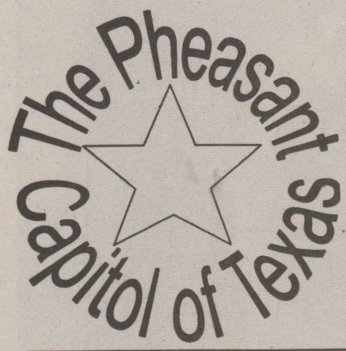

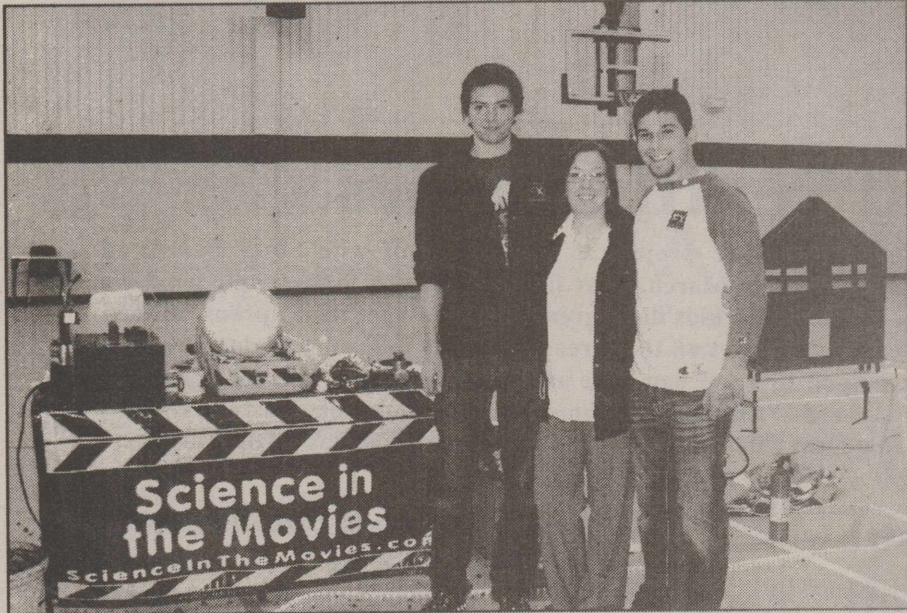

Science in the Movies Program

The Science in the Movies program is an assembly where a man by the name of Thomas Betts, a stunt and special effects expert, came and brought presentation which reveals the exciting way that science, technology, engineering, and math are safely used to create movie stunts and special effects. This area is being developed to help beautify the north edge of Stratford and to serve as a wind break for the residents. The trees in this area were planted several years ago by Modern Woodmen of America.

Riffe and Russell Spurlock, along with Chris and Ronna Jo Riffe, and his parents Pat and Nita Barnard started on the chilly Saturday morning of digging the ditch for the drip line. Bret and crew dug up trees donated by Doris and Larry Parson for the project and planted them where there had previously been trees that did not survive. Hopefully with the addition of the drip irrigation line, all of the trees in this area will now have a bright future.

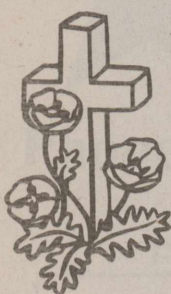

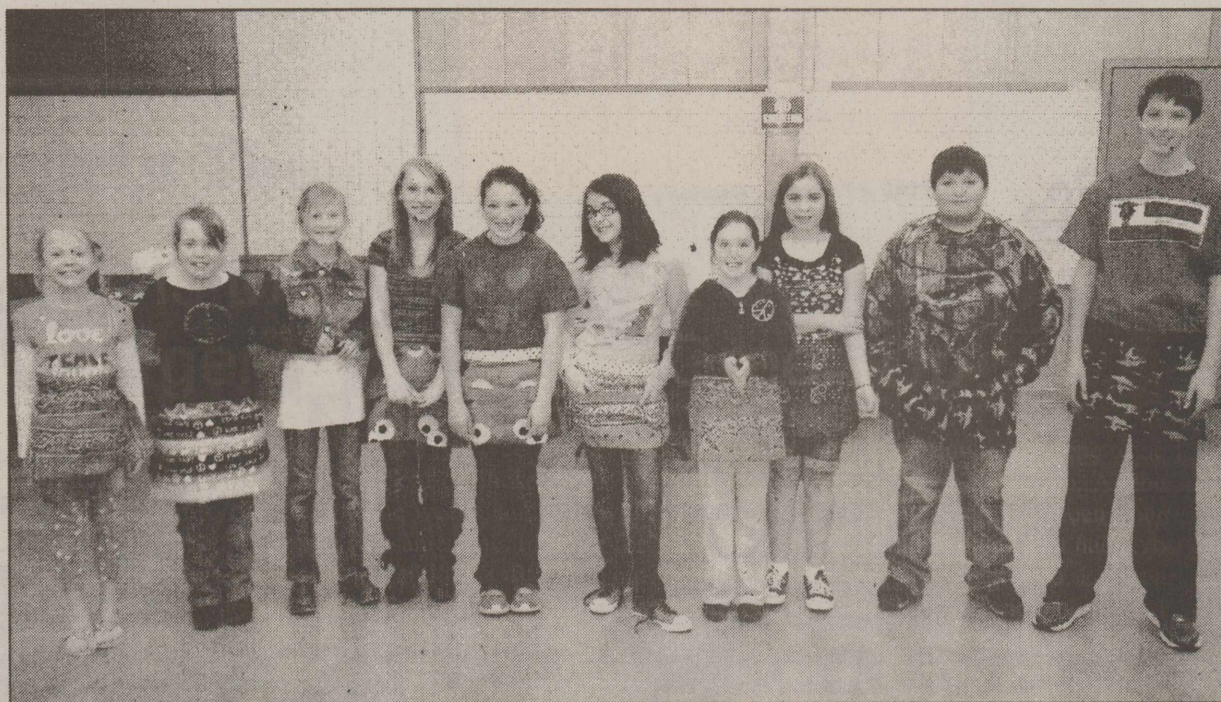
Gail was a lover of life. She had a generous, beautiful, and bright spirit. She enjoyed the fine arts and especially dance and was, in fact, a dance teacher for several years. She was awarded a scholarship for Ballet to Texas Christian University when she graduated from Amarillo High School in 1954 and studied under Miestro Mieczslaw Gianowski who was dance master of the Anna Pavlowa Ballet Company. She managed, and taught in dance studios in Austin, Amarillo, and Stratford, Texas. She introduced hundreds of kids in Texas to the joys of dance during this time. She was Stratford's Citizen of the Year, in 1967, largely due to her hard work and leadership in putting on her annual "Town Follies" dance recitals. Her determined efforts and ticket sales, along with contributions, to the "Town Follies" were in large part, responsible for the construction of the new Stratford Public Library. Gail was an avid homemaker as well. No one could decorate a house for Christmas like Gail could. She was a loving mother and wife and a wonderful creator of memories for her family.

She lived with husband, Charles, in Flint Ridge, Oklahoma for many years. Gail bloomed everywhere she was planted and she did so again in Flint Ridge. She managed the pro shop at the Deer Valley Golf Course and eventually became the food and beverage manager as well. She enjoyed the work and the people she worked with, and she was good at what she did. She was an avid golfer, gardener, and bird watcher. She was also a wonderful cook, and loved cooking for friends and family. Gail never met a stranger. She treated everyone with respect and truly followed the Golden Rule. She was greatly loved by all who knew her and she will be greatly missed by all who knew her.

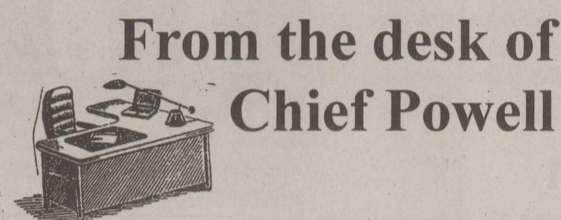

Now Is the Time to Put Out Pre-Emergent For Spring Green Up

With the recent moisture that we have received and spring right around the corner, now is the time to be getting that pre-emergent herbicide out on those lawns in time to get weeds before they pop up. As the temperatures start to rise, so will the weeds, and you will be able to take them out early and green your lawn up with a little fertilizer at the same time. In order for a pre-emergent to be most effective it needs to be applied before the weeds emerge and it needs a little moisture in order to soak into the ground. Either a little rain or a lite watering is usually sufficient. Pre-emergents can be purchased at nurseries, home and garden centers, feed stores, and hardware stores. The most important thing to look for is that the chemical or chemicals you are purchasing are labeled for your particular type of grass. With most of our grasses up here being either Bermuda or buffalo, PRE-M and Surflan are generally labeled for pre-emergence and 2,4-D and MSMA are labeled for post-emergence. Another thing to keep in mind is how much you put out. Accurately measuring the square footage of your lawn and then purchasing and applying the appropriate amount of herbicide will prevent burning your lawn or failing to control the weeds. Once the weeds are taken out of your lawn a little fertilizer will go a lot farther in greening up your yard and helping the grass to fill in any bare spots.
