## 344.5 MILES OF TEXAS HIGHWAYS TO BE IMPROVED

ABILENE — The Texas Highway Commission today approved the expenditure of \$1,949,900 for highway safety and betterment and improvement of state highways and farm to market roads in District 8 during 1971.

District Engineer J. C. Roberts of Abilene said that a total of 344.5 miles will be involved in the annual program.

The work is part of the Highway Commission's combined Farm to Market Road Improvement and State Highway Safety and Betterment Programs for 1971.

The types of work included in the program cover 339 miles of asphalt seal coats scattered over the district plus the re-

construction of a section of S.L. 176 in Howard County.

Mr. Roberts said that among the projects included in the program, the following projects will take place in this county:

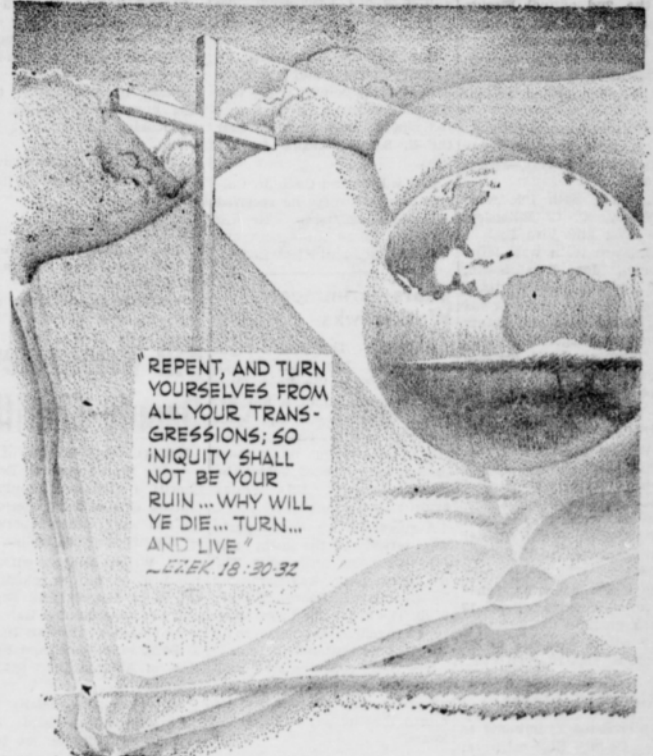

**COUNTY LAND OWNERS LEASING LAND FOR HUNTING**

BAIRD—Claude Holly, manager of Baird Chamber of Commerce, and Chairman of the Callahan Program Building Committee, stated that a list is being compiled of all land owners who are interested in leasing their land for hunting of deer, dove, quail and turkey. At the present time, there are 22 land owners on 27,000 acres listed.

Conservation practices recently completed on local farms and ranches include a parallel terrace system on Stanley Sharpe, waterway on T. B. Scott, and a pond on N. L. Long Jr.

Native grasses seeded following treedozing last spring on the R. H. Seale Ranch are making good growth despite the dry summer. The pastures will continue to be rested until Nov. 1 to give the grasses time to produce a seed crop and to develop a strong root system.

Maintenance work on their terrace system prior to sowing small grain this fall is being

done on the Johnny Adams and Pat Shields farm. Terrace maintenance is necessary for protection of cropland from water erosion following high intensity rains during fall and spring rains.

A plant material center is being developed by Dick Vestal, Baird Voc. Ag. Instructor, and his students on land owned by the Baird Ind. School District. Twenty-three grasses and forbs, which were furnished by the SCS Plant Materials Center at Knox City, have been established this summer with the assistance of James Herrings and A. H. Ringhoffer. Fifteen cool season grasses will be seeded next week, then additional warm season grasses will be seeded next spring. Jon Tate, Supt. of Baird Schools, stated that these grasses will be available for study and identification by Voc. Ag. Classes, 4-H Clubs, farmers, ranchers, and other land users. This area will be used by the SCS to study new strains of grasses to determine their adaptability in this area.

A tour of the SCS Plant Materials Center at Knox City will be made Sept 30 to see new varieties of grasses being evaluated. Anyone interested in going on the tour may contact A. H. Ringhoffer at the SCS office for additional information.

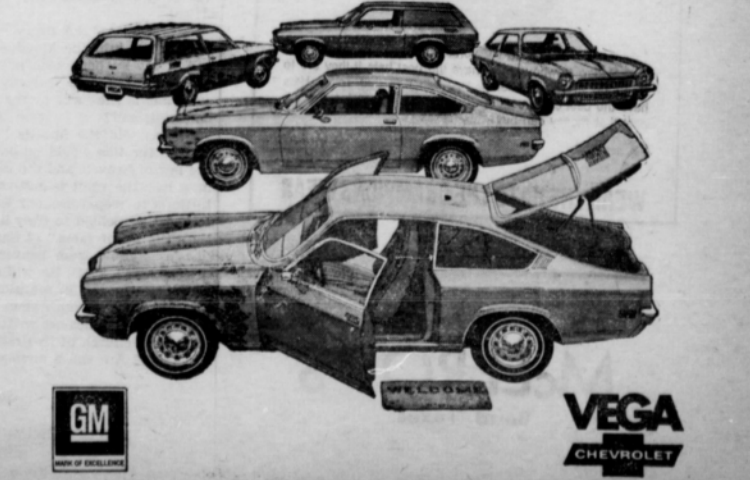
