

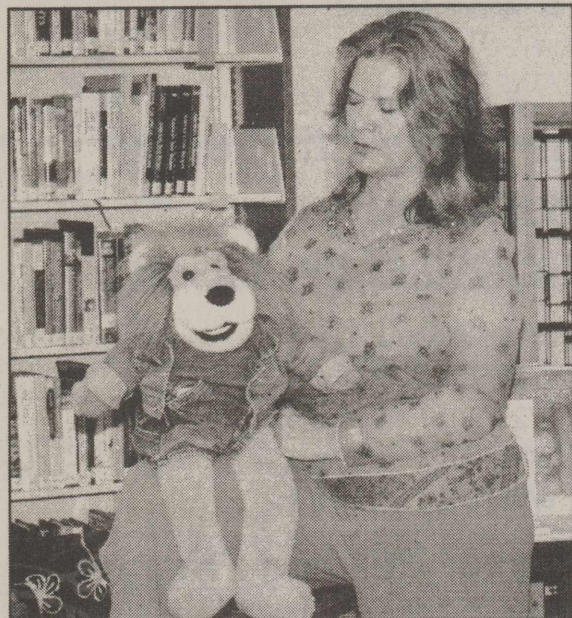

Preston Burr Qualifies for National Finals Rodeo

Preston Burr, a student at Stratford High School, has earned a position on the Texas High School Rodeo Team and will be traveling with fellow teammates to Rock Springs, WY from July 15-21 to compete at the 64th Annual National High School Finals Rodeo in Bareback Riding competition. Burr earned this position by finishing the #4 Bareback Rider in the State of Texas during State finals in Abilene, TX.

The National Finals Rodeo will be featuring over 1,500 contestants from 41 states, five Canadian Provinces, and Australia, the National High School Finals is the world's largest rodeo. In addition to competing for over \$200,000 in prizes, NHRF contestants will also be competing for more than \$350,000 in college scholarships and the chance to be named the National High School Champion. To earn this title, Preston must finish in the top twenty after two go-rounds of intense competition before advancing to Saturday night's final championship performance. When Watering Your Lawn, Make Sure You Put Down the Right Amount

With the hot temperatures and high winds, sprinklers are running overtime right now in an effort to keep everyone's yard looking as beautiful as possible. The problem arises when a good portion of that water runs down the street or is applied at 3:00 in the afternoon and is lost to evaporation before it ever has a chance to make it to the plants roots. In order to save you some money on your utility bills as well as keep your lawn looking good and minimizing the runoff of fertilizer and pesticides from your lawn, keep a few tips in mind when irrigating.

First off only water your lawn when it absolutely needs it. By keeping an eye on your grass it will tell you when it is starting to stress. When the blades start to turn a dull, bluish color, or start to roll or fold over then it is time for a watering. Also, if you walk across your lawn and the footprints remain for more than a couple of minutes then it is starting to stress.

Watering your yard for long, infrequent cycles instead of short frequent or daily irrigations will help promote a deep root system, healthier lawn, and allow the lawn to go longer periods of time in between watering. About one inch of water every 5-8 days is generally sufficient; of course this will vary depending on weather conditions. Hotter days such as right now will require more frequent watering, cooler, cloudier days may require less frequent watering.

Also try to avoid watering during the hottest parts of the day. If you have a sprinkler system, program it to come on in the middle of the night when the temperatures and the wind are much lower. However, periodically turn your system on and check all of the sprinkler heads to make sure they are still spraying in the proper direction. On several occasions I have left town at 3:00 or 4:00 a.m. and have seen sprinkler systems running, like they should be, but the heads were spraying out in the street or straight up in the air. If you are watering with a hose, do what you can to water as much as possible early in the morning and later in the evening after the sun begins to set. Many of you have probably heard people say never water at night or before 4:00 a.m. because of disease problems. I assure you; in the Texas Panhandle we do not have enough humidity for diseases to be a problem in our lawns. So water all night if you need to, it will stretch your water farther.

You should also keep in mind that the more you water and fertilize your lawn, the more you will have to mow. Generally you do not want to cut more than 1/3 of the leaf blade off at a time. For Bermuda grass and buffalo, keep the mowing height 1-2 inches tall, for Fescue, 2-3 inches tall. The taller that you keep your lawn, the more moisture your soil will conserve from the shading of the grass. Finally, we are approaching the time of year when many of you will be applying your second application of fertilizer on your lawns. For information or soil sample bags, please stop by the office.

RED, WHITE & BLUE JAMBOREE BANNERS



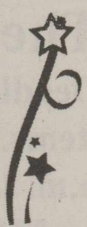

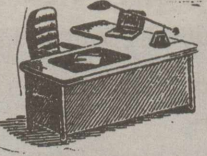

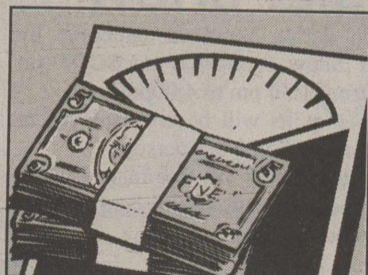

FOOD How to Bake Catfish Using Parchment Paper

(NU) - Whoever taught you how to cook, be it Mom, Grandma or the Food Network, probably shared the secret to no-muss, no-fuss baking. After all, many chefs know that baking with parchment paper is key for moist cookies, brownies and other sweet treats.

Do you also think of using parchment paper for meats, seafood, pizza, soup, fondue, vegetables and more? You should - the tool is practically limitless. It can be used in dozens of dishes with the simplest clean-up. Plus, unlike wax paper or plastic wrap, parchment paper doesn't melt onto your food.

Check out a savory catfish recipe using parchment paper and U.S. Farm-Raised Catfish:

- Baked Catfish in Papillotes**
- 2 U.S. Farm-Raised Catfish fillets
 - 2 celery ribs, cut into long strips
 - 1 large carrot, peeled and cut into long strips
 - 1 medium red onion, sliced
 - 1/4 cup olive oil
 - 2 large sheets parchment paper
 - 3 tablespoons dry white wine
 - 1 lemon, juiced
 - 2 tablespoons clam juice
 - 1 large tomato, chopped (seeded)
 - 1 teaspoon fresh thyme leaves
 - 1 teaspoon fresh dill, chopped
 - 1 teaspoon fresh tarragon, chopped
 - 2 tablespoons fresh parsley, finely chopped
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper

1. Preheat oven to 400 F. Bring small pot of water to boil. Add celery and carrots; cook 1 minute. Remove and place in bowl under running cold water. Place on paper towel to dry.
2. Cut two sheets of large parch-

ment paper into a 20 by 20 inch square; fold in half and lightly crease. Unfold paper; lightly brush one side of each paper with olive oil. Divide celery, carrots and onion evenly into a small pile on one-half of each paper. Place one fillet on top of each. Lightly fold up edges to create a small, bowl-like vessel.

3. In a mixing bowl, combine wine, lemon juice and clam juice. Drizzle each fillet with 3 tablespoons of mixture, ensuring that it is contained in the paper. Place half the chopped tomato over each fillet and sprinkle half of each fresh herb over tomatoes. Season with salt and pepper.
4. Fold parchment paper over fillet and vegetables. Beginning at the creased corner, start folding the edges over one-half inch. Continue until paper is a series of tight, overlapping folds, creating "papillotes."
5. Place papillotes on large baking sheet. Bake 11 minutes or until bags are nicely puffed and slightly browned.

USDA Seeks Applications for Grants to Help Rural Businesses Create Jobs

TEMPLE, TX, June 13, 2012— Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack announced that USDA is accepting applications for grants to help promote sustainable economic development and job creation in rural communities.

"Cooperative enterprises often lead economic growth and job creation in rural areas," Vilsack said. "USDA is offering grants to help organizations start cooperatives, expand existing ones or help develop business opportunities in rural areas."

"USDA Rural Development's mission is to provide assistance that will increase the economic conditions of rural communities," said Paco Valentin, USDA Rural Development Texas State Director. "By providing these grants, we increase the technical and educational assistance available to rural business owners through cooperative development centers and in turn, promote job creation and improve rural business operations."

USDA is offering Rural Cooperative Development Grants (RCDG) to non-profit corporations and institutions of higher education. The grants also may be used to conduct feasibility studies, create and implement business plans, and help businesses develop new markets for their products and services.

One-year grants up to \$175,000 are available. In most cases, grants may be used to pay for up to 75 percent of the cost of establishing and operating rural cooperative development centers. Recipients are required to match 25 percent of the award amount. The grant period should begin no earlier than October 1, 2012, and no later than January 1, 2013.

Through this notice, USDA may award up to \$5.8 million in grants. The deadline for RCDG applications is August 6, 2012. For additional information, see the June 7, 2012 Federal Register at <https://www.federalregister.gov/articles/2012/06/07/2012-13833/inviting-applications-for-rural-cooperative-development-grants> or contact the Texas Rural Development State Office at 254-742-9780.

In addition, USDA is also offering almost \$2.37 million in grants through USDA Rural Development's Rural Business Opportunity Grant (RBOG). The program promotes sustainable economic development in rural communities and regions with exceptional needs.

The RBOG program provides training and technical assistance grants for business development, entrepreneurs, and economic development officials and assists with economic development planning. Funding is available to rural public bodies, nonprofit corporations, Native American tribes and cooperatives with primarily rural members that conduct activities for the mutual benefit of the membership.

Applications for Rural Business Opportunity Grants are due August 6, 2012. 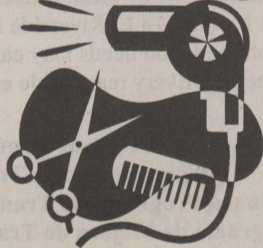
