

Attention: TAXPAYERS

At a time when people are concerned about the tax increases, everyone should make an effort to be better informed about the Texas property tax system and how it functions.

Main divisions of the property tax system are:

1. APPRAISAL DISTRICT which sets the value of property based on procedures established by state laws. These values are checked each year by the Property Tax Division of the State Comptroller's Office for accuracy. An Agricultural Advisory Committee of three local farmers reviews farm and ranch land values. The Chief Appraiser operates the Appraisal District office and is employed by an eight member board. This board is elected by the taxing units.

2. APPRAISAL REVIEW BOARD is a board of six local citizens who settle any disagreements between the taxpayer and the Appraisal District concerning value.

3. LOCAL TAXING UNITS (County, city, school, hospital, other governments) decide how much revenue will be needed to operate for the coming year. They then set the tax rate which determines how much tax liability each taxpayer will have. Each taxing unit has an elected governing body.

Through the checks and balances of the system, no one person has total responsibility for your tax bill.

The work of locating and placing value on property is completed for the 2011 tax roll. On

May 19th, taxpayers were mailed a notice of proposed value on their property. Now is your opportunity to respond if you have questions or difference of opinion in regard to this value. After the Appraisal Review Board meets on July 7th and •approves the records, the Appraisal District has no more authority over the value. The values then go to the taxing units in the form of an appraisal roll. At that time, the taxing units are preparing budgets and setting rates.

Most taxing units have contracted with the Appraisal District to do collection of taxes. The County Tax Assessor/Collector collects the County's taxes.

As always there are lots of things to do at your library, so please come by and visit. Library cards are free, but there is a charge for your replacement card if stolen or lost.







KERRICK - William "Bill" Allen Boren, 79, died Friday, May 27, 2011.

Graveside services were held at 11 a.m. Tuesday May 31, 2011 in Stratford Cemetery in Stratford with the Rev. Roy Harris, pastor of Kerrick Community Church, officiating. A flag detail was provided by American Legion Post 224 of Dumas. Arrangements were by Morrison Funeral Directors.

Bill was born March 8, 1932, in Boise City, Okla., to Joseph and Allene Boren. He was a resident of Kerrick his entire life and a graduate of Stratford High School. He served his country in the U.S. Army from 1954 to 1955. Bill married Patricia Ann Carroll on Dec. 22, 1953, in Raton, N.M.

Bill farmed for most of his life. He was voted Outstanding Conservation Farmer in Dallam County in 1984 and received the Award of Merit in 1983 for resource conservation.

Bill was a member of the NRA, and enjoyed collecting guns. He was also a member of the American Legion in Stratford and Kerrick Community Church.

He was preceded in death by two brothers, Charles Boren and Homer Boren.



Scott Buckles Elected to Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board

TEMPLE, Texas May 4, 2011-Scott Buckles of Stratford, Texas, was elected May 3, to serve a two-year term on the Texas State Soil and Water Conservation Board (TSSWCB). The TSSWCB's state headquarters are located in Temple, TX.

Buckles represents TSSWCB State District One, which consists of 51 counties in the panhandle and south plains region of Texas. District One encompasses 49 soil and water conservation districts (SWCDS).

Prior to being elected to the TSSWCB, Buckles has served 16 years on the board of directors of the Sherman County SWCD headquartered in Stratford. He is the present chairman of the SWCD.

In addition to serving on his local SWCD board, Buckles was elected in 2003 to serve on the Association of Texas. Soil and Water Conservation Districts board of directors (ATSWCDS). In the statewide organization he has served as vice-president from 2008-09 and then as president from October 2009 to the present.

The ATSWCDS is a non-profit organization that provides leadership, education, guidance in government policy and legislative strategies at local, state and federal levels to preserve and conserve natural resources on public and private lands in the State to the 216 member local SWCDS. Buckles is also a past president of the Panhandle Association of Soil and Water Conservation Districts and currently serves as a member on the legislative committee for the National Association of Conservations Districts.

The conservationist said, "I live by the philosophy that I make my living from the land and understand that the land will only take care of us if we take care of it first."

The TSSWCB was created in 1939 to assist agricultural landowners in the formation of local SWCDS and to coordinate a statewide soil and water conservation program. The TSSWCB is designated by the Legislature as the planning and management agency for the state with regards to agricultural and silvicultural nonpoint source pollution. The designation includes administering a cost-share assistance program through SWCDS for implementing soil and water conservation land improvement measures.

In addition the TSSWCB is authorized by the Legislature to conduct a water supply enhancement program through local SWCDS that includes cost-share assistance for the selective control, removal, or reduction of maxious brush such a mesquite, salt cedar, and other brush species that consume water to a degree that is detrimental to water conservation.

The TSSWCB board of directors consists of five elected members and two governor Appointees. The five TSSWCB members are elected in a convention type election by SWCD Directors in the State District that the TSSWCB member represents.

Buckles is the managing partner of Buckles Farms Partnership located in Sherman County. The family operation has been in business since 1917 and currently, sic produces corn, ograin, sorghum, wheat and cattle. The newly elected TSSWCB member is also involved in other retail businesses including crop and aerial spraying.

Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these appeal procedures if you have a concern about

- · the market or appraised value of your property
- the unequal appraisal of your property
 the inclusion of your property on the appraisal roll
- any exemptions that may apply to you
- the qualification for an agricultural or timber appraisal
- the taxable status of your property
- the local governments which should be taxing your property
- the ownership of property
- the change of use of land receiving special appraisal
- any action taken by the chief appraiser, appraisal district or appraisal review board that applies to and adversely affects you.

Review by the Appraisal Review Board

If you can't resolve your problem informally with the county appraisal district (CAD) staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the CAD to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. If necessary, you may request a hearing in the evening or on a Saturday or Sunday. Prior to your hearing, you may ask to review the evidence the CAD plans to introduce at the hearing to establish any matter at issue. The CAD might ask you for a copy of the evidence you plan to present. The law provides that before a hearing on a protest or immediately after the hearing begins, you or your agent and the CAD shall each provide the other with a copy of any written material intended to be offered or submitted to the ARB at the hearing. To the greatest extent practicable, the hearing will be informal. You or a designated agent may appear in person to present evidence or you may send notarized evidence for the ARB to review at your hearing. The CAD representative will present evidence about your case. You may cross-examine the CAD representative. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. In most cases, the CAD has the burden of establishing the property's value by a preponderance of the evidence presented

In certain protests where the owner has submitted an independent appraisal before the hearing, the chief appraiser has the burden of proving the property's value by clear and convincing evidence. You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisal district office at

Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your case before the ARB hears it.

Review by the District Court or an Arbitrator or SOAH

After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 60 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. In certain cases, as an alternative to filing an appeal in district court, you may file, not later than the 45th day after you receive notice of the ARB order, a request for binding arbitration with the county appraisal district. In certain cases originating in certain counties, as an alternative to filing an appeal in district court, you may appeal to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH). An appeal to SOAH is initiated by, not later than the 30th day after you receive notice of the ARB's order, filing with the chief appraiser of the county appraisal district a notice of appeal with the applicable filing fee.

Tax Paymen

You must pay either the amount of taxes due on the portion of the taxable value not in dispute or the amount of taxes due on the property under the order from which the appeal is taken.

Deadline for Filing Protests with the ARB* JUNE 20, 2011

Usual Deadline

On or before May 31 (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is later).

Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have good cause,

Late protests are due the day before the ARB approves records for the year. Contact your appraisal district for more information.

Special Deadlines


For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is not later than the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

* The deadline is postponed to the next business day if it falls on a weekend or holiday.

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is not later than the 30th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.

If you believe the appraisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest until the day before taxes become delinquent (usually February 1) or no later than the 125th day after the date you claim you received a tax bill from one or more of the taxing units that tax your property. The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to you.
