

Balloons Released in Memory



Mobile VET Center (MVC) to Visit Stratford March 11



family counseling.




Stratford Elk senior Logan Uttley is fouled as he goes up for the shot in the Elks 66-63 Area lost to Memphis.

Texhoma, Oklahoma - L.J. Russell, 87, went to be with the Lord Wednesday, February 19, 2014 at the family home. L.J. Russell was born July15, 1926, near Andice, Texas, located northwest of Austin in the Texas Hill Country. He was the only son born to Neva (Windsor) and Lemuel Jackson Russell and had two older sisters and two younger sisters. L.J. accepted the Lord, as his personal Savior, while he was still a young teenager. He was baptized in the creek that flowed through the family property, and was active in the Andice First Baptist Church for many years. After graduating from Florence High School in 1943, L.J. entered the U.S. Navy and served honorably as a Machinist Mate 1st Class, in the South Pacific. In 1965, L.J. and Margaret purchased land and moved their home northwest of Texhoma. Always an innovative famer, he brought his knowledge of irrigation to the area. L.J. was a man of integrity and raised and guided his family to have respect for God and country. He appreciated his employees and treated them fairly and as if they were part of his family. The couple enjoyed seeing their sons graduate from Texhoma High School and Panhandle State University, Goodwell. 



The OAP has less than a month to prepare for the Zone competition. They have been in rehearsals and practice festivals. The always great Dinner Theatre will be March 17 and Zone competition is set for March 19. Break a leg!

The UIL Band Concert and Sight-reading Contest will be the first week in March at Panhandle HS. The Big Blue Band has been preparing since the end of marching season for this contest. Good luck in continuing the successful tradition of the Stratford Band.

We closed out a successful basketball season a little sooner than we wanted. Both the Lady Elks and Elks reached the playoff before bowing out. We won a lot of games and they had many bright moments throughout the season. At the junior high, three of the four teams went undefeated so the future is bright for Stratford basketball.

Many of the tracksters are sore as the nice weather and the end of basketball has given many of our athletics the opportunity to begin training for next week's first track meet at Sunray. Stratford will be hosting the District Junior High Meet the first weekend in April and high school district competition will be in the following week.

I am amazed with some of the new technology appearing in our classrooms. I have observed in several classrooms on the two secondary campuses where the teacher is utilizing Apple TV technology to move an iPad screen to the Smart board. I even observed a teacher using her personal iPhone to project a lesson on the screen to enhance student learning. It is a long way from chalk and dry erasers. I am thankful that we have teachers that are willing to step out and bring the most technologically-advanced classroom possible for our students.

The high school computer lab is up and running. It was fun to watch the high school teachers peering into the new lab just waiting on their opportunity to use the facility. A big thanks to Travis and Jim for making it operational in a short time, along with the school board for making this possible.

IPad use is also exploding throughout the district. It is probably something that will continue to grow. I am interested in how we can utilize our student smart phones in student learning. There are many districts that have BYOD (Bring your own device) programs. There are things to consider such as bandwidth on T-1 lines, security and unauthorized sites. But many of our students are already experts in the use of smart technology.

Mrs. Garza and I have had several productive meetings with the administration of Frank Phillips College and Amarillo College. Over the past five years, our dual credit services have been provided by Amarillo College. This arrangement will continue, but we are exploring areas that FPC could provide to expand opportunities for our students. Career and Technical Education are receiving political/legislative support and we might be able to see how dual credit Ag or Allied Health might work for our clientele. It will be interesting to watch this relationship develop over the next three years.

I am thrilled that the trustees extended my contract through June 2017 at January's board meeting. Stephanie and I count our blessings daily that we have been given the opportunity to live and serve in this community. We hope to spend many years being a part of this community and sharing our lives with you. I know that everyone doesn't agree with every decision that is made from our administrative offices — I sometimes don't like them either, but the decisions will also be what we believe is in the best interest of our organization, our students, and our staff. Assisting Blinded Veterans Is Their Mission

(NAPS)-Many veterans have found that a sudden physical dis-ability can change the course of their life. However, that change can often be as fulfilling as the path the person was on before the

disability.
The Blinded Veterans Association (BVA) credits these positive \$55.00 life changes experienced by blinded veterans, in large part, to the modern, world-class blind \$61.00 rehabilitation programs and services of the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). BVA has been a \$69.20 major catalyst for these programs since its founding in 1945.

An Advocate For Service Soon after its founding, BVA urged members of Congress to pressure the Veterans Administration (VA)—now known as Department of Veterans Affairs-to establish appropriate services for men and women returning from World War II who had been blinded.

When that effort stalled for a time, the organization went to the executive branch of government. That action resulted in an executive order from President Harry S. Truman in 1947 that required VA to establish a residential Blind soza soss de soza additional landscape.

The VIST

still experiencing the isolating effects of blindness, BVA pressed for greater help from VA.

The result was the establishment in 1968 of the Visual Impairment Services Team (VIST) concept. VISTs employ full-time Coordinators who identify eligible

veterans and encourage them to take full advantage of a wide array of VA benefits and services offered by the Team.

VIST Coordinators invite and encourage blinded veterans to come in for an annual assessment of their physical, social and psychological needs and a review of their benefits and potential benefits. They then recommend the appropriate ser-

vices for veterans with vision loss. BVA regularly honors outstanding VIST Coordinators with Certificates of Appreciation at nearly every national convention. This year, for example, recipients were Suzanne Bennatt of the Spokane VA Medical Center and Edward Richards of the Northport (N.Y.) VA Medical Center. Membership in BVA is open to

all legally blind veterans who have served in the U.S. military. It is not restricted to veterans whose blindness is service connected, nor must veterans be a member of BVA to receive assistance from the organization, which is always free of charge.


