Hepatitis B more common among blacks

ATLANTA (AP) - Hepatitis B, suspected for years to be more common among blacks than whites, strikes blacks at a rate
four times higher than whites, acforr times to a new statistical cording to a new statistica
analysis from health resear chers.
In the first nationwide scientific survey for hepatitis B infection, covering more than 14,000
people over five years people over five years, 4.8 per
cent showed signs in blood tests of having been infected with of having been infected with
hepatitis B virus some time dur ing their lives. Among blacks, 13.7 percen
tested positive compared to tested positive, compared to percent of whites, the nationa
Centers for Disease Contro reported Thursday.
