DALLAS (AP) - Dallas city officials plan to enlist thousands of volunteers February in an
anti-drug program anti-drug program.
A volunteer network, to be callA volunteer network, to be call-
ed "Dallas Against Drugs," calls for three groups to focus on different drug-related problems, in-
cluding crime education, prevencluding crime education, preven-
tion and rehabilitation. The city's new substance abuse coordinator on Friday told the Mayor's Advisory Committee on
Crime that the plan calls for Crime that the plan calls for recruiting and training eight
district coordinators who would train and mobilize thousands of volunteers. "I think we will make a difference," said Diane Holloway
who was hired in October to im plement an anti-drug program developed by former Councilman Al Gonzalez. "Our goals are the
same as (national drug control same as (national drug control
policy director) William Bennett's." Under the plan, the city hopes to reduce alcohol and drug abuse by 10 percent by 1992 and by 50 Holloway is looking for district coordinators who are willing to devote about 20 hours per week to
the work. She said the volunteers will be trained in January by Dallas police and local and state anti-drug abuse agencies.
