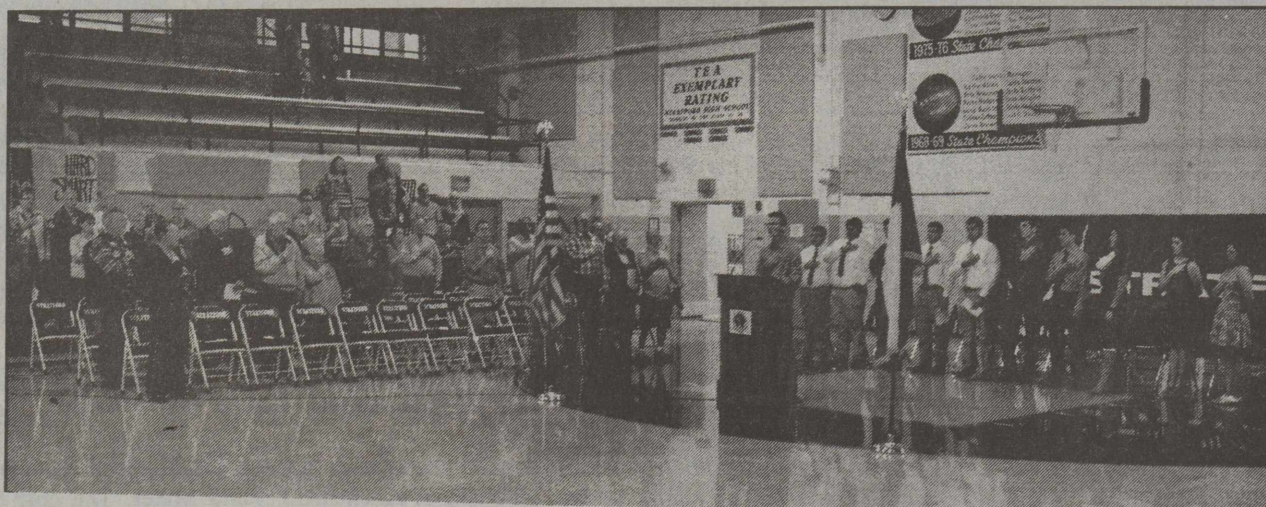

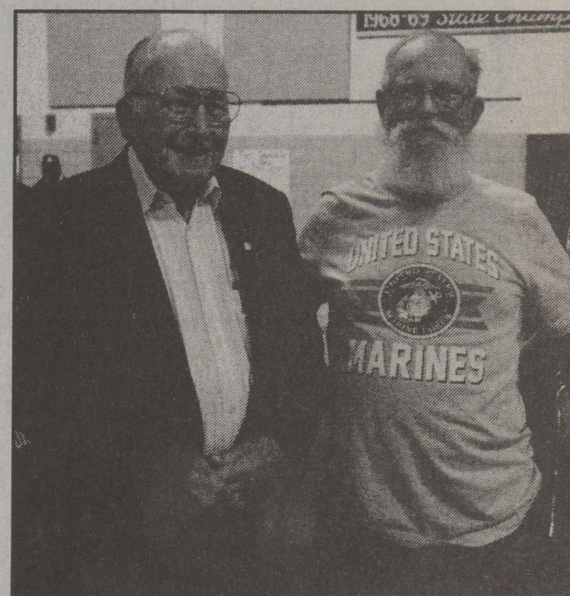

Veteran's Day Program held on Friday, November 11, 2016 At SHS

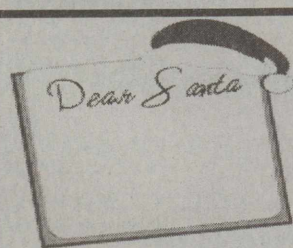

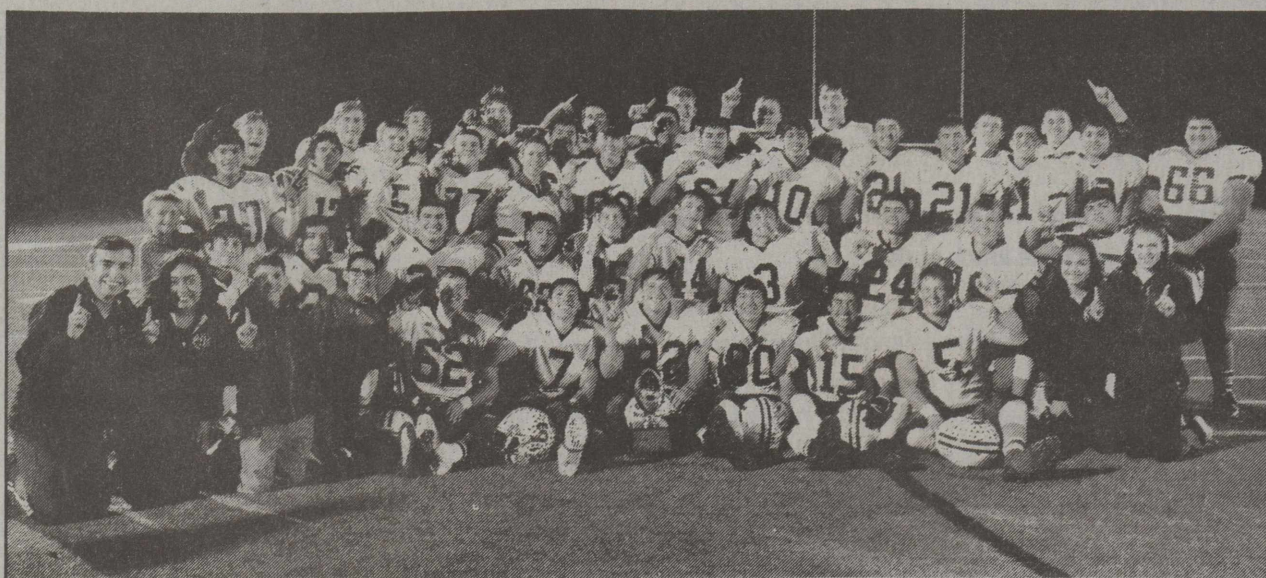

Zimmer Wins Re-Election to NPGCD Board of Directors

Bob Zimmer was re-elected as North Plains Groundwater Conservation District Director of Hutchinson and Hansford Counties last night. Zimmer won election over challenger Derik Grotegut of Gruver by a vote of 798 to 1,011 subject to final canvassing. Zimmer has served as board director since 2004 and is going into his fourth term. From 2014-2016 Zimmer served as president of the board for the third time. Current vice president, Harold Grail, board director for Moore County, will takeover as president when Zimmer's term expires in December of 2017.

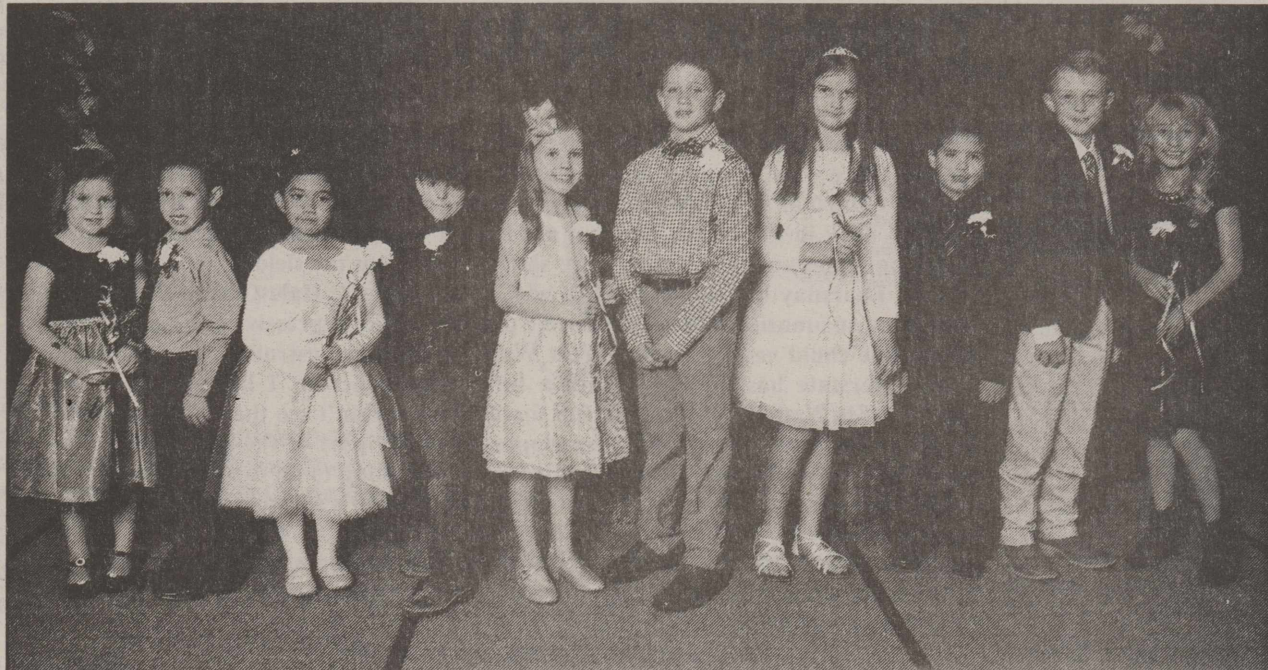

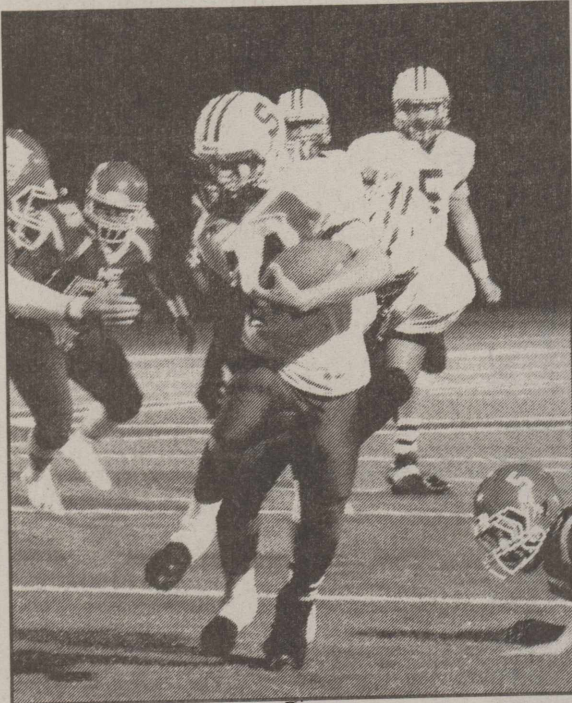

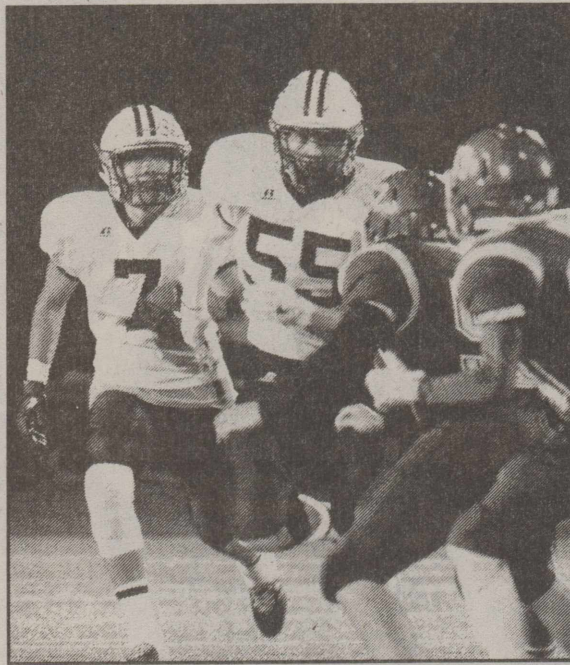

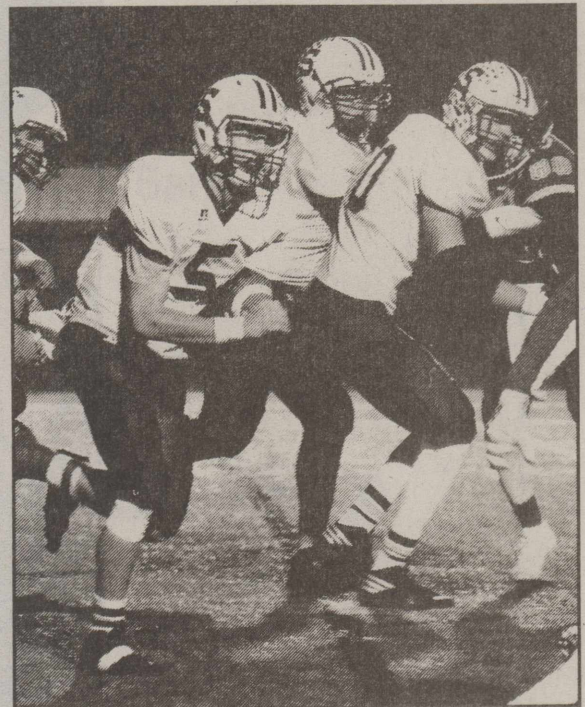

Stratford Elk #44 Bronc Hodges breaks free from Hale Center defense to rack up some yards on the carry.

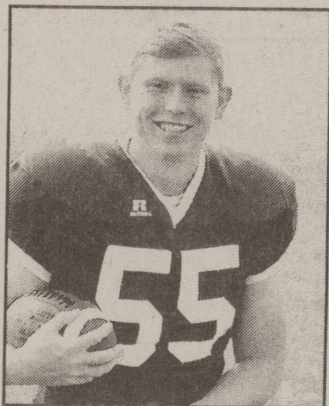


Stratford Elk #7 Fernando Jacquez picks up some yards on the carry behind blocking of Elk #55 Parker Hanna.

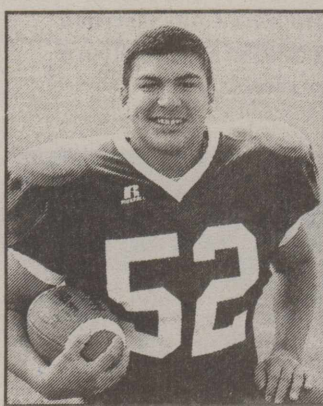


Stratford Elk quarterback #5 Kade McBryde gains some yards on the run in the Elks bi-district win.

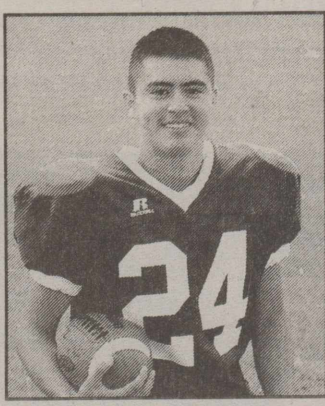

Time Out With Rog!

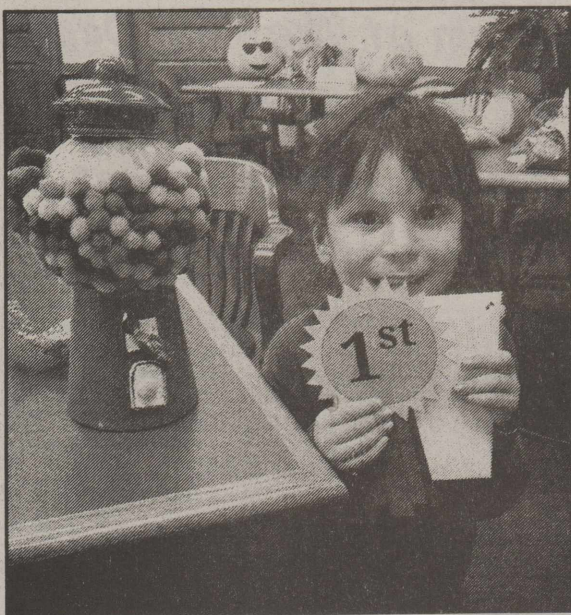
