Time is here once again for Sherman County Soil and Water Conservation District's annual Spring Tree Sale. Order forms are ready and can be picked up at our office at 418 North 4th in Stratford, or we can mail it if you give us a call. We can also email the order form if you supply us with an email address. Just call us or email us at shermswcd@xit.net.

While we try to list as many species that are available for this area, we cannot list them all. If you have any special wants or wishes as far as trees go this year, please call the office at 396-5517 ext. 3 and we will be happy to try and find what you need.

The District can also fill requests for drip irrigation supplies. We keep some drip supplies in stock, and will help in the design of your system and order exactly what is needed for you if we do not have it. Delivery is usually within three working days. You can also help your investment with the installation of weed barrier. We have this available also. This is especially important in windbreaks because we do not want the newly planted seedlings to have to fight with weeds and

grass for water. The barrier will help prevent the growth of weeds and grass and keep the moisture in the ground. If you need a Tree Order Form, want to place an order for trees, irrigation supplies, weed barrier or have questions regarding the trees or planning for your particular needs, please do not hesitate to contact the District or the NRCS at 396-5517 ext. 3.



Santa Visits Lollipop Junction






Lady Elk Shaylee Audrain sinks the three pointer in the win over Fritch.




Stratford J.V. Lady Elk Elizabeth Martinez goes up for the shot in the Lady Elks win over Fritch.


Stratford Elk Shay Hess scores on the fast break.

Please be advised the brown city dumpsters are for normal household trash. The green dumpsters are for grass clippings only. We have seen an increase of unauthorized items being put in the dumpsters. Please review the following sections from the City of Stratford Code of Ordinances;

Winter Prep Advice

(NAPS)-Preparing your house for the seasonal closing of windows and doors can be a smart step toward health and energy

Sec. 13.04.038(b) Duties of owner or occupant

Materials prohibited in brown containers-The following shall not be disposed of in city's brown containers: hazardous waste, liquid waste, used motor oil, used oil filters, lead acid batteries, yard waste (grass clippings, leaves, yard/garden debris, brush), construction/demolition/remodeling debris, lumber, shingles/roofing material, chairs/furniture, mattresses/box springs, waste tires (automotive/implement/truck/tractor), major appliances/fixtures, and dead animals.

Sec. 13.04.041 Dirt, concrete and rocks prohibited in containers

The disposal of dirt, concrete, and rocks in city trash containers is hereby prohibited. (Ordinance 970519, sec. 9, adopted 5/19/97)

Construction materials and shingles must be disposed by the company doing the work. Please inform any contractor that they are not to use the city dumpsters to dispose of any construction material/waste. The city does not accept shingles, batteries, tires or concrete in our dumpsters or at the landfill at any time.
