# **Donelson selected by Texas Bankers Hall of Fame Recognized on April 27th**

B. A. Donelson, of Amarillo, is one of five bankers who was selected by the Texas Bankers Hall of Fame recognized on April 27.

The others include Jack Griggs from Abilene, George Martinez from Houston, Milton S. McGee, Jr., from Henderson, and the late Milton L. Payne from Carthage, as the 2017 Honorees. These prestigious Texas bankers were inducted on April 27, 2017 at the Fifth Annual Texas Bankers Hall of Fame Gala held in the Lowman Student Center Ballroom of Sam Houston State University, Huntsville, Texas.

The Texas Bankers Hall of Fame, established by the Smith-Hutson Endowed Chair of Banking, recognizes outstanding bankers who have made valuable contributions to the banking profession and pioneered the Texas banking industry. The Honorees have truly made their industry, communities and state better places.

B.A. Donelson is a native Texan, born in Stratford, and graduated from Stratford High School. He received a BS in Economics with a minor in Finance from Texas Tech University in 1958 after transferring from Arlington State College.

Donelson returned to Stratford after graduation and began a farming and cattle business. Banking was not in the picture at that time, but life had other plans. In 1967, he was approached by The First State Bank of Stratford to see if banking might interest him as a career. Continuing to farm and ranch, he became a banker. The goal when he began was to become the President and owner of the bank It took 18 years before the bank came for sale and the opportunity arose. Only with the help of other investors was this goal realized. In 1985, the Stratford Bancshares group was able to purchase the bank from JA Whittenburg, III. This group later purchased North Plains Savings and Loan with offices in Dalhart, Dumas and Stratford.

Once his career in banking began, civic involvement became a large part of his career.
