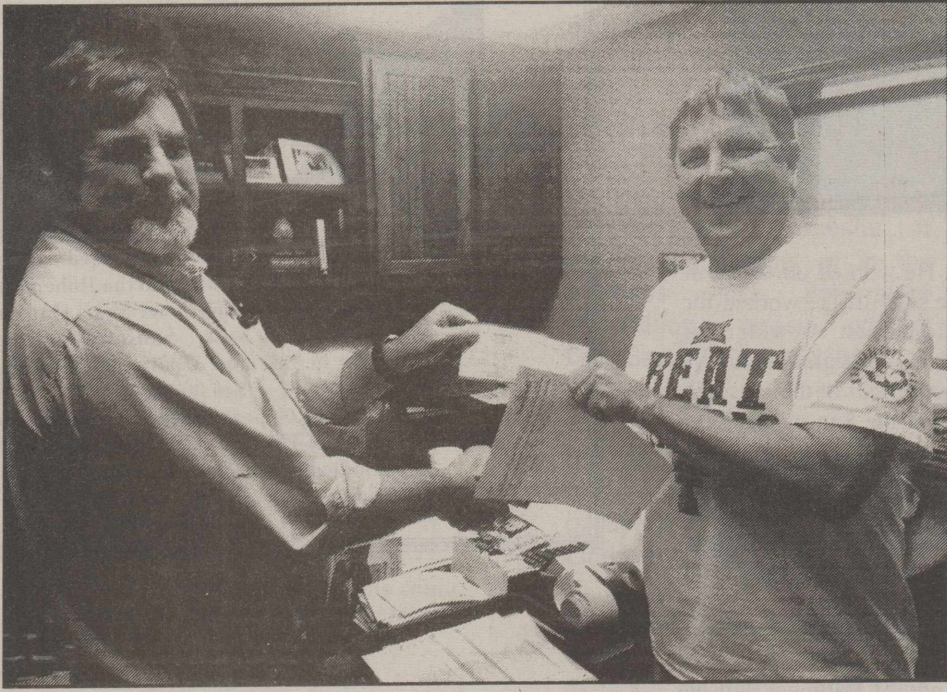

How special are trees on the Plains? We missed the devastating ice storm but not the April snow that damaged our trees.

How did some of these trees come to be? The trees in the City Park were planted by Hose Flores and watered by water truck by Poe Keeners Dad. Take care of a Siberian Elms and they will make a great shade and even if neglected they will hang on. All of the trees in the Parks were planted by organizations and individuals with the City furnishing the water.

I don't know who planted the elm trees in the cemetery but I am sure they were hand watered as the city has furnished the water only in the last 20-30 years. This past spring about seven trees have been lost; 4, 10 years old; 2, 5 years old; 1, 30 year old Crabapple and 2 6070 year old pines, and those break my heart. Mass tree planting came from gift by Ronnie Pickens, General Store and later A.J. Eagle Scout Project and recently Modern Woodman. The Memorial area was a donation and is maintained by George Harding (thank you) my thought, you plant it, you take care of it, hasn't worked out very well.

The Cemetery trees (not the grass) are watered about once a month by John & Lois Hussman and me. (Please leave the water hose and sprinklers by the faucet) They are kept trimmed cost shared by city and private donations. An effort is made to place a memorial stone on all unmarked graves. If you know of unmarked graves needing a stone, please contact me. There are also some markers not complete with date of death. The American Legion should be notified of graves needing a Veterans marker.

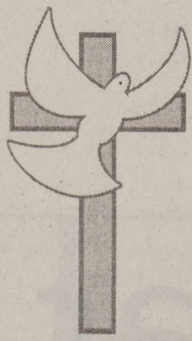

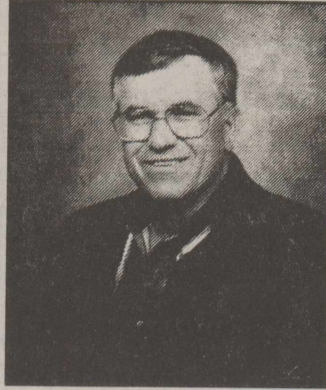


Obituaries

Sandy Tillery February 9, 1946-June 17, 2017

Ronald Justin "Sandy" Tillery, 71 of Stratford, passed away on Saturday, June 17, 2017. Funeral Services were held at 10 o'clock in the morning on Tuesday, June 20, 2017 at First United Methodist Church, with Rev. Steve Ulrey, officiating. Interment followed at Stratford Cemetery. Arrangements were entrusted to Morrison Funeral Directors of Stratford.

Sandy was born in Amarillo, Texas in 1946, to H.R. (Rex) and Mozelle (Brannon) Tillery. He attended school in Stratford and graduated in 1964 before attending Clarendon Junior College and then enlisting in the U.S. Army in 1966. Tillery served tours of duty in Ft. Hood Texas, Schofield Barracks in Hawaii, and in Vietnam with the 11th Brigade. In 1969, he was awarded the Bronze Star for Meritorious Achievement in Ground Operations against Hostile Forces While in the Army; he served as Military Police with rank of Sergeant.



After serving his country, Sandy returned to family, friends and home in Sherman County. He worked on the farm with his dad and brothers and later farmed on Dyess land south of town. After the farms were sold off, he worked for several area businesses, all in the agriculture field. He continued truck driving through the 2016 harvest. As with most farm grown kids, Sandy was a jack of all trades and loved to share his knowledge with friends, kids and grandkids.

He was a lifetime member of the First United Methodist Church of Stratford. Sandy was a Past Master of the Masonic Lodge #874. He was an avid supporter of the Stratford Elks and in 2011 he proudly accepted the Fan of the Year Award from Stratford High School. He has also served as Sherman County Commissioner.

He married his high school sweetheart, Ellen Dyess in Stratford on June 12, 1965. Ellen and Sandy raised three daughters. He took great pride in all the accomplishments of his kids but was especially proud of his grandkids and their athletic accolades. The Tillerys were also blessed with lifelong friends who, in younger days, spent time together on the lake and the ski slopes and in later years traveled and shared stories at coffee shop. Sandy also loved his faithful dog Chrissy.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Rex and Mozelle Tillery; a brother: Greg Tillery and granddaughter: Taylor Dyess Bowman.

Sandy is survived by his wife of 52 years; his daughters: Roxan Bowman and husband Cody of Ballinger, Trisha Keener and husband Mark, and Kendra Mungia and husband Bryan all of Stratford. He is also survived by grandkids: Ashley, Tyler, Clinton, Kelsie, Justin, Reed, Sterling, Kaylee, Rett, Madison, Sydney, and Reese. 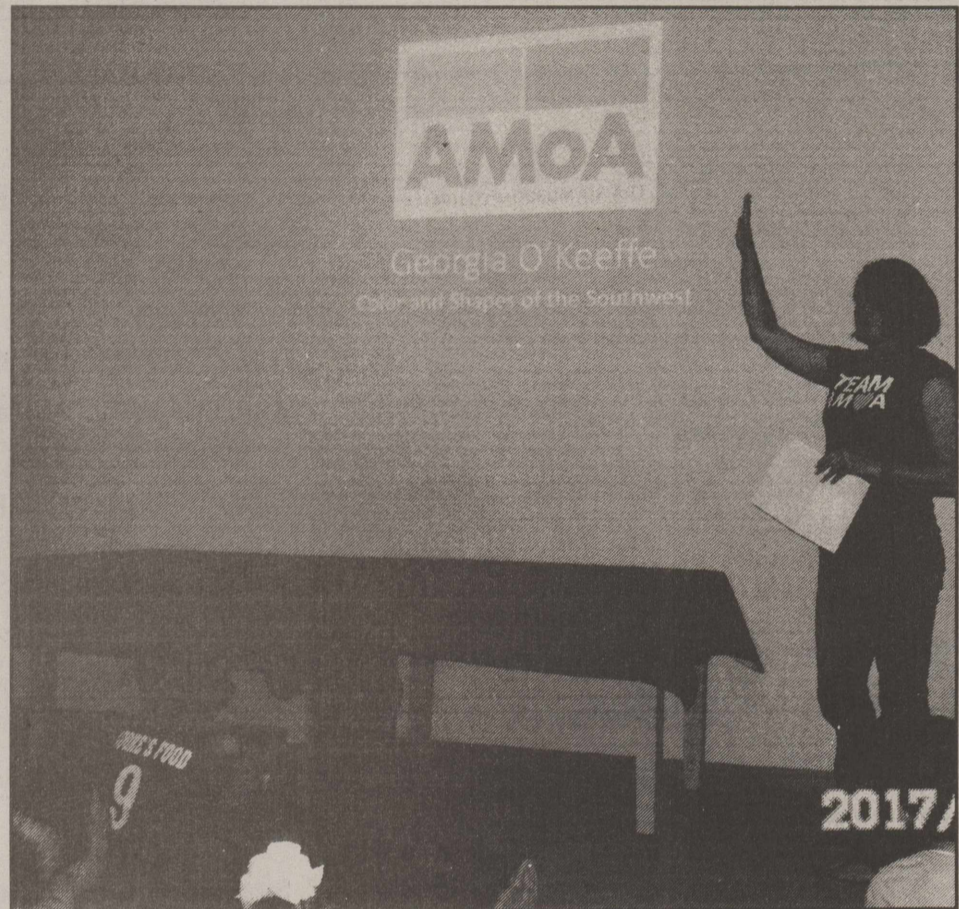
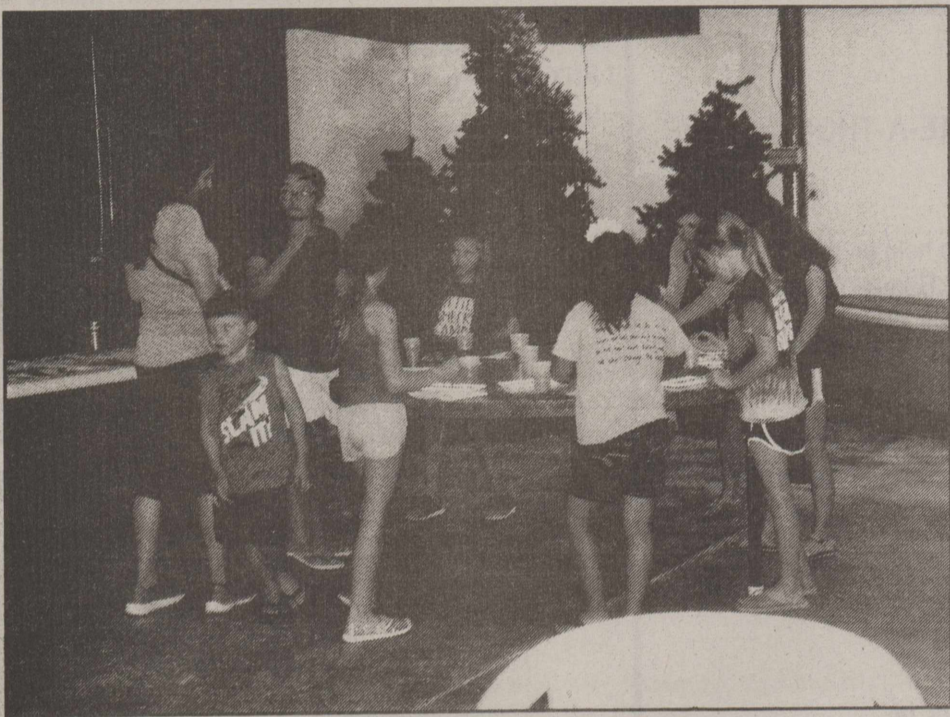

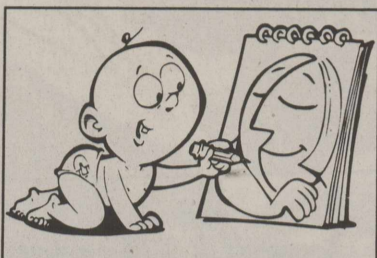

Your Yard

Gardening Tool Care

(NAPS)—Before diving into yard care, make sure your lawn and gardening tools are up to the task with proper maintenance. The tips below could save you money and time by extending the life of your tools.

Hand Tool Maintenance

To protect your investment in quality hand and gardening tools, clean them after each use, removing any dirt and debris. Then, wash and dry them, and lightly rub rusted areas with fine sandpaper.



How does your garden grow? It could grow even better if you're smart about keeping your tools sharp and in good shape.

Pruning shears should be placed in a bucket with water and scrubbed with a wire brush until the metal is clean after each use. Coat the blades and moving parts with a water displacement lubricant with a controllable spray pattern, such as the non-aerosol WD-40 Multi-Use Product Trigger Pro. Its narrow spray pattern will give you more control, eliminating overspray for less mess, while preventing rust from building up and helping shears open and close smoothly.

Sharpening Tools

To sharpen them, tighten the pivot nut and file the edge of the pruning blade following the factory-cut bevel in single strokes until fresh steel is exposed.

Power Equipment Maintenance

Check your power tools carefully for worn parts that may need replacement, and for loose screws, nuts or bolts. To stay in good condition, lawn mowers need yearly tune-ups. 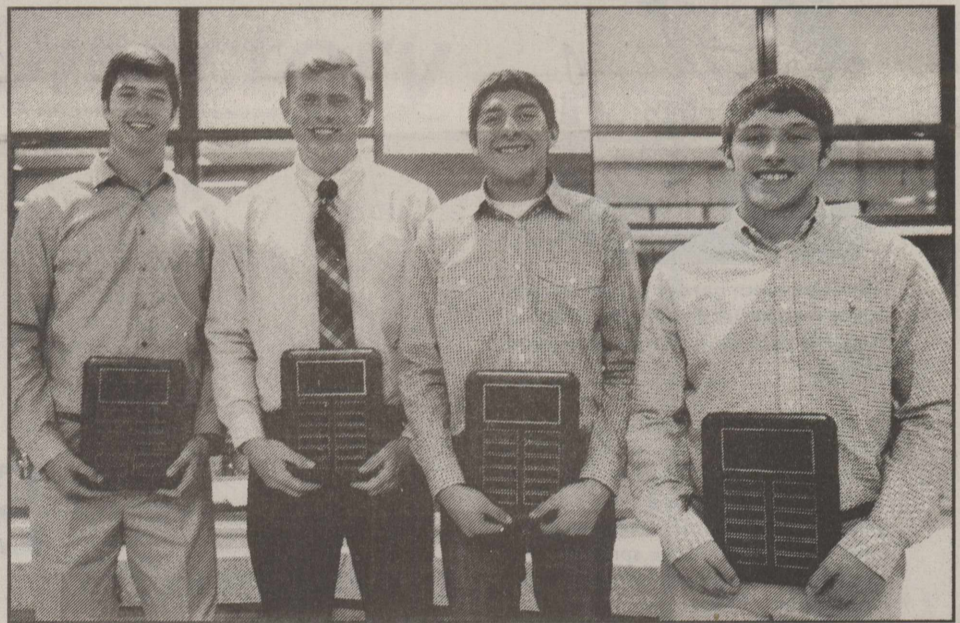

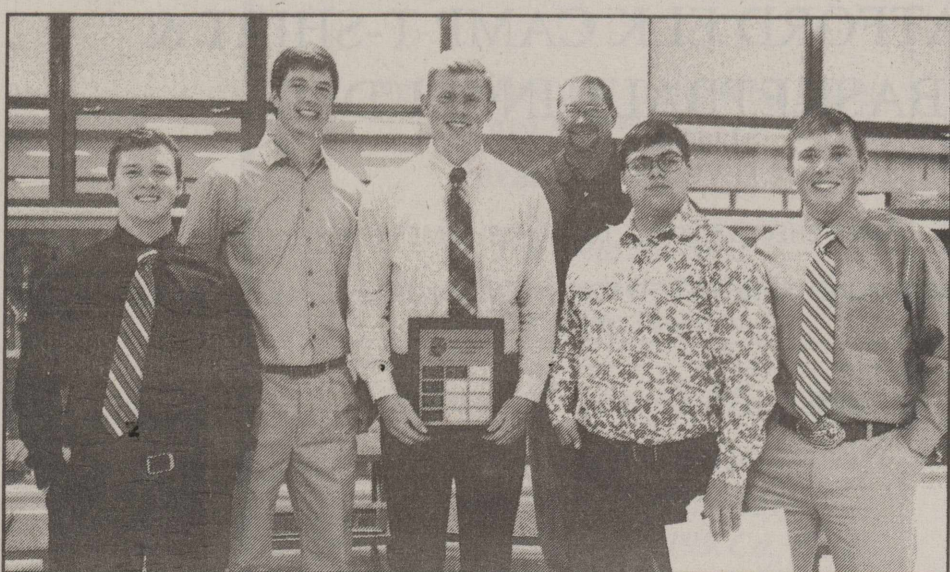
