Shooting in Stratford.

On February 21st, at approximately 7:30 p.m., the Stratford Police Department requested the assistance of the Texas Rangers to investigate an officer involved shooting that occurred in Stratford, Texas. A Stratford Policer officer identified a stolen vehicle traveling eastbound on US-54. A traffic stop on the stolen vehicle ensued at a convenience store in Stratford. During the process of arresting the occupants of the stolen vehicle, both of the arresting officers fired their service weapons striking the driver. The 22-year old male driver died as a result of his injuries. The 24 year old male passenger was arrested without incident and booked into the Sherman County jail. The deceased driver was identified as 22-year old Darion Baker, of Memphis, Tennessee. The passenger was identified as 24 year old Gregory Dees, also of Memphis, Tennessee. Dees was charged with unauthorized use of a motor vehicle by the Stratford Police Department. The Texas Rangers continue to investigate the shooting. 2018 TREE SALE **REMINDER - DEADLINE MARCH 9, 2018**


Time is here once again for Sherman County Soil and Water Conservation District's annual Spring Tree Sale. Order forms are ready and can be picked up at our office - 418 North 4th in Stratford.

While we try to list as many species that are available for this area, we cannot list them all. If you have any special wants or wishes as far as trees go this year, please call the office and we will be happy to try and find what you need.

The District can also fill requests for drip irrigation supplies. We keep some drip supplies in stock, and will help in the design of your system and order exactly what is needed for you if we do not have it. Delivery is usually within three working days. You can also help your investment with the installation of weed barrier. We have this available also. This is especially important in windbreaks because we do not want the newly planted seedlings to have to fight with weeds and grass for water. The barrier will help prevent the growth of weeds and grass and keep the moisture in the ground.

If you need a Tree Order Form, want to place an order for trees, irrigation supplies, weed barrier or have questions regarding the trees or planning for your particular needs, please do not hesitate to contact the District or the NRCS at 396-2211 ext. 3. or email us at shermswcd@xit.net.



67th Annual XIT Rural Telephone Membership Meeting Announced

The 67th Annual Membership meeting of XIT Rural Telephone Cooperative Inc. will be conducted on Wednesday, March 14, 2018. The meeting will be held at the Rita Blanca Lake Coliseum in Dalhart. Registration for rural members (customers whose landline telephone numbers begin with a prefix of 343, 362, 377, 384, 727, 753 and 769) and guests who receive an invitation from XIT Rural Telephone Cooperative, Inc., will begin at ll:00 a.m., and a luncheon catered by The 10 in Texas Woodfire Grill in Dalhart will begin at noon. The sit-down lunch will again be served by XIT's management and employees.

The recipients of the 2018 XIT Rural Telephone Educational Program will be announced. This is the nineteenth year that XIT has offered the program to graduating high school seniors of our rural members. Seven area seniors have been chosen this year to each receive scholarships.

The business session will begin at 1:00 p.m. The business meeting will conclude with the election of directors and the drawing of door prizes.

Approximately \$4,000 worth of door prizes will be given away to members. There will be six grand prizes awarded: 1 - \$500 cash prize and 3 - \$300 cash prizes and 2 - \$100 cash prizes. There will also be a kids' drawing. This is for members' children or grandchildren who are 0-12 years of age. Members are reminded that they must be present to win prizes.

The purpose of the annual meeting is to elect directors, to present for approval the financial reports for the previous fiscal year, and to transact any other business that needs to be brought up during the meeting.

According to the bylaws, a written notice must be mailed from XIT Rural Telephone not less than ten days, nor more than twenty days, before the meeting. The notice was mailed to all active members of the Cooperative on February 23, 2018.

A quorum must be present in order for the business meeting to convene. Based upon the total number of the Cooperative's members, fifty members or two percent of the members attending, whichever is larger, constitutes a quorum.

Current officers and board members include: J.W. McClellan, President; Walter E. Lasley, Vice President; Gary Finch, Secretary-Treasurer; Marcia French, Nick Olson, Steve Baskin, Gared McBryde, Barry Poling and Larry Kemp.

On February 1, 2018, Nominating Committee members consisting of Sharon Taylor, Mike Diller, Jeremy Lenz, Charles Trayler, Jack Haile and Brent Spurlock met to submit nominations for three director positions. Jeremy Lenz was selected as chairman of the Nominating Committee. Nominations for the following districts were: District I, Dallam County – Barry Poling, District II, Hartley County – Gary Finch, and District III, Sherman County – Steve Baskin.

Members can vote only for nominees from the district in which they reside, or the district in which they have telephone service. All members must be present at the annual meeting to vote. No proxy voting is permitted. Either a husband or wife is eligible to vote at the annual meeting, but there is only one vote allowed per membership.

Decorations for Santa Fe Trail

Legacy Passes Mid-way for Walk the Santa Fe Trail

Legacy Assisted Living residents and staff members have passed the mid-point for the 2465 mile trek of the Santa Fe and Camino Real Trail system. The walk started from Independence, Missouri on January 8th. This past week, ending on February 16th, the group had traveled 1,202.76 miles. The Susan Magoffin staff team is leading the contest with 1,077.33 miles, and the Kit Carson resident team has 125.43 miles. The contest will end March 29th. What does all of these miles really mean as to a location on the map? "Officially" the group is now 9 miles south of Juarez, Mexico, and heading to the goal of Mexico City, Mexico.

Legacy common areas have now been decorated to show different aspects of life along the trail. One display is of items that could have been used in their chuck wagon. A display of items that represent Mexico City is in the dining room. Santa Fe, Mexico, has two displays: one of the Catholic mission influence and one of native Indian artifacts. A display of typical cowboy dress items are on one wall. The living room bookcases and the mantle show western items and art pieces (including 2 Kenneth Wyatt western art prints). Along one wall of the living room is a display of Trail Treasures – items that could have been found along the trail (such as devil's claw) or items that were left along the trail (such as broken wagon wheels). There is even a small display of items that could be used for laundry! Legacy staff members contributed these display items as well as borrowed them from friends and family. Legacy invites the public to visit and see the displays. These items will be on display until mid-April.




Morillon & Wells Advancing to State

The first of two road trips is scheduled for Tuesday, February 27th. This trip will be to Boise City, Oklahoma, and to Clayton, New Mexico, to see the artifacts at their museums and to view the landmarks and wagon ruts in the landscape. This will be a wonderful trip revealing local history that can be tied to a period of national expansion of trade and culture. Many residents have lived in this area for their whole lives and have never seen these historical treasures. The second trip will be to Elkhart, Kansas, in March.

Walk the Santa Fe Trail has been informative and fun. The Texas Cooperative Agri-Extension office has been providing Walk & Talk educational programs about topics such as the food availability on the trail, health issues, water issues, and native American/Mexican foods. Upcoming topics include dried meat (jerky), gazpacho, pico de gallo, Mexican Hobo meal, and Mexican torta (sandwich). An average of 10 residents have been attending these sessions.

The group will continue their trip and will celebrate on their arrival in Mexico City, hopefully by the end of March. Thank you to everyone who contributed display items for this project. Legacy Assisted Living is located in Dalhart, Texas.






