> *Use a sunscreeen with a Sun Protection Factor (SPF) of at least 15 duing all outdoor activities. Avoid Sunburn altogether.


*Avoid direct exposure to the sun between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. If you go outdoors, wear a hat and protective clothing.
