





Children are the fastest growing segment of our population living in poverty. Something has to be done to improve the physical mental, educational and economic educational conditions facing children. We want more for our nation's youth than just to survive, they should thrive in a healthy nurturing environment.

Every parent, grandparent, aunt and uncle, cousin, community leader and everyone concerned about children should take a closer look at the records, the words and actions of all candidates as they relate to family issues. We should not be deceived by candidates kissing babies and visiting schools. We should examine each candidates platform, not their rhetoric.

The PTA wants our national, state and local leaders to put children FIRST. That means before bailing out another insolvent corporation, before sending troops to a foreign land, and before developing another offensive weapon. Fall Freeze Injury & How

Winter injury to trees in Texas Such subfreezing. temperature changes frequently occur in the fall before plants have a chance to become acclimated to low temperature. This occurred in the fall of 1991. As a result hundreds of trees were killed in Indirectly many trees were placed in a stressful situation and then invaded by fungi. This resulted in additional tree loss. In some cases have been slow to develop and are smaller in size.

Practices that encourage succulent growth in the fall will increase a tree's chance of being damaged by an early freeze. Fall
