rules are expected to be formally adopted by the Department of Insurance and put in place later
this summer. his summer.
"We are implementing these
rules early in the spirit of the rules early in the spirit of the
compromise and in the interest of compromise and in the interest of
our policyolders and the public," our policyholders and the public,"
said Hageman. "Serving their
interests is our top priority" Farmers officials said th proposed rules are consistent with
he Company's underwriting philosophy and protect policyholders from having their
auto policies cancelled due auto policies cancelled due to
"not-at-fault accidents or weather-

important in light of the recent North Texas hailstorm," said
