## Food Preservation Update June 19th

Dr. Peggy Van Laanen, Extension Nutrition Specialist, will be in Stratford Friday, June 19th presenting a Food Preservation Update program. The program will be 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. in the meeting room of the County Extension Office.

Dr. Van Laanen will be discussing the most recent food preservation techniques recommended USDA, evaluation of commercial food preservation products available in the market place, signs of spoilage in preserved foods, and research and techniques on preserving gourmet foods at home.

In addition, pressure canner testing will be available at the session for individuals who would like to have dial gauge canners tested for accuracy and safety. Individuals who suspect spoilage in home preserved goods are encouraged to bring those items for evaluation.

### **Banking School** Holds Commencement for 1992 Graduates

Dallas, June 5, 1992. The Southwestern Graduate School of Banking (SWGSB) at Southern Methodist University completed its thirty-fifth session June 5, with the graduation of 145 students.
