Stratford next month to work on
the intersection of Hwy 287 and

the crossing with concrete instead
of asphalt. This will stabilize the roadbed. and all stabilize the

with $5,644,133$ in 1991 .

"The six percent increase in fed last year's percentage," said Dav Kgupnick, SPS manager of

Other good indicators from the survey are the increases in one time total capacity, from $2,904,585$
to $2,944,575$ and the increase in to $2,944,575$ and the increase in
the number of cattle slaughtered at the 12 beef packing plants in the Krupnick
Several packing pointed out that just outside the service area. "That accounts for the difference between the number of cattle slaughtered and the number fed," he said.
