With the route pretty well firmed up the only detour that [3] might occur would be due to road repair or the conditions of roads, bridges, or the weather conditions. 

Later in the meeting, the need for savings and the option to utilize the existing facilities at Texline were dismissed as valid reasons for consolidating the two Grasslands. 


