## NEWS **USDA Announces 1994 Wheat Program Provisions**

Secretary of Agriculture Mike Espy today announced a required zero percent acreage reduction program for the 1994 wheat crop. This level was chosen from the "Letting wheat growers produce is important in keeping U.S. Wheat moving in the world market place," Espy said. "We are committed to being competitive on the domestic production side and on the export sales side through the use of the Export Enhancement Program other available export and promotion programs. "Let there be no doubt that the United States will continue to be a reliable supplier of wheat to both our domestic and foreign consumers."
