## Senator Bivins Visits Stratford

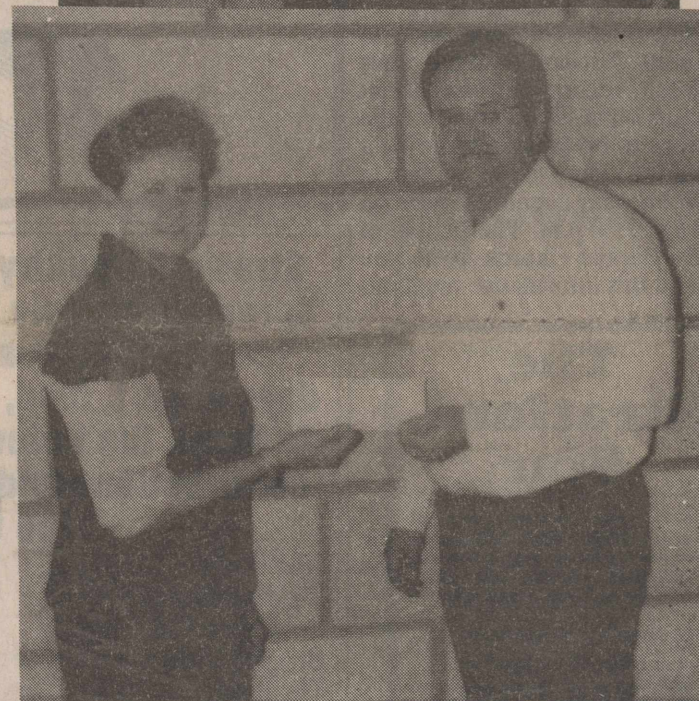
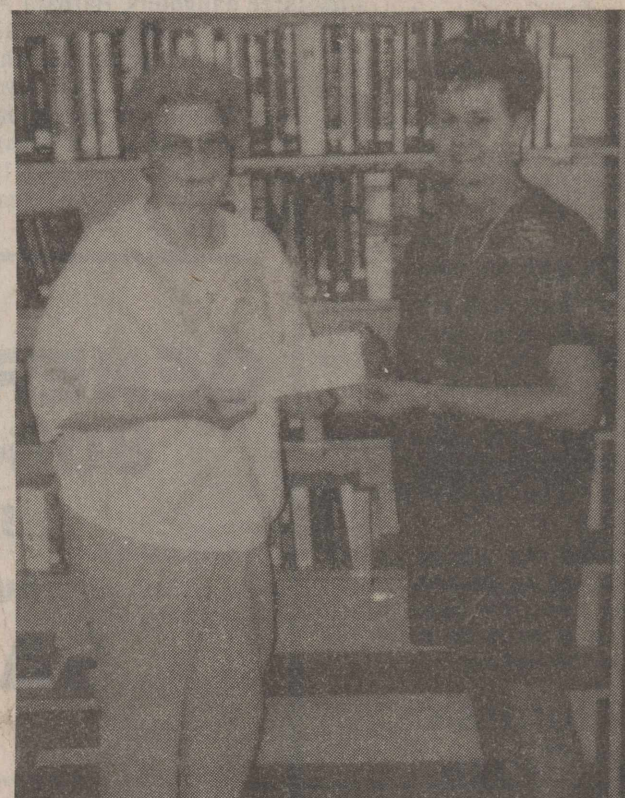

**SAFE PLACE Receives Grant**

SAFE PLACE, INC. has received a Victim of Crime Act grant in the amount of \$40,000 for the 1994 fiscal year (July 1, 1993 to June 30, 1994). This grant requires local community support of at least 5,200 volunteer hours and a cash donation match of at least \$3,750.00. This funding is a federal grant to continue the Crime Victims Assistance Program implemented through a grant program administered by the Criminal Justice Division of the Governor's office.

This money is to help provide services and assistance for victims of domestic violence in Moore, Dallam, Sherman and Hartley counties. SAFE PLACE provides emergency shelter, crisis hotline, counseling, criminal justice advocacy, assistance in obtaining housing, employment, clothing and food, as well as referrals to other sources for various forms of assistance. SAFE PLACE now also provides these services to victims of sexual assault in the same four-county area.

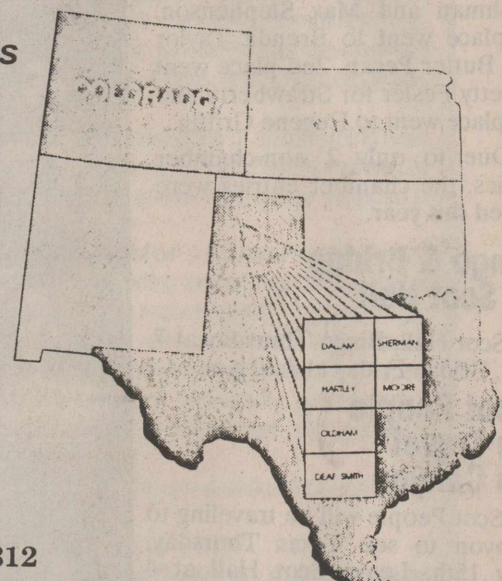

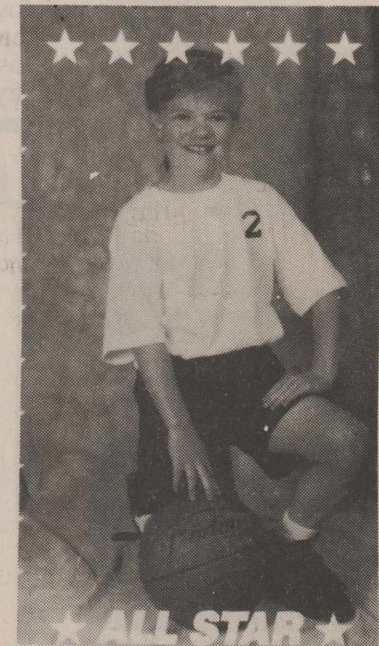

July 6 Hank Rogers attended the funeral of his cousin, Floyd Garner, in Amarillo.

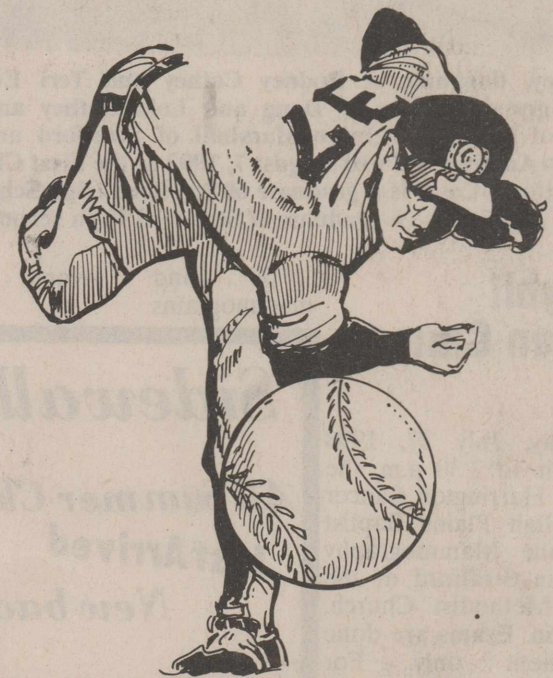

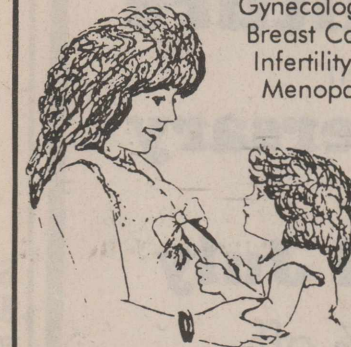

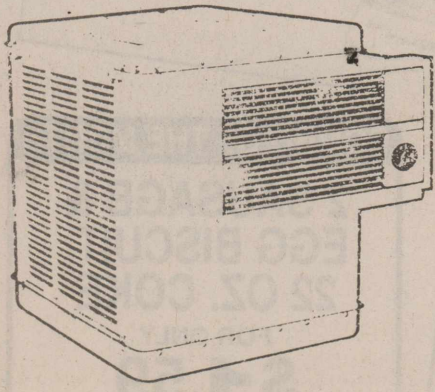

The total cost of the screening is \$70.00. This includes the x-ray, physical breast exam, and the radiology fee for reading the mammogram. Funding has been provided by the Texas Department of Health to allow for free breast screenings for women who qualify.

The major goal of the clinic is the early detection of breast cancer. The clinic provides low cost screening which includes a breast exam by a Registered Nurse trained in breast cancer detection, teaching of breast self examination, and a mammogram. Currently, the most effective method known to win the battle against breast cancer is early detection. Early detection is best done by following the guidelines recommended by the American Cancer Society for breast cancer screening for women who have no signs or symptoms of breast cancer. The guidelines are:

1. Learn and perform breast self examination every month.
2. Have a physical examination every year.
3. Have a mammogram according to recommendations by age:
  - Age 40-one baseline mammogram
  - 40-49 A mammogram every 1 to 2 years

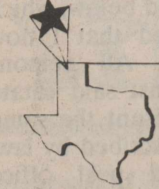

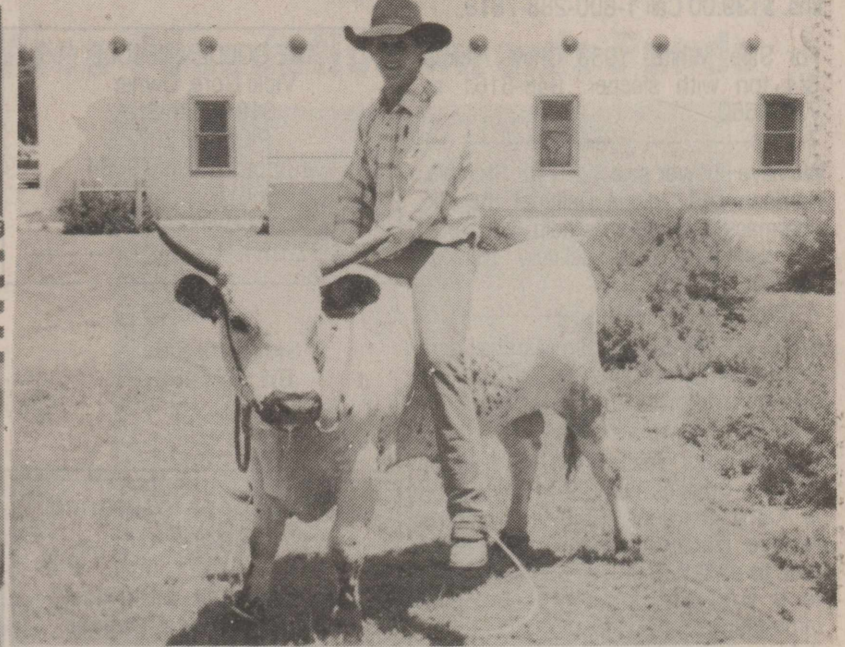
importantly, be reasonably priced. A "Senior Citizen Community" would meet these needs and more.

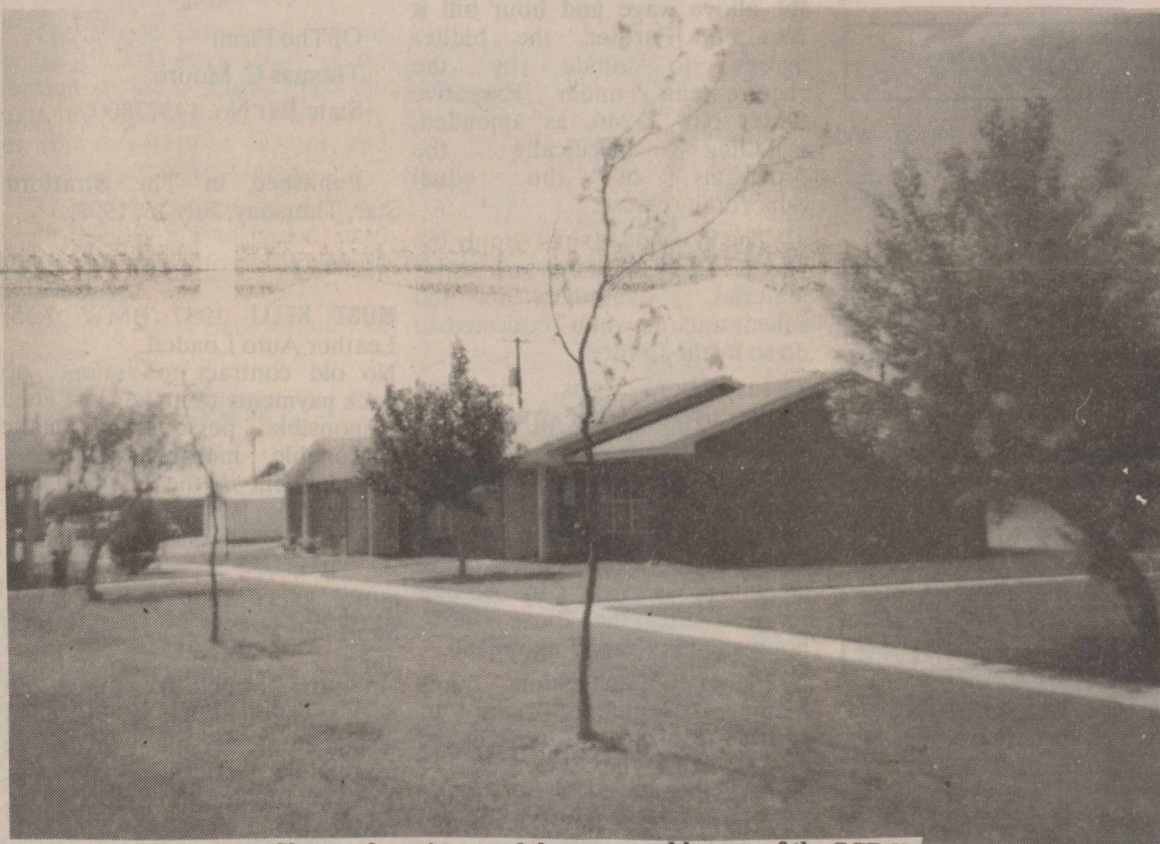

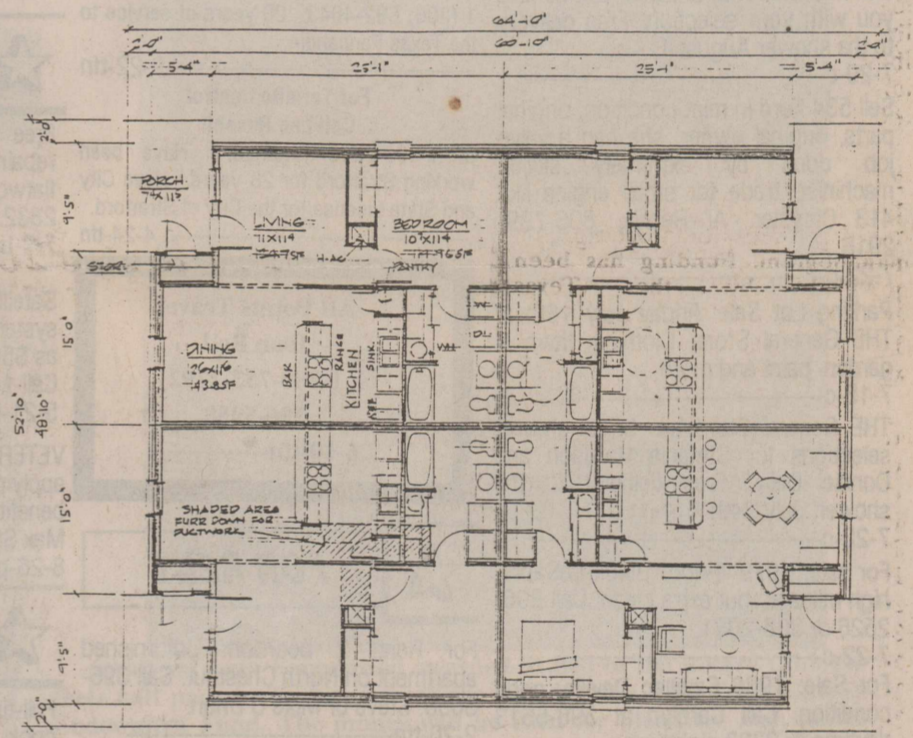

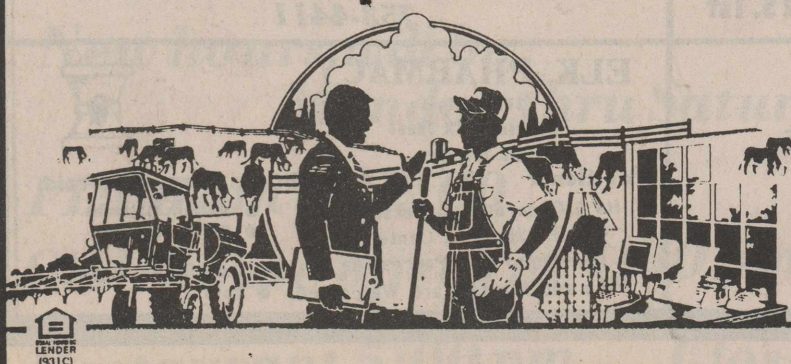
