Memorial **Assistance For** Independent Living

Moore County Hospital District established a program over a year ago that does just that, according more details about his annual event sponsored by the Sherman to Steve Langley, the director of the program. Assistance for Independent Living provides high quality, low-cost services to help older people remain in their own homes, and to ease the burden of care on their families. The program is also available to the disabled person.

"As the name of the program indicates, this unique service was designed to assist people in whatever way necessary to help them stay in their own homes, living independently as long as possible," Langley said. "There are several reasons why this is such a vital service. The most important reason is that the elderly and disabled person is usually more content and happy when he or she is able to take care of personal needs without becoming a burden to the family.

"Another reason is that this program makes economic sense. As long as the person can live safely and securely in his or her own home, the family does not have to worry about paying for nursing home care," Langley said.

Memorial Assistance for Independent Living offers a variety of services, including personal care, such as assistance with bathing; housecleaning; transportation; home repairs; grocery shopping; and running other errands. The program will arrange plumbing and electrical repairs, build wheelchair ramps, install bathroom grab-bars, and smoke alarms. "Our aim is to help make the person's home as safe and as comfortable as possible," Langley said. The care is provided by specially trained Homemaker Aides and by volunteers.

"Many of our clients and their families have found that our care coordination service is extremely helpful," Langley said. "We work in the community's care system every day, so we know exactly what agencies to contact and what their eligibility requirements are. We make the correct referrals to other services, and help our clients access the care they need."

When a person enrolls in the program, the director of the program or his representative will perform a thorough assessment of the situation. After consulting with the client and the family, the director will develop a complete service plan to meet the client's

"Volunteers are very important to our program. This is an excellent project for a church group or for individual volunteers. volunteers can immediately how needed their services are, and they feel a deep sense of accomplishment," he said. "At this time of the year, we are concerned with helping our clients weatherize their homes and to make needed home repairs before cold weather." Langley said that anyone who wishes to volunteer should call him at 935-4932 or 935-

Even though someone might escape repeated victimization by getting a divorce, should the perpetrator of a criminal act escape punishment? And if the crime is not identified for what it is-a sexual assault- the assailant will not receive the appropriate treatment, counseling, or incarceration necessary to prevent the victimization of future victims.





Finney Returns




