## School **Begins** Friday Sept. 1

School days will begin again with students reporting for a full days class schedule on Friday, September 1 from 8:30 a.m. to 3:45 p.m. The kindergarten classes will run a regular schedule. The morning kindergarten class will meet from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and the afternoon kindergarten classes will run from 12:30 p.m. to 3:35 p.m.

All busses will run at the regular time on the same schedule and routes as the end of last year. Lunch will be served in the cafeteria.
