This procedure is designed to eliminate duplication of efforts by the inspectors. Office hours at the area office are 8 a. m. to 5 p. m. Monday thru Friday, at 8 a. m. to 12 noon on Saturday.

For swine being sold at Eastland and Abilene Auction on Tuesday, a call before Saturday noon to the area office will insure the producer an inspection on Monday. Those selling swine at Ranger on Thursday should call in Tuesday by 5 p. m.

In case of sick hogs suspected of cholera, the Federal Veterinarian (817-559-2244) should be contacted. Ask for Federal Vet. at this number and if he is not available at that moment, leave message with motel operator to call back.

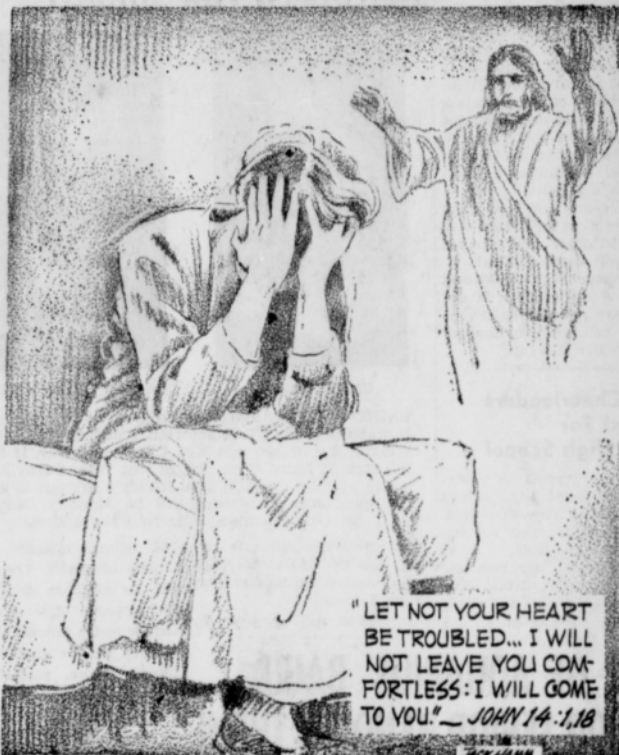

DID CHRIST DIE IN VAIN?

In last week's article we discussed "Why Christ Died." We learned from the scriptures that it was because of our sins and so that God could pardon man's sins and still be just.

In this article we raise the question of whether Christ died in vain.

He died in vain if He was not raised from the dead. Paul said, "And if Christ be not raised, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is vain also." (1 Cor. 15:14) "If Christ be not raised, your faith is vain; ye are yet in your sins." (1 Cor. 15:17) From this point of view His death was not in vain, for Paul declares (and we believe it), "But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the firstfruits of them that slept." (1 Cor. 15:20)

Christ died in vain if man can be saved by keeping the ten commandments. "For if righteousness come by the law, then Christ is dead in vain." (Gal. 2:21) "Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law, being made a curse for us." (Gal. 3:13)

Christ died in vain if man can be saved by being a good moral person. This does not negate the necessity of a Christian's living a pure, upright life, but such a life, within itself, cannot save us. If it could, then Christ need not have died. Calvary is meaningless, if man could be saved by living a good moral life. A good moral man (Acts 10:1-4) had to be told words whereby he could be saved. (Acts 11:14)

Christ died in vain if one can be saved apart from His blood. We "have redemption through His blood, even the forgiveness of sins." (Col. 1:14) We have forgiveness through His blood, but when? "Arise, and be baptized, and wash away thy sins, calling on the name of the Lord." (Acts 22:16) This verse does not tell us WHAT washes away sins, but WHEN they are washed away. They are washed away by the blood of Christ when we are baptized.

Christ died in vain, if one can be saved outside the church. The Scriptures tell us that Christ purchased the church with His own blood. (Acts 20:28) Paul says, "Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it." (Eph. 5:25) To say that the church is not essential to man's salvation is to say that He died in vain.

If you die lost, then Christ died in vain as far as you are concerned. If you die lost, His suffering and death to save you was all for nothing. In the judgment you will stand before Him who died so that you might live. Will you stand before Him having failed to do what He commands you to do so that you may be saved?

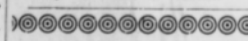

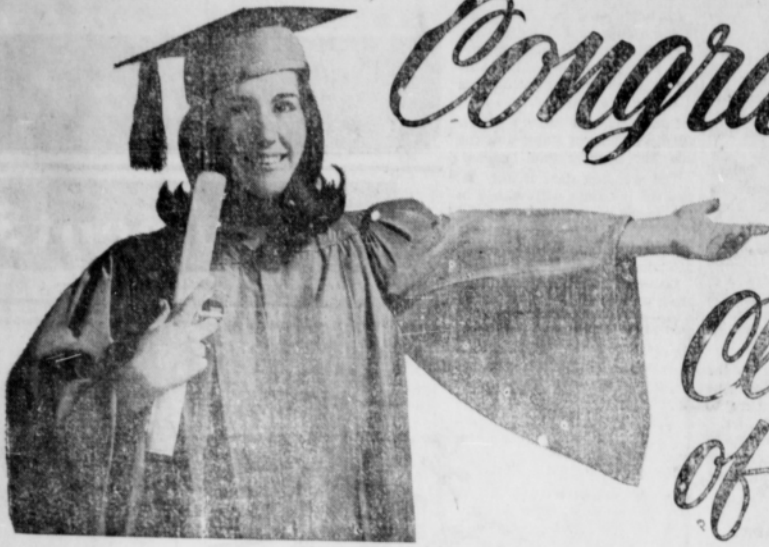

Emergency Conservation Assistance Offered Farmers-Ranchers

WASHINGTON — Congressman Omar Burleson announced today that the U. S. Department of Agriculture is offering emergency conservation assistance in five additional counties in Texas to help repair damage caused by wind erosion and severe drought. The counties are Callahan, Castro, Hockley, Lipscomb and Parmer.

On April 28, 1971, an allocation of \$2 million was made to the Texas Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation (ASC) State Committee for use in sharing with farmers the cost of deep plowing to bring clod forming subsoil to the surface, and measures to reduce soil loss from wind including contour listing, contour chiseling, cross-slope chiseling, and pit

cultivation. The five counties listed above are eligible for aid under this allocation along with the 62 counties named April 29.

Emergency conservation assistance is designed to enable the Secretary of Agriculture to alleviate conditions resulting from a natural disaster and to restore agricultural lands to productive capacity.

Extending the Fire Limits in the City of Baird and permitting Steel Constructed Sheds and Awnings in the Fire Limits of the City of Baird.

At a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Baird held Tuesday, April 27, 1971, at which meeting all members of the Council were present, Alderman Charles Walker presented an ordinance and moved for its adoption. The motion was seconded by J. W. Loper and the vote on the motion was AYES: Walker, Loper, Godfrey, Lane and Warren - NAYES None.

The ordinance is as follows:
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BAIRD, TEXAS:

That the last sentence of Section 1 Fire Limits (Book G. Page 5) be changed from "On the South by First Street and on the North by Fourth Street" to read as follows: "On the South by First Street and on the North by Fifth Street," thereby extending the existing Fire Limits one block North."

And that Section 3. Construction Required Within The Fire Limits be amended to read "Construction of open sheds and rear awnings to buildings in said Fire Limits be permitted providing they are constructed entirely of metal on steel frame or steel pipes, said sheds and awnings to be supported by pipe at least 3 inches in diameter. Sheds shall not be permitted to be attached to any existing building, but awnings may be attached to the existing buildings.

EFFECTIVE DATE:
The fact that there is now adequate construction requirements within the fire limits, creates an emergency and an imperative public necessity that the rule requiring the reading of ordinances at more than one session or meeting of the City Council be suspended, and such rule is hereby suspended by the emergency aforesaid, and it is accordingly ordered that ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately after its adoption, approval and publication thereof.
