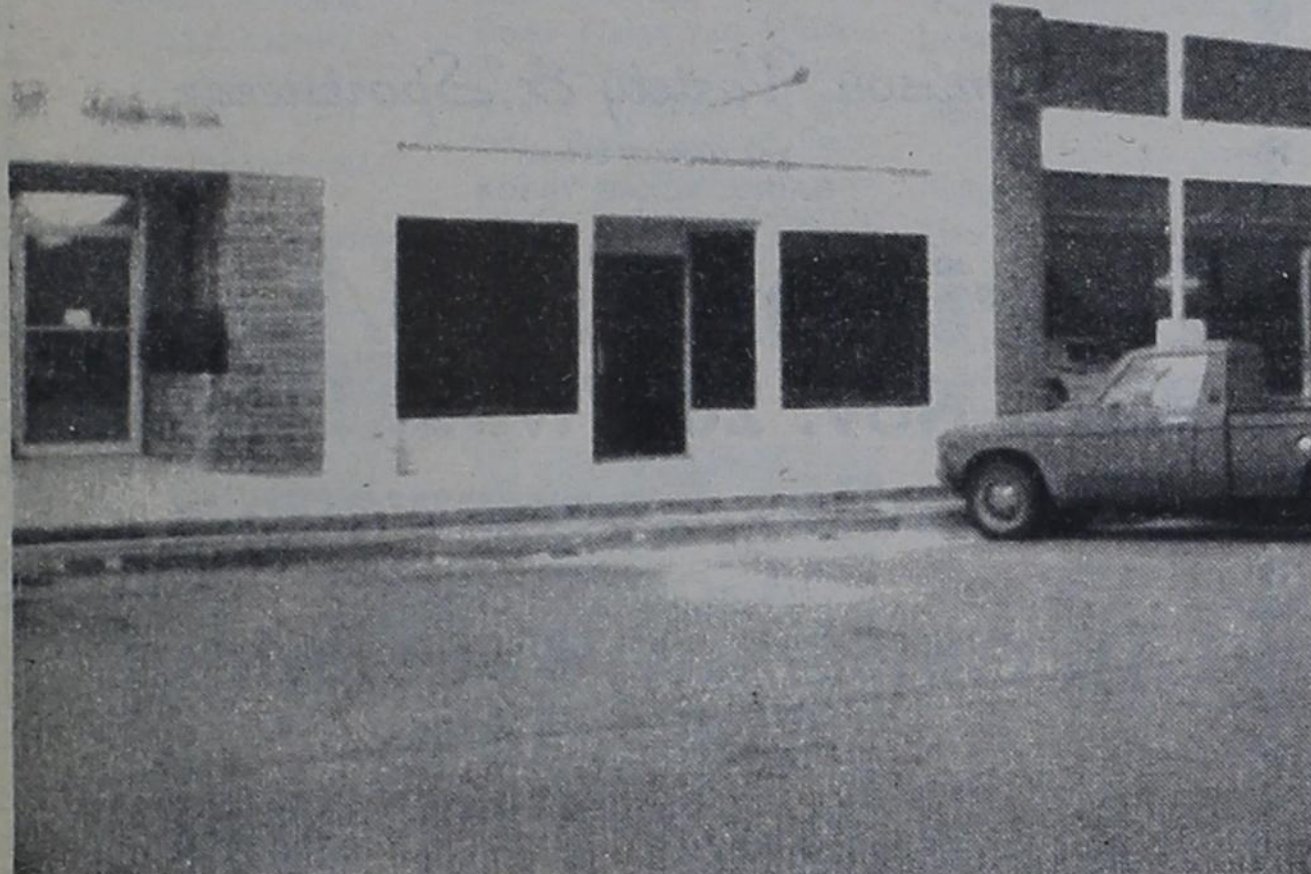


13 Baird Bears Elected To 1980 All-District Team

District 8 AA coaches met Wed. night, Nov. 19, to select the 1980 all district football teams. Baird and Hamlin dominated the team with 13 selections each. Rotan put 10 on the elite team, followed closely by Jim Ned with 9.

Greg Austin, Baird's excellent running-back was chosen to unanimous 1st team position. Austin was one of the premier backs in the Big Country this season. Follow senior Lucky Walker was selected 1st team for his outstanding line play from his center position. Junior muscle man, Ricky Defosses was honored by being selected to the 1st team on both offense and defense. Senior linebacker Alan Bohannon was selected 1st team on defense to round out his career at Baird High. Also selected 1st team was Junior sensation, Sid Grant at his defensive secondary position. Lone Star Gas Files For Rate Increase In Baird

Lone Star Gas Co. Manager, R.W. McKennon, filed an application for a rate increase which would raise the average residential customer's monthly bill in Baird about \$2.28 in the winter and \$.28 in the summer.

Based on Lone Star's rate application, a residential customer who uses an average of eight thousand cubic feet of gas a month paid \$22.26 for gas service in the winter. Under the requested rate, that same customer would pay \$24.54.

Commercial gas customers' rates would also increase under the requested rate schedule.

"Our customers are accustomed to dependable natural gas service," says McKennon. "This rate increase is necessary to continue a high performance level and for other necessary expenses, such as maintaining and improving the

local pipeline distribution system, which are vital to dependable service."

Lone Star's last rate increase in Baird became effective November, 1976.

"Since that time, every business, including Lone Star, has experienced increased operating expenses," says McKennon. "And, of course, unlike other businesses that can raise their prices as expenses go up, we must apply to the city council for a rate increase. No one likes rising prices, but any business must earn enough money to meet operating expenses and still achieve a reasonable profit. Even though our expenses have gone up, Lone Star still has one of the lowest average operating costs per customer when compared to any of the other major gas utilities in Texas."

Moran Voters Turn Down Water Proposal

Moran voters Saturday, rejected a proposal that would have linked their community with Shackelford Water Supply Corp. The proposal was defeated

by a 2-1 margin.

The vote was 42 for joining and 89 against joining the cooperative, according to Mayor James Garrett.

County Attorney, Don Wilson Resigns, Assistant Named

Callahan County Attorney, Donald L. Wilson, has resigned his position to join an Abilene law firm with three other former prosecutors. His resignation was effective Monday.

Wilson will become a partner of Allen Glen, Bill Thomas and Ed Paynter in the law firm of Glen, Thomas, Paynter and Wilson.

According to Wilson, who was elected to a second four year term on Nov. 4 the decision to wait until after the general election was made, so the Democratic committee wouldn't have to come up with another candidate on such notice. "This didn't come up until after the Democratic primary (in May, when he'd been unopposed for his party's nomination)," Wilson explained.

"I've thoroughly enjoyed working with the people of Callahan County, but this is just too good an opportunity for me to pass up in terms of my career," Wilson said.

The Callahan County commissioners will now have the job of filling the vacancy. They were made aware of Wilson's plans several weeks ago and began working to find a successor in order for the county's business to continue without interruption.

"Rather than appoint someone right now, the commissioners authorized me to appoint a first assistant, and I've done that," said Wilson. Robert E. McCool, 32, of Houston, was his choice among the six applicants interviewed.

McCool was in Baird Friday for Wilson's announcement. "When I resign, he'll be able to perform as county attorney until he complies (with state law) residency-wise", Wilson said.

According to Wilson, the commissioners will appoint McCool county attorney, after he has lived in Callahan County for the required six months. The appointment will be good until the next general election in 1982.

At that time, Wilson said, McCool plans to run for the remaining two years of the unexpired term.

McCool a native of West Chester, Pa. has been in the private practice of law in Houston for the past six years. He received BA and BS degrees from the University of Houston in 1972 and his Doctor of Jurisprudence degree from Houston's Bates College of Law in 1974. He and his wife will be moving to Baird in the near future.

They have no children.

A two car, head-on collision just east of Abilene, has left one man dead and one man seriously injured.

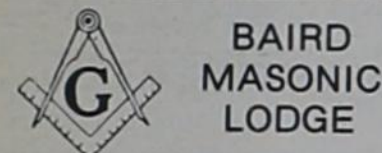
Howard Gary Services Held

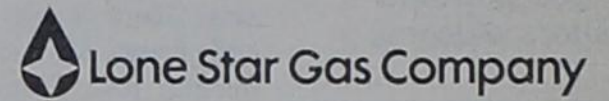

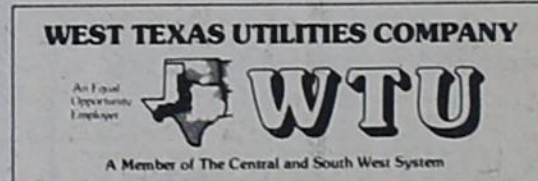

Pro. Engineers Offer Scholarships, Grants

The National Society of Professional Engineers is making available 122 grants and scholarships to aid high school seniors interested in pursuing engineering careers, Joe Emberger, local chairman of the nationwide scholarship program announced.

The head of the scholarship effort of NSPE's Abilene Chapter said students will be selected for the awards on the basis of academic standing, participation in extra-curricular activities, evidence of leadership, character and self-reliance, comments of teachers and administrators, and financial need. NSPE scholarships are provided with the cooperation of 35 leading companies and education institutions; recipients will receive awards of \$1,000 to \$4,000 with some full scholarships.

To be eligible for the awards, a student must be a high school senior ranking in the top quarter of

his or her graduating class, plan to enroll in a college or university with an engineering curriculum approved by the Accreditation Board of Engineering and Technology (the profession's accreditation

body), and be a U.S. citizen or plan to become a naturalized citizen.

Students must submit scholarship application to the local chapter by December 1, 1980; national winners will be selected

by March 13, 1981.
