necessary for a needed for the absorption, transport and storage o vitamins A,D,E. and K-the
fat soluble vitamins. These vitamins enhance vision bone strength, fertility and blood coacsilation. Diets severely limited in fat problems. Fat is not all bad Excess fat, however, is bad and most Americans should worry about too much rather than too little. Today,
42 percent of the calories in an average American diet come from fats. The American Heart Association recommends that fats make
up no more than 30 to 35 percent of daily calories. AHA also recommends a 1:1:1 ration of polyunsaturasaturated fats.
