### **Disposal Plant** Will Soon Be Completed

Work of Laying Remainder of Pipe to Start Next Week

Rockport's sewer system will be ready for operation within the next six weeks, J. E. James, superintendent here for Gerald Mora, contractor, said today.

"By the middle of next week we will have the disposal plant 50 per cent completed," James said. The contractor moved back in to complete the job about a month ago, but nearly two weeks was lost in getting materials, men and tools on the job.

"We will start laying the remainder of the lines here next week." James continued. "The ditching machine is on the way here now and I have the men here to go to work."

There remains some three or four thousand feet of clay and cast iron pipe to be laid to complete the system. Twelve men are on the job now




