CITY PLANS FOR OPERATION SEWER SYSTEM ARMY LIFTS BAN ON NIGHT FOOTBALL HERE **Property Owners** May Now Prepare

For Sewer Service

Plumber Available to Do Work On Connections For Property Owners

Rockport's City Council this week took definite steps toward making the city's new sanitary sewer system available to citizens by passing regulatory ordinance and securing the services of a plumber to make estimates and install plumbing necessary to connecting with the new system.

Work will be completed on the system with the next few weeks Rockport, according to Supt. Morand in the meantime those desiring connections are urged to have preliminary work completed so that the system is complete.

J. W. Ray, licensed plumber of 29. Refugio, will be here Monday and thereafter. He will be available for estimates and for work on establishing sewer connections. Ray's services may be obtained by calling City Secretary W. B. Friend at the City Hall.

Mayor Travis Johnson stated that the ordinance adopted this week and published in this issue of the Pilot was adopted only after the council had studied governing regulations of a number of cities and towns.

"We made inquiries regarding the operation of sewer systems in various cities and found that we must have certain rules and regusystem," Mayor Johnson said.

"We studied over several ordinances and adopted one in which the city is being as lenient as possible and yet maintaining a real system for the benefit of the city as a whole."

Permits must be secured from the City before connections can be made with the system and work must be done by a plumber licensed by the city and in accordance with specifications set out in the ordinance. All work must be inspected before the connection is

Sewer rates will probably be set as follows: Residential, \$1.00 per month; Commercial, \$1.50 per month for first four fixtures, with charge, \$5.00.






