Another alternative would be: One district of San Patricio, Refugio and Aransas Counties. An-DeWitt, Goliad and Bee Counties.

The last alternative is to maintain our present district of Aransas, Bee, Refugio and San Patricio Counties, preferably with a floatorial representative, and if this could not be obtained, with a sacrifice in the representation to which we are entitled.

U. S. Marine Corps **Announces Plans**

Headquarters U. S. Marine Corps has announced plans for the additional requirement of approximately 2000 Marine Corps Reserve ground officers, and approximately 2500 additional staff non-commissioned officers, to be called to active duty in the near future. In addition about 250 Marine Corps Reserve aviation personnel, and aviation ground officers will be required it was earned. The officers to be called will be principally in the grade of Lieutenant.

Under this new strength requirement the four month mininum advance notice to Marine Corps Reserve personnel ordered minimum of 30 days between receipt of orders and reporting for extended active duty will be authorized for both officers and enlisted personnel.

"Of the total officers to be called approximately 350 are in the Eighth Marine Corps Reserve District, comprising Louisiana, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Texas and New Mexico," Major C. G. Rollen, Director of the Eighth Marine Corps Reserve District announced. 'There are about 300 Staff noncommissioned officers in the district subject to call," he continued.
