

Drought Shows Need for Building Oakville Dam

Edgar Linkenhoger, president of the Lower Nueces River Water Supply District, said this week that as the drought continues, more and more South Texans have told him that they realize the urgency of building Oakville Dam. Linkenhoger said that both organizations and individuals are asking the water district to place all the facts before Governor Allan Shivers so that he will realize how important it is to the Coastal Bend for him to recommend construc-

Linkenhoger said that since the fact has become generally known that the dam will be controlled and owned by South Texas, and not by the federal government, support of the dam project has gained greatly in strength. The congressonal bill, authorizing construction of the dam would have a definite 25 cents, per person. clause in it providing for local control. It would put control of the dam in the hands of the water district ,and provide that the dam will be the property of South Texas when indebtedness is paid off

in revenue from water sales. Texans who watch each month pass without rain to fill rivers and moisten the ground, realize how impractical it is to allow available water to be wasted by running into the Gulf unused. Despite scientific methods of rainmaking and everything else man can do, periods of drought will come. Only foresight can prevent them from being disasterous to the economy of the Coastal Bend. Linkenhoger pointed out that the one far sighted plan now under consideration is the building of Oakville dam.


