

Rockport Pilot Rockport, Texas Gentlemen: One of the great charms of

Rockport has always been the friendly, open-handed hospitality of its people. No one will deny however, that these commendable in practice this week. The Pirates traits have been considerably abused since Highway 35 and the Copano Bay causeway came into being.

Not that Rockport's own people are less honest and friendly, but, unfortunately, with the coming of paved roads and ready access to outside points came the disadvantages of easy ingress by riffraff and undesirables of all breeds. And that these undesirables do come in is an unquestionable fact.

Recent events prove that they do. Since there is no way of picking the good from the bad ahead of time, nor to stop their coming and going, Rockport, in self preservation should take the only other practical means of crime prevention and establish adequate police protection. Dependence on county officials in this matter is an evasion of facts. The sheriff's office is responsible for the entire county, not just the city of Rockport. After all, when Rockport became a city, it assumed the responsibilities of such and its own police supervision is part of those responsibilities.

Many of the undesirables who come here are undoubtedly professional thieves or worse, a specie of human vermin whose only creed is greed and violence. To leave the city unprotected at all the mercy of every chiseling hoodlum who happens to drive through at night, is an assinine proceedure and foolish in the extreme. Ultimately it will cost Rocokport more than the entire expense of some competent police guardian and possibly somebody's life as well.

In line your recent editorial then, may we urge that the Chamber of Commerce, civic bodies, church leaders and others, petition the mayor and city council to immediately start action toward inaugurating such police protection.




