Tuberculosis, one of the deadliest killing and crippling diseases, can be cured by proper treatment and diagnosis. Last week there 73 new cases of tuberculosis reported in the state of Texas, bringing the total to 1,611 new

cases this year. As you all know, tuberculosis has been virtually stamped out in our nation's dairy herds by constant screening examinations and proper treatment. We can do the same with the civilian population by employing similiar methods.

The people of Aransas County are indeed fortunate to have access to the testing facilities of the State Health Department. The mobile X-ray unit will be in Rockport at the Postoffice Lobby on June 18th and 19th. This service is rendered free of charge by our tax supported State Health Department. Everyone over the age 14 owes it to himself and his neighbors and associates, to spend not more than five minutes for a Boy Scouts and girls who worked painless X-ray examination of his chest. In this way you can assure yourself that you have not in the past year contracted this disease without your knowledge.
