People often misunderstand the reason a lawyer puts up the right he does for a client who is accused of a crime. "It might be all right," they say, "if the man were innocent, but why put out so much effort defending him when everyone knows he is guilty?"

Crime is Presumed to be Guilty

If he is to escape the penalties of the law, he is obliged to prove that he is innocent. But in common law countries an accused person is presumed to be innocent until the state presents enough properly admissible evidence to convince an impartial jury that he is guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

The Lions as usual roared over the Red Caps.

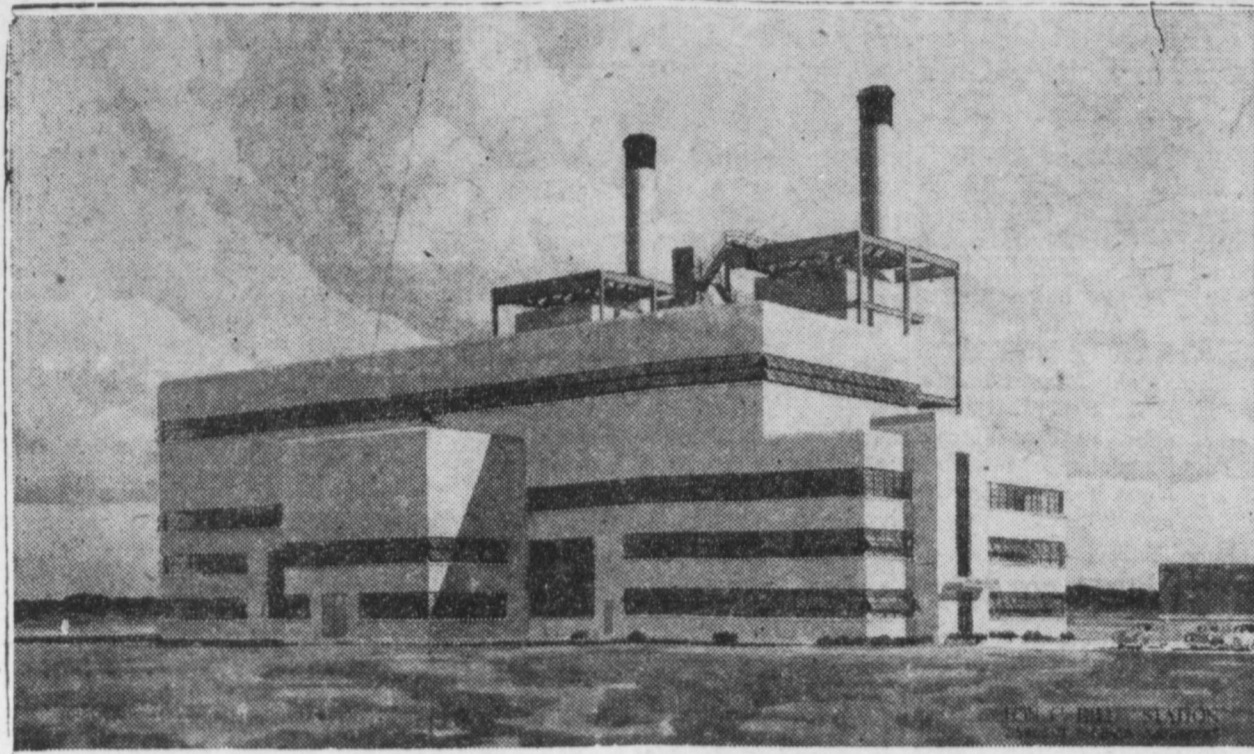
The Crabs, Hawks and Sacred Heart boys will register their players Saturday night, June 14th, for a series of games which will begin June 21. The winner will be given a trophy.

**Funeral Services Held For
Samuel J. Dorethy**

Funeral services were conducted Monday morning at 10:30 at the Sacred Heart Catholic Church for Samuel J. Dorethy, who died Friday at Spohn Hospital in Corpus Christi after a long illness. Mr. Dorethy was 63 years old. He was reared in Rockport where his father, the late W. S. Dorethy was a pioneer cattleman of Aransas County.

He had been employed for a number of years by the Southern Pacific, Missouri Pacific and Tex-Mex. railroads and made his home in Robstown until he retired about three years ago and moved to Corpus Christi.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Pearl Gray Dorethy; a son, Samuel Giles Dorethy of Temple; a brother, Phillip Dorothy of Detroit, Mich.; and two sisters, Mrs. W. C. Stevenson of Rockport and Mrs. H. S. Cloyd of Hereford, Texas and a number of nephews and nieces.

Father O'Dougherty of Corpus Christi conducted the funeral and interment was in the Rockport cemetery.

The pall bearers were friends of his from Robstown, all employees of the Tex-Mex railroad.

Visitors at the J. L. Baughman home and the Marine Laboratory during the week of the writers' conference were Mr. and Mrs. George Williams, of Houston and their two sons, Stephen and Grefrey. Mr. Williams is the author of a recent novel, "The Blind Bulls", certain scenes of which are laid in the Rockport area. Mr. Williams, professor of creative writing at Rice Institute, is also an ornithologist of note. An article on birds, by Mr. Williams will appear in the June issue of the Texas Journal of Science, of which Mr. Baughman is editor.

**Shrimp Tagging
Tests Underway**

A tagging experiment on all three types of commercial shrimp to investigate general seasonal movements of the marine seafood has been launched by the local marine laboratory of the Texas Game and Fish Commission. E. D. McRae, marine biologist in charge of the project, said he hopes to tag 50,000 shrimp in the bays from Freeport to Port Isabel and in the Gulf up and down the coast in water depths that range from five to 50 fathoms.

A record is to be kept of each shrimp tagged, giving the sex, size and kind of shrimp, the date it was tagged, the location and depth of water where it was released. The return of tags by commercial shrimpers, giving the date and location where the tagged shrimp was netted, over a long period of time should establish a fairly accurate pattern of shrimp movements in various seasons.

McRae said the shrimp will normally be tagged and released at the spot where they are caught.

More than 1,000 shrimp have been tagged and released since the experiment was started a month ago and 11 tags have been returned to the laboratory. The maximum migration during the period was 13 miles from the place tagged.

**Water Pollution
Case Tried**

Capt. M. B. Mullinax arrested J. W. Cohen for pollution of the waters of the bay. The defendant was tried before Judge Wendell in County Court. He entered a plea of guilty and was fined \$200 and costs of \$21.00.
