On the visiting committee for December, Mrs. LeBlanc and Miss Mary Ferris were appointed.

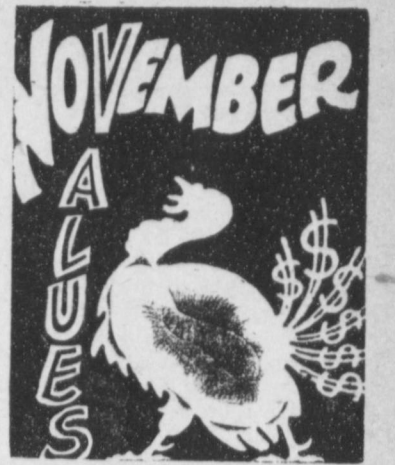
Mrs. A. L. Bracht and Mrs. W. F. Close were appointed to care for the church for the month of December.
