**Award Winners

"Blowing Wild," the new adventure-drama from Warner Bros., brings to the screen an unprecedented list of Academy Award

winners in the major roles. Gary Cooper, winner of the 1952 Academy Award as the actor of the year, stars with Barbara Stanwyck, Anthony Quinn, Award Winner as the outstanding supporting actor of 1952, and Ruth Roman. In addition, Dimitri Tiomkin, double winner of last year's Oscar
