#### 8 HUNTING DEATHS MAKE TOTAL 19

Austin, Tex. - The latest tabulation of Texas hunting season

fatalities shows a total of nineteen from both gunfire and drowning, according to the executive secretary of the Game and Fish Commission.

The last previous report made in late November showed eleven fatalities.

Six of the eight additional deaths were from drownings of duck hunters. Two hunters, a father and

son, drowned in North Concho Lake near Abilene. Two men drowned while hunting in Galves-

boy drowned in trying to retrieve a wounded coot. The gunfire deaths involved Waco railroadman shot in the back and killed when he apparently stepped into the line of fire of a .22 rifle held by a 14-year-old
