

ing that gave them away. Prisoners making the attempt were Jintsey T. Hinton, arrested in New Orleans and returned here the week of March 19; Jimmie Lee Hinton and Henry Cambran, arrested in Galveston and returned to Aransas County on March 22, all of which were wanted for forgery of checks on Dietrich Brothers Seafoods; and Billie Joe Poole, Sidney Pruitt, and Jimmie Smith, all jailed on March 21 in connection with thefts of shrimp from a boat in the harbor at Aransas Pass.

An interesting sidelight on the need for a new courthouse and jail is given by this happening. Both buildings were built at practically the same time, of the same materials. If the mortar in the courthouse walls has suffered the same deterioration over the years that is shown by that in the jail wall where the prisoners attempted to tunnel through, the county, if it retains the old building, is in for some very expensive repair in the not too far distant future.







Under the terms of the Saltonstall-Kennedy Act (Public Law 466, 83rd Congress), which is designed to give special aid to the American commercial fishing industry, funds have been allocated to expedite the Service's work of collecting and issuing statistics on the catch of fish and shellfish, the value of the catch, and the employment of men, fishing craft and gear in the fisheries.

Such information is the acknowledged basis of most fishery research, and must be available before practical management plans can be attempted. Increased funds will make possible much more of this type of work.

During hearings held prior to passage of the bill, expert witnesses from the fishing industry from all parts of the country were in full accord that the Service should do this. Such statistics are invaluable

read and study in, and competent personnel."

Mrs. Reese said that books were the medium to new worlds for all people, and that there was little that had ever happened in the world that had not been recorded.

"Each book is a letter from the writer to the reader," she said, "and there is a letter for everyone in the public library." She said that books are interest-

ing because people write them. Mrs. Reese first went into library work in 1907 when she did an apprenticeship under John Cotten Dana in Newark, N. J. Dana was the organizer and the first Association.

On the Job

"In those days, the only way to get library training was to do on the job training. It is only recently that training for library work has been available as part of university curriculum," she said.

Mrs. Reese said that the trained personnel working in libraries was one of the most important factors in the proper operation of a public library. "You must have people who are interested in, and know how to get the books before the public," she said.

From 1915 through 1917, Mrs. Reese was library organizer for the State of Maryland. She quit this job to marry the Rev. Paul


